





Varsity Shows Excellence







The tennis team finished their season with a 12-4 record and a tie for 2nd in the PAC.



Steve Lifke completed an outstanding season. He won PAC No. 1 singles title, the sectional, the regional and he finished seventh in state.




Above: Darren Lynam and Mike Troth make a tough doubles team.

Below: Number 2 doubles player Don Snyder serves to begin play.









Becky Howe was the only Patriot to receive All-PAC honors. Michelle King and Sue Begle were given honorable mention.













J.V. Led by Outstanding Sophs





Frosh Reign as PAC Champs







Chalk Up Another Baseball Title


Varsity baseball won the P.A.C. Championship to cap an outstanding season. They earned the title with a 5-1 conference record.






Above: Rodney Summers prepares for the next pitch.


J.V. Bats a Winning Season




Above: Bubba Lowe rounds third base and heads for home.





















Golfers Dominate P.A.C., Capture Crown






















The 1986-87 school year was the first year for actual class meetings for the class of 1989 in which the meetings were carried on by the students.
