




Pats Win First-Ever Sectional, Regional Titles












Lady Harriers Pace to Victory

Two players made the All-Conference Team. They were Emily Fuller and Rachel Lowe.








Tennis Team Completes Successful Season
























































Band Marches to Division 1 Rating






Heritage and Chorus


Odyssey Of The Mind


