This outstanding academic achievement only goes to schools that are in the top twenty-five percent in state achievement tests in four key areas: Math, English, Attendance, and overall scores. ISTEP scores continued the tradition of scoring higher than most students in Indiana as well as in the nation. In addition, high SAT scores were evidence that teachers were teaching and students were learning. For the first time, sophomores took the ISTEP Qualifying Exam, which students must pass to graduate. You had to be there to see Patriot athletes and teams excel. We continued the tradition of strong sports programs. One highlight was the football team earning an undefeated regular season, a PAC title, a sectional title, and a regional title; they were ranked fourth in Indiana. Another highlight happened when the boys' track team won its first sectional championship in school history. Furthermore, they earned an undefeated regular season and a conference crown. Many other teams and individuals won PAC and sectional titles throughout the year. Truly, you had to be there to believe the incredible "Patriot Spirit".

Success didn't stop there. The Marching Patriots won District and Regional Division I ratings. Odyssey of the Mind teams presented strong performances; one team won third place in the state. Art exhibits displayed outstanding student artwork. These traditions and others, like the outstanding performances during the fall play, *Charlie Brown*, and the spring musical, *Fiddler on the Roof*, demonstrated the incredible creativity and talent of student Patriots. Again, to really appreciate it, you had to be there.














Basketball Homecoming




GRADUATION






Star Light, Star Bright





Although the season is over, the fond memories and accomplishments that "spiced up" the season will never be forgotten!













Earlier, the boys' track team won the PAC title and compiled an undefeated regular season. "These kids have really worked hard to win a sectional," said Coach Compton.






