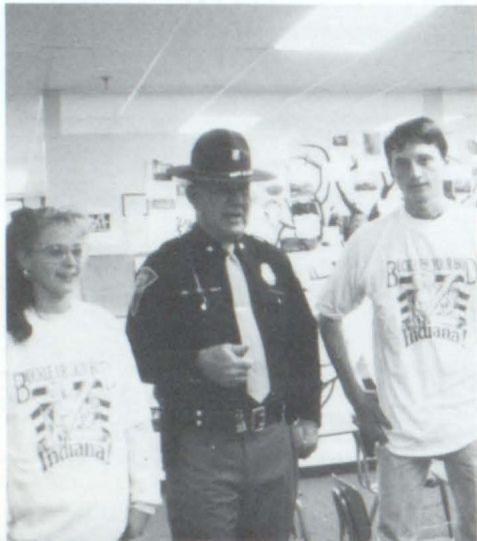

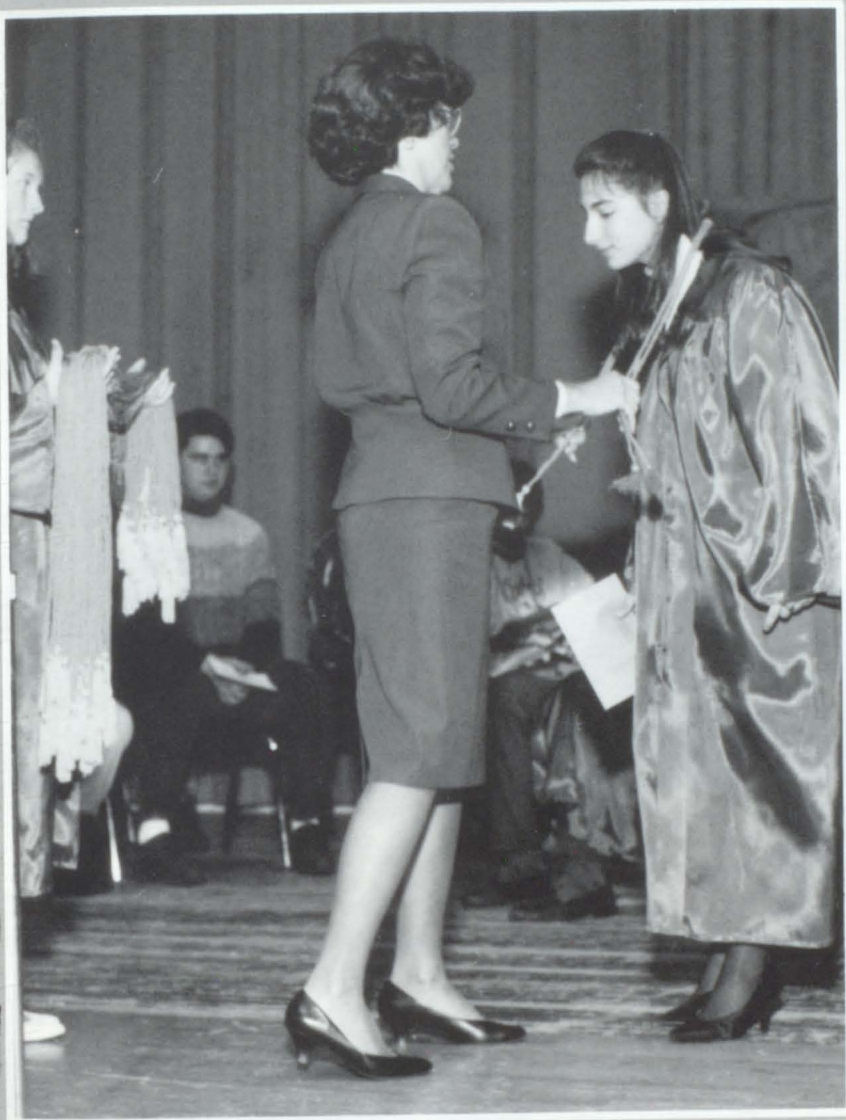

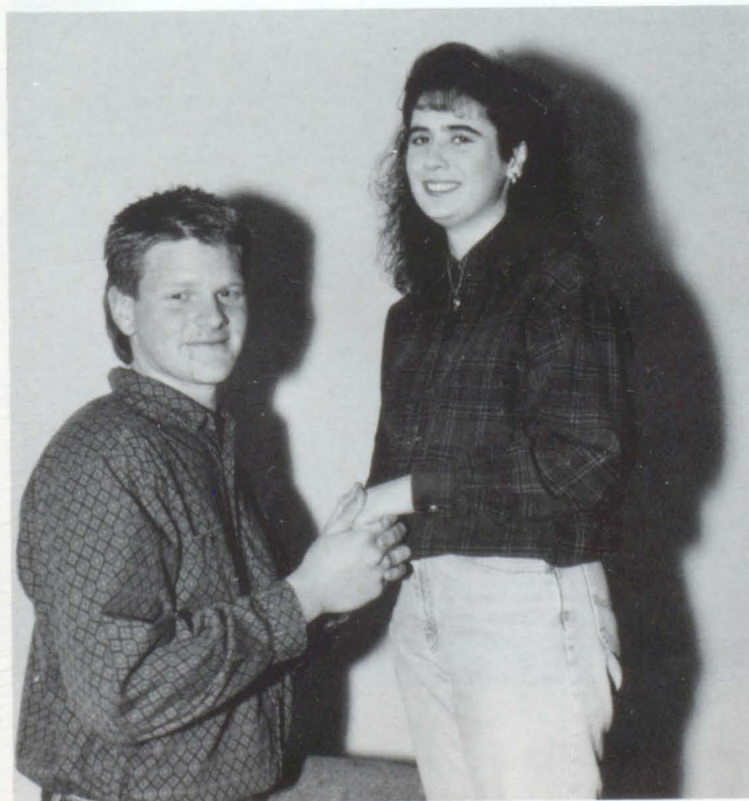

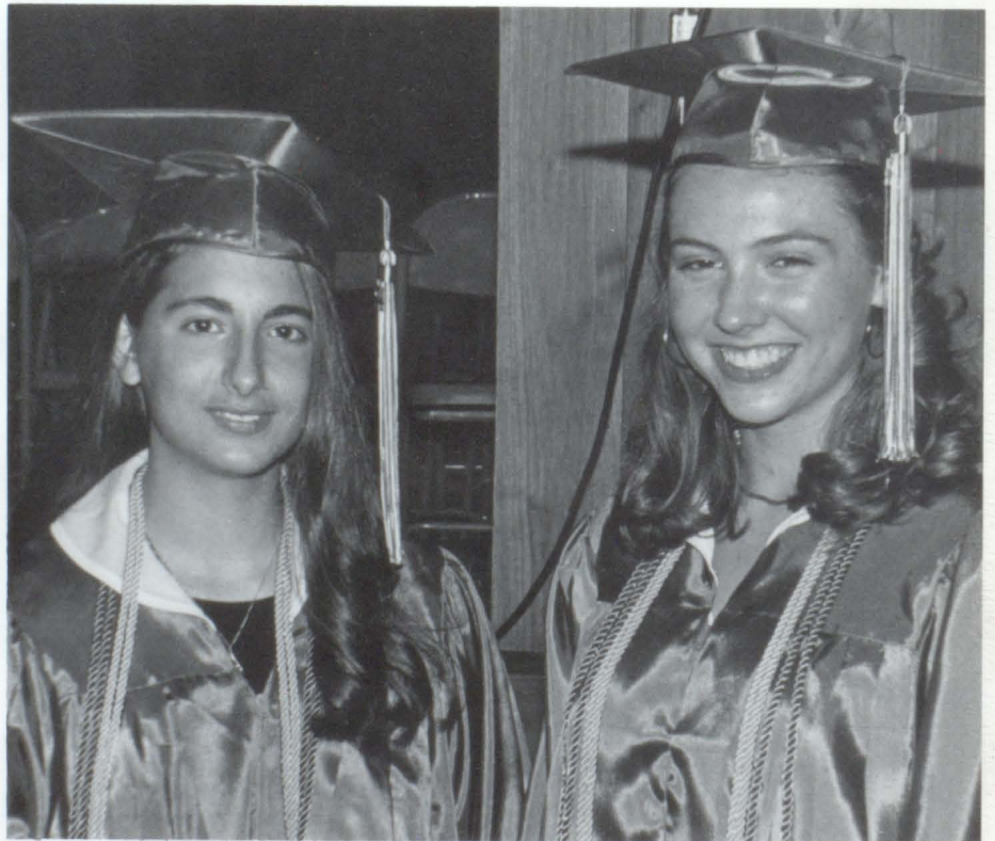

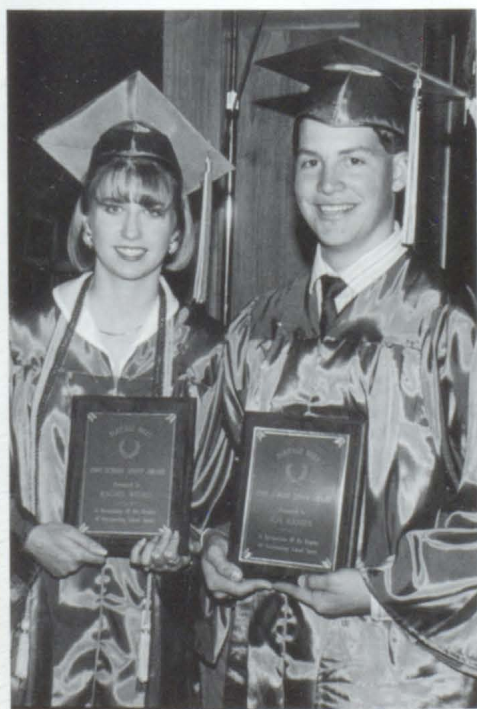

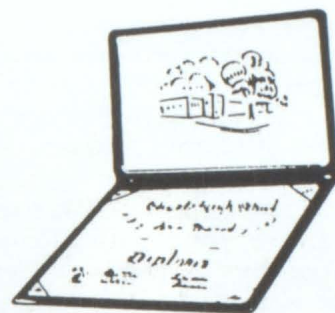

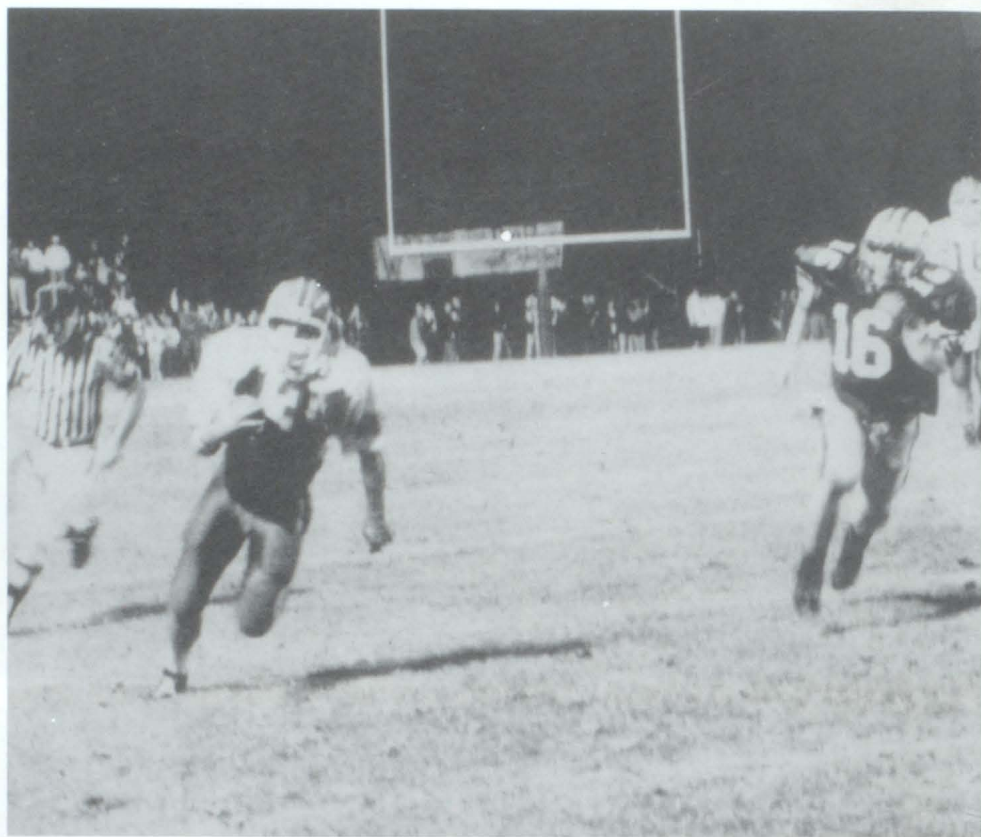

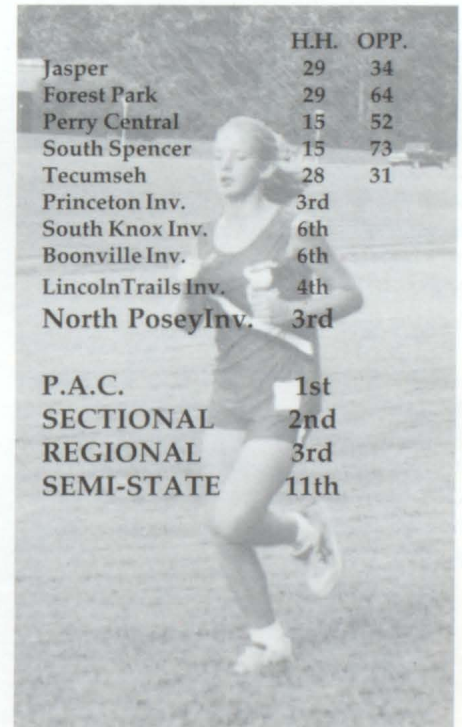

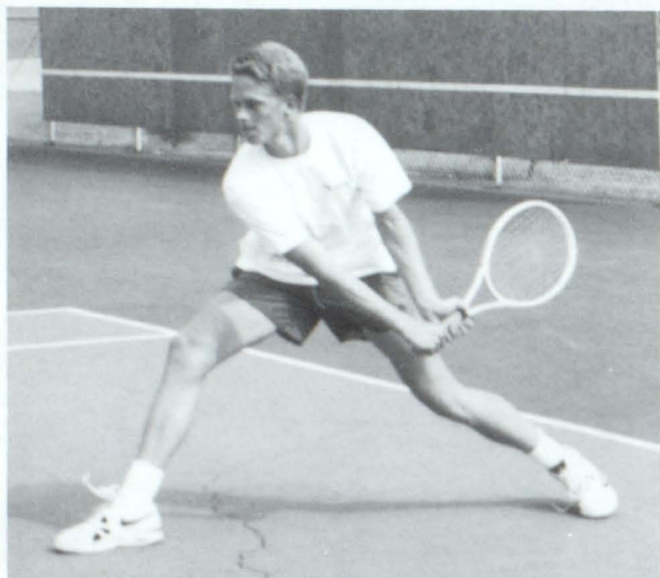

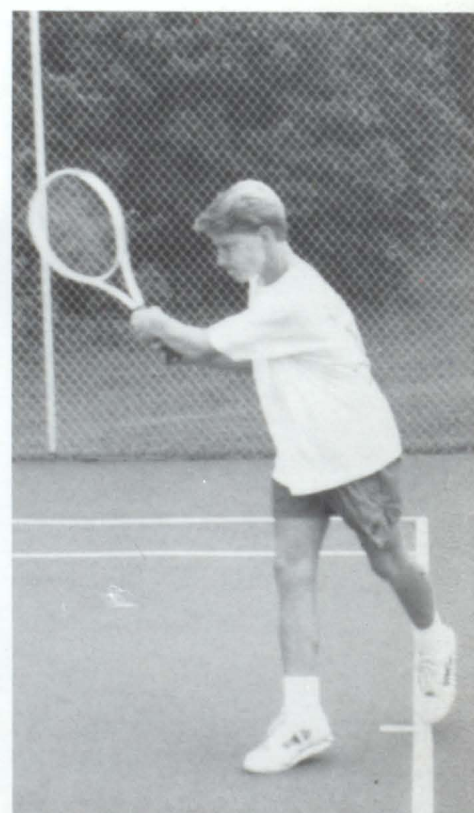

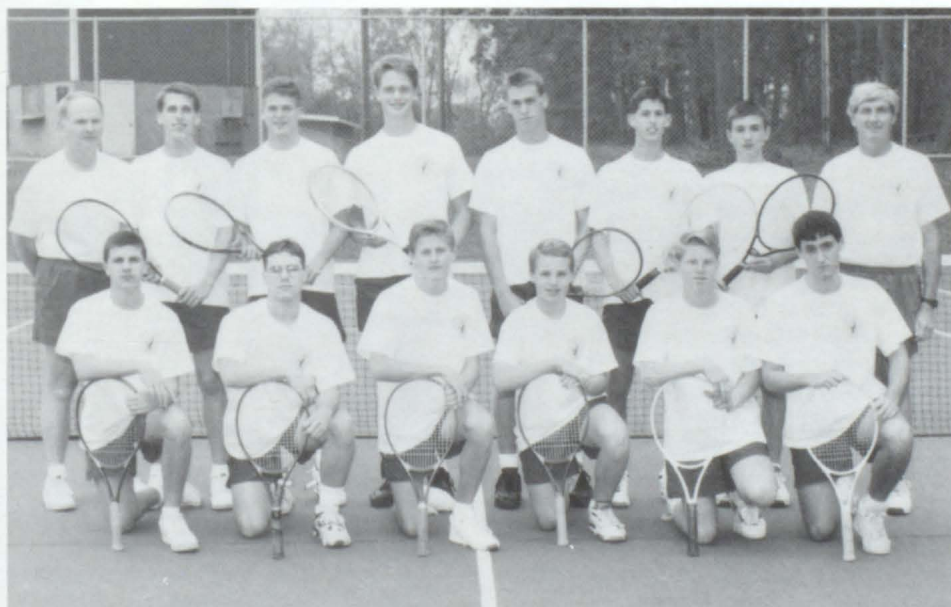

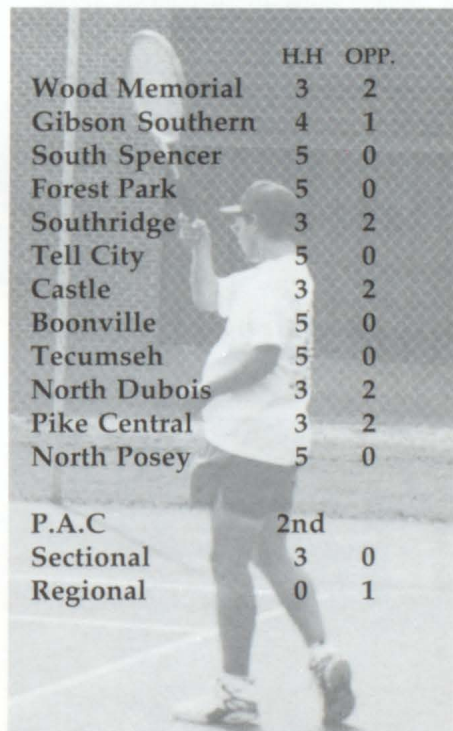

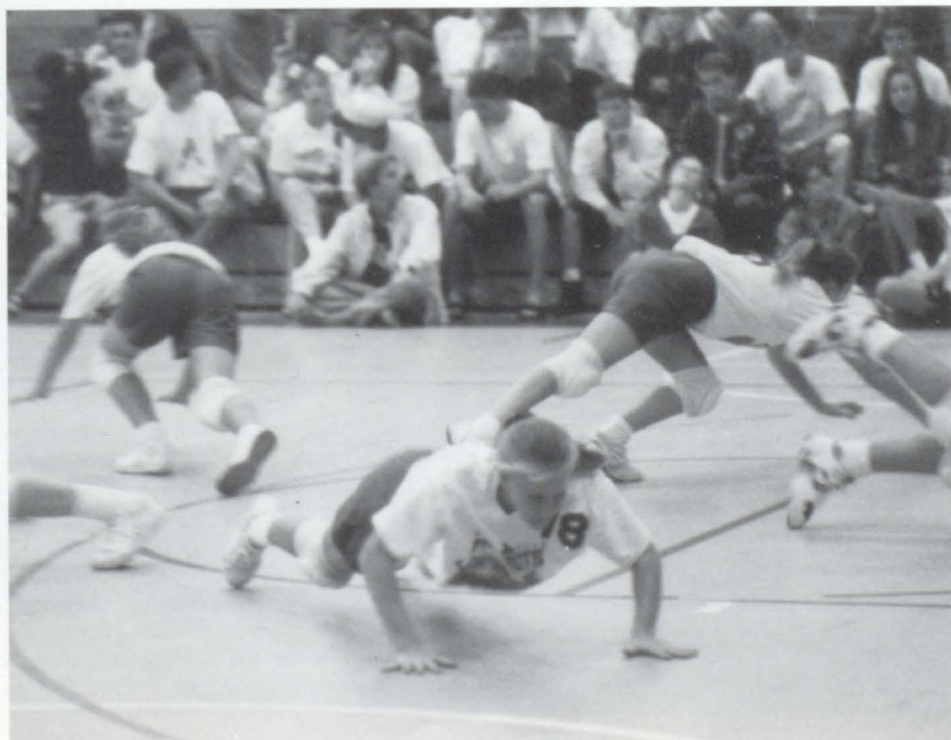

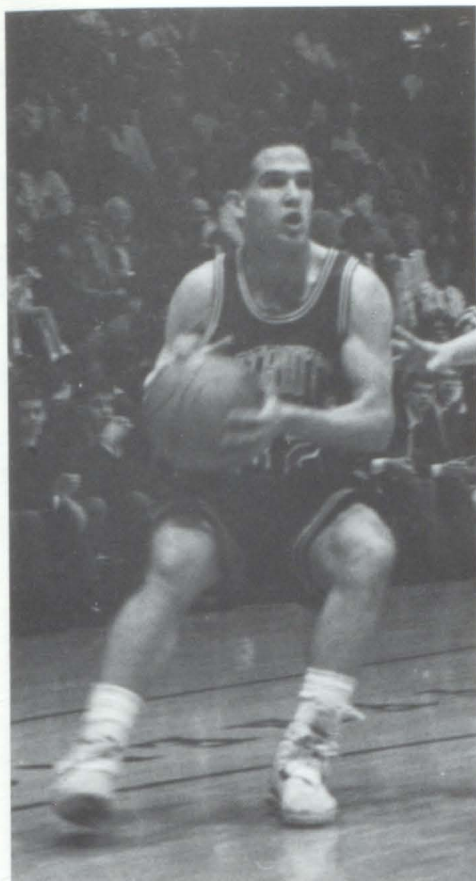

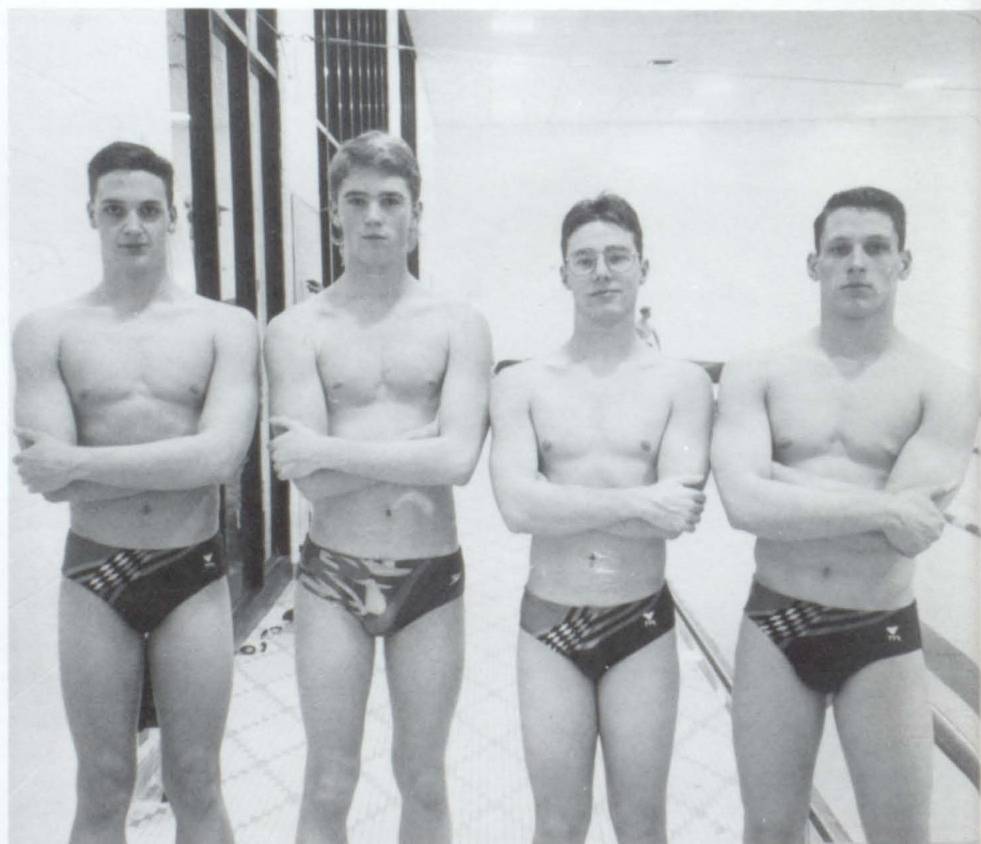


RIGHT: Patriot swimmers stretch and take warm-up exercises before the meet.

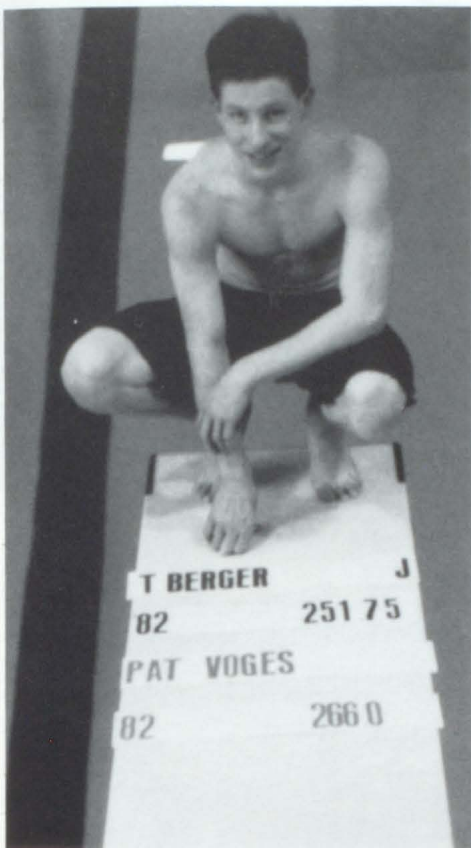

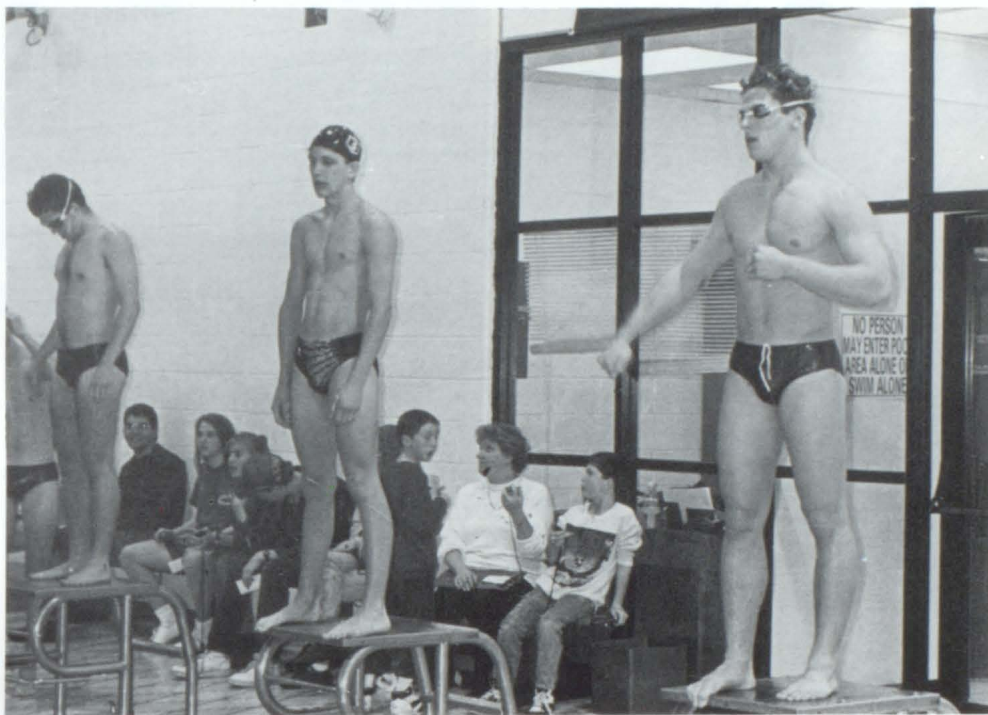

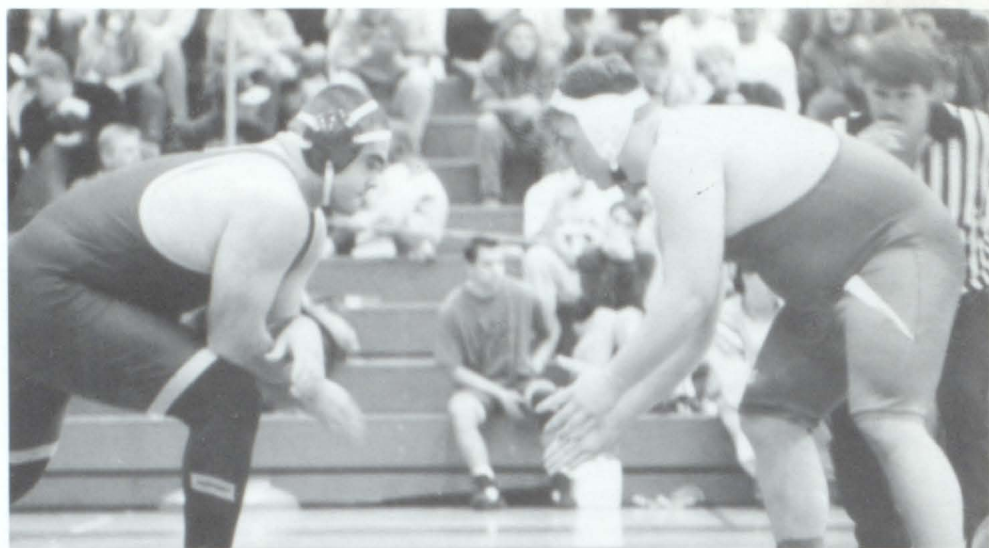

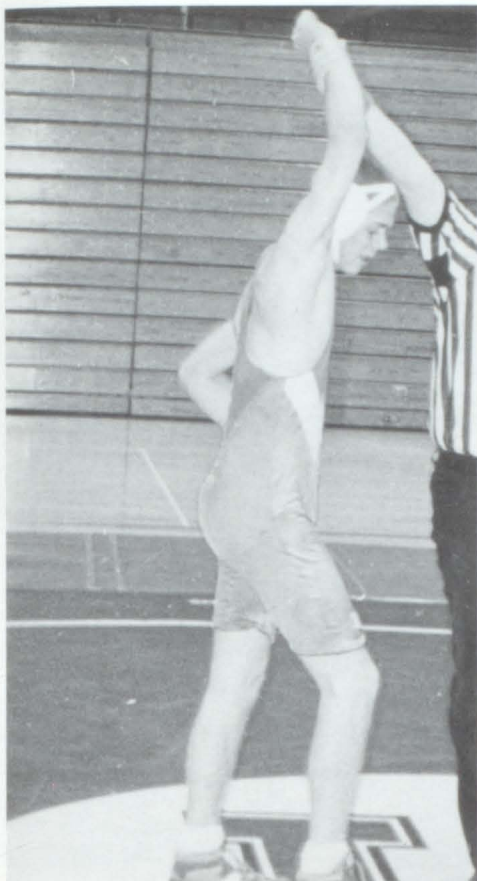

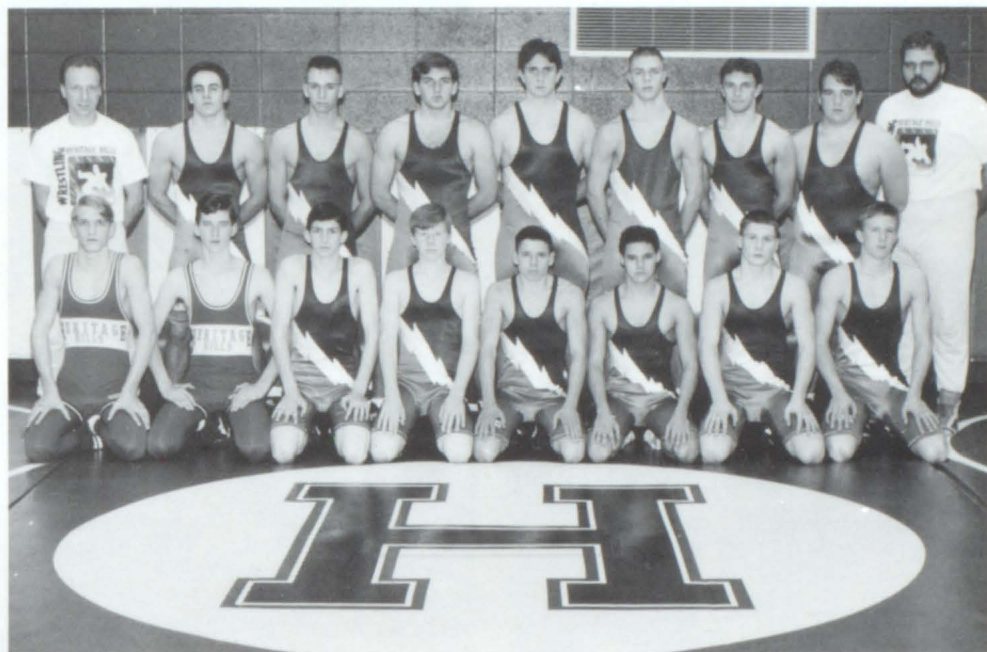

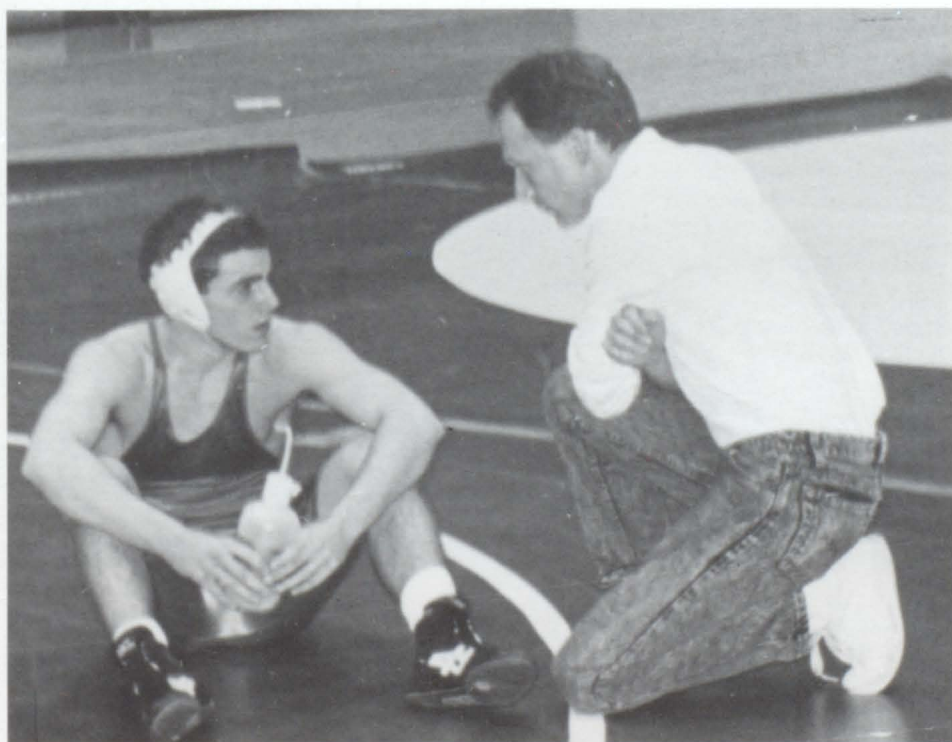

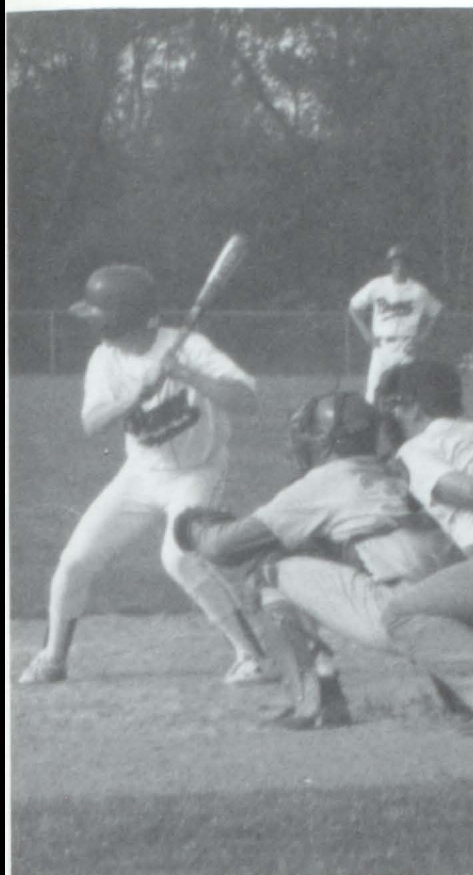

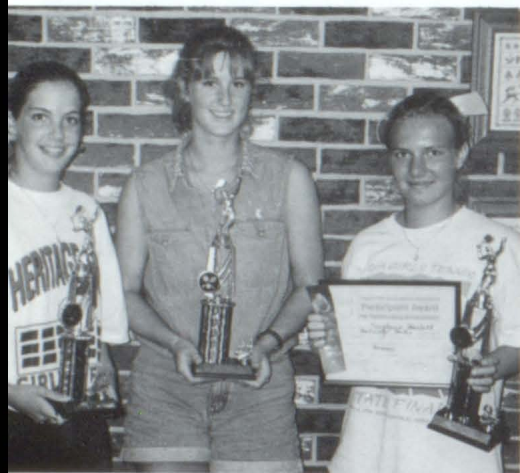

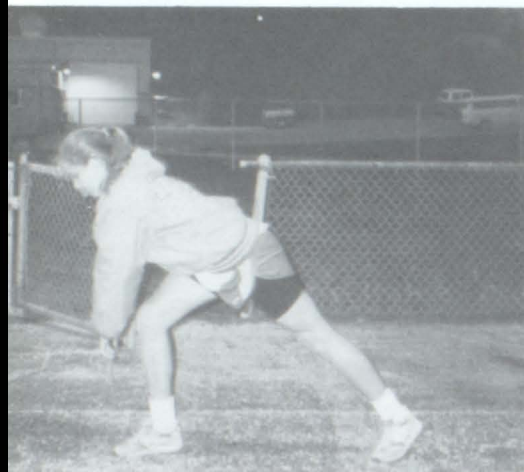

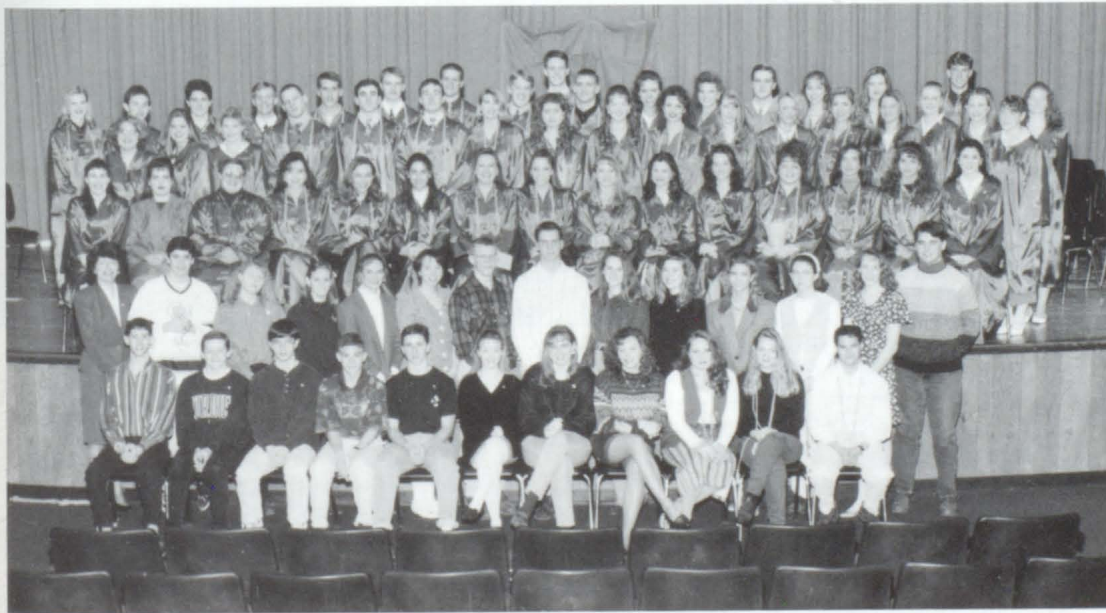

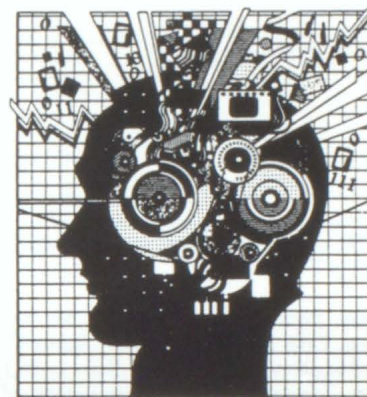

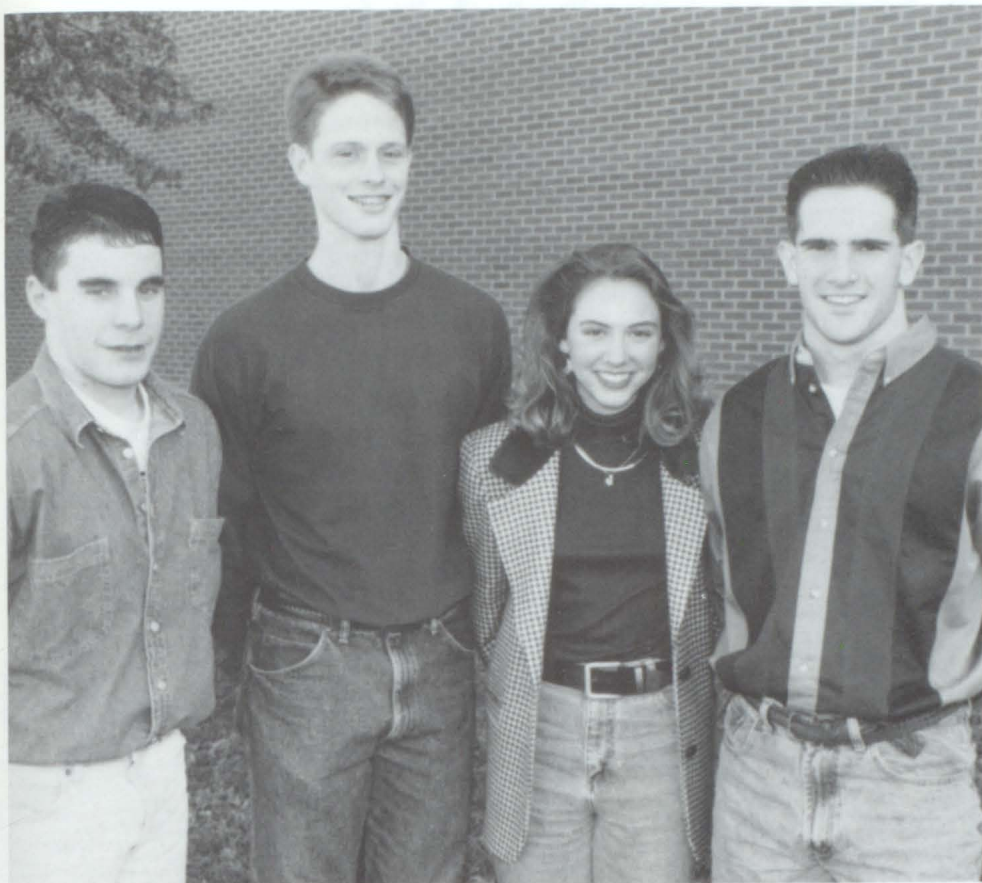
