


### Senior Awards Banquet

#### Christie, Troy, and Court Enjoy Victory





The 1988 marching season brought a new style to the Marching Patriots. This year's contest and half-time show was a theme based on Richard Rodger's "Victory at Sea," which told the story of the naval operations of World War II. The music and drill were especially written for the Patriots. Although they missed going to state by less than one point, the band members did an excellent job of performing this most difficult show. This year marked the 9th consecutive time for the Patriots to be awarded a Division I rating in the District Contest, and the 6th consecutive Division I rating in the Regional Contest.

The Heritage Hills band members are never out of a season. After marching band is over, the band members begin working on pep band music for all the home basketball games. The concert band begins working for the annual Christmas Concert, and many of the students begin preparing solos and ensembles for a contest at the end of January. Student council members learned the valuable qualities of leadership and responsibility.





## SENIORS LEAD PATS TO P.A.C. TITLE




## Frosh/Soph Team Has Good Year





## Despite Youth, Runners Run Strong in P.A.C.


The cross country team was very young. In fact, six of the seven top runners were underclassmen. Despite their youth and inexperience, they earned a strong third in the P.A.C.

## Spikers Show Net Improvement


Girls' volleyball improved throughout the season and peaked at tournament time. They came close to winning the sectional. Tell City narrowly defeated them in the championship match.

## Boys' Tennis Takes Second


The tennis team finished the season with a 3-8 record and a second place finish in the P.A.C.



















# J.V. Compiles Winning Record


# Golfers Play "Up to Par"








