The Boonville Pioneers sent a wreath of flowers, which read "Rest in Peace."

















VIVA MEXICO!!

The Varsity had a very good season this year with a record of 15-6. Leading scorer was B. Wahl, who was unable to participate due to a knee injury during several of the Pats losses.

















