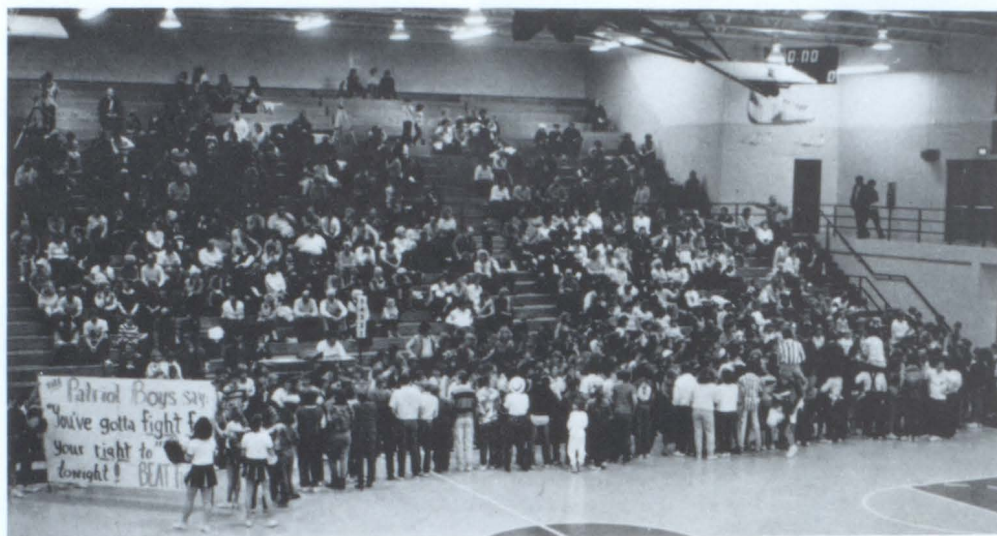

Seniors Receive Diplomas While

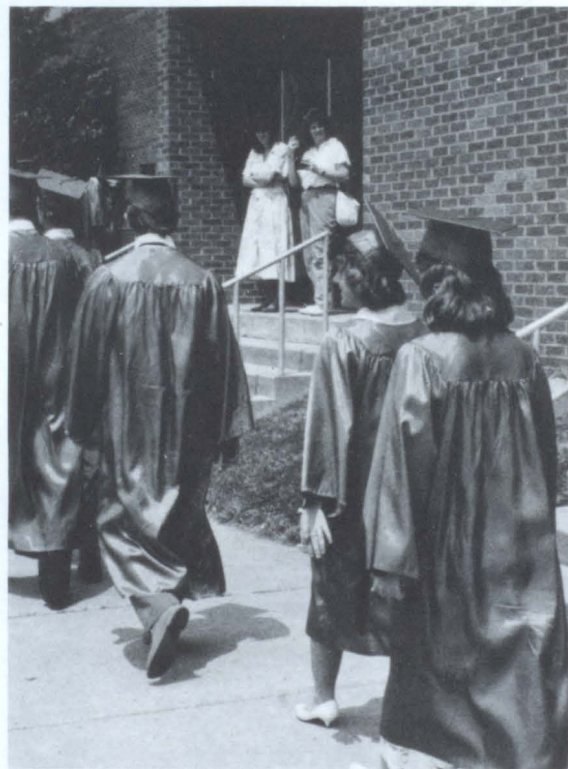

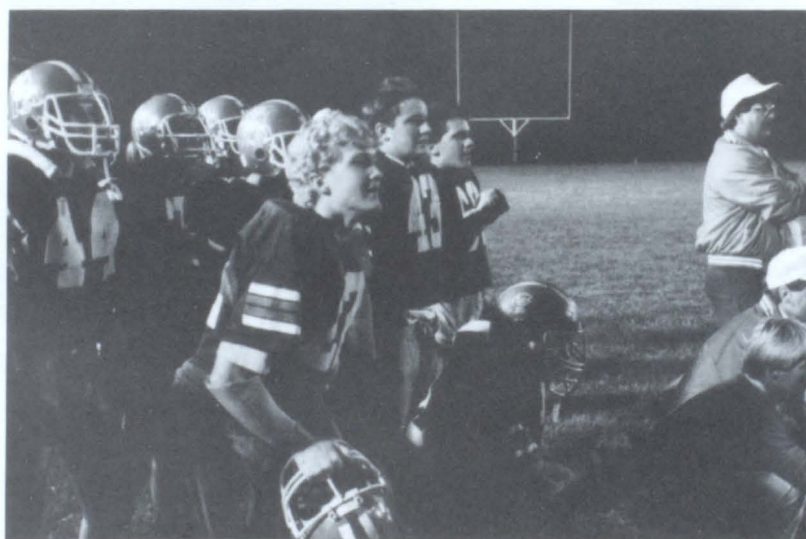

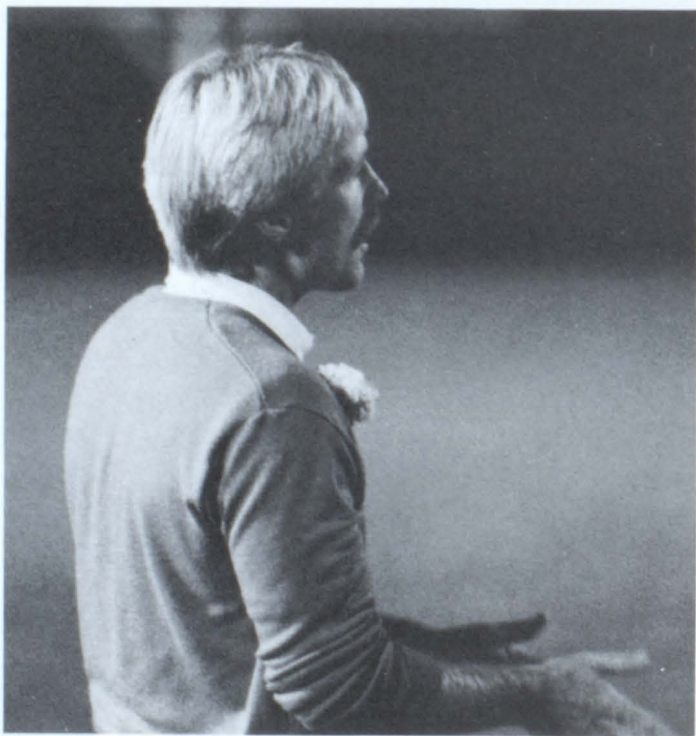
JV, Frosh Have Exciting Season

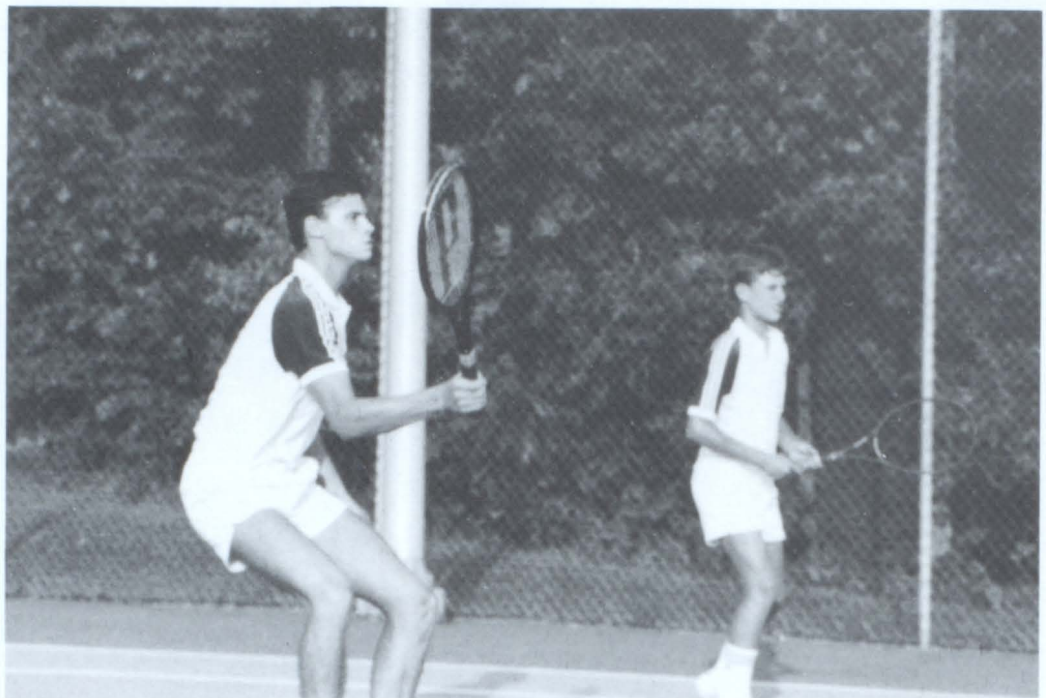

The tennis team finished their season with a 12-4 record and a tie for 2nd in the PAC.

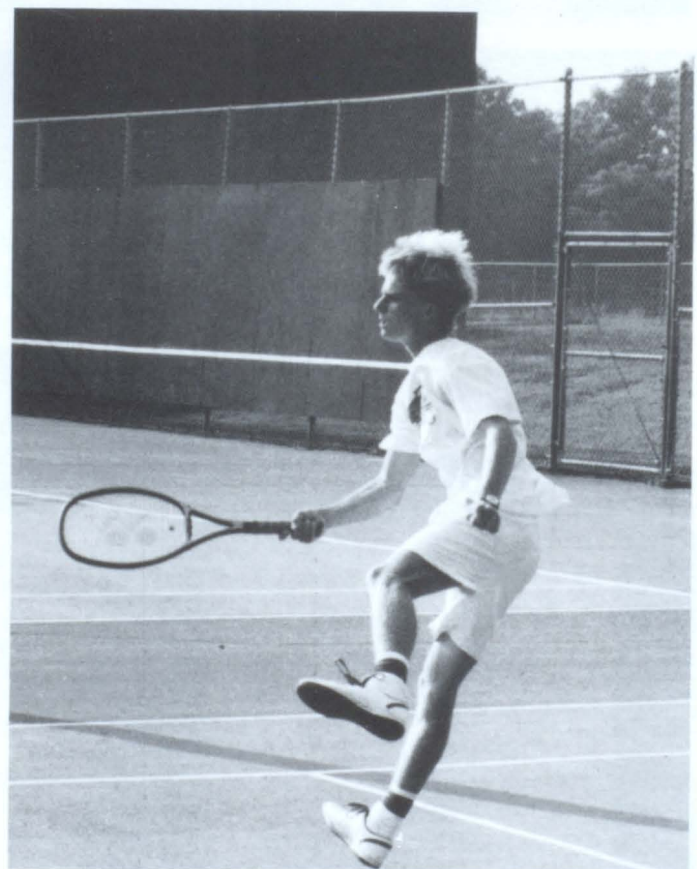
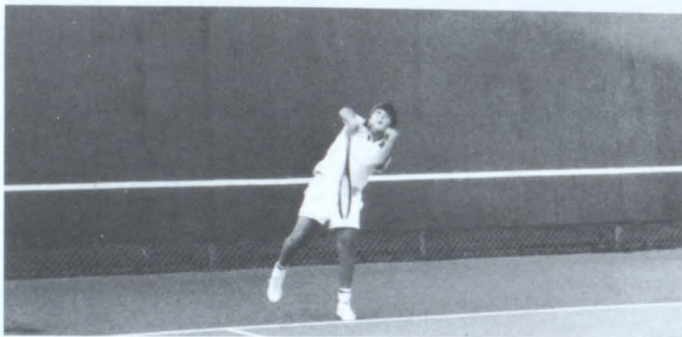

Becky Howe was the only Patriot to receive All-PAC honors. Michelle King and Sue Begle were given honorable mention.



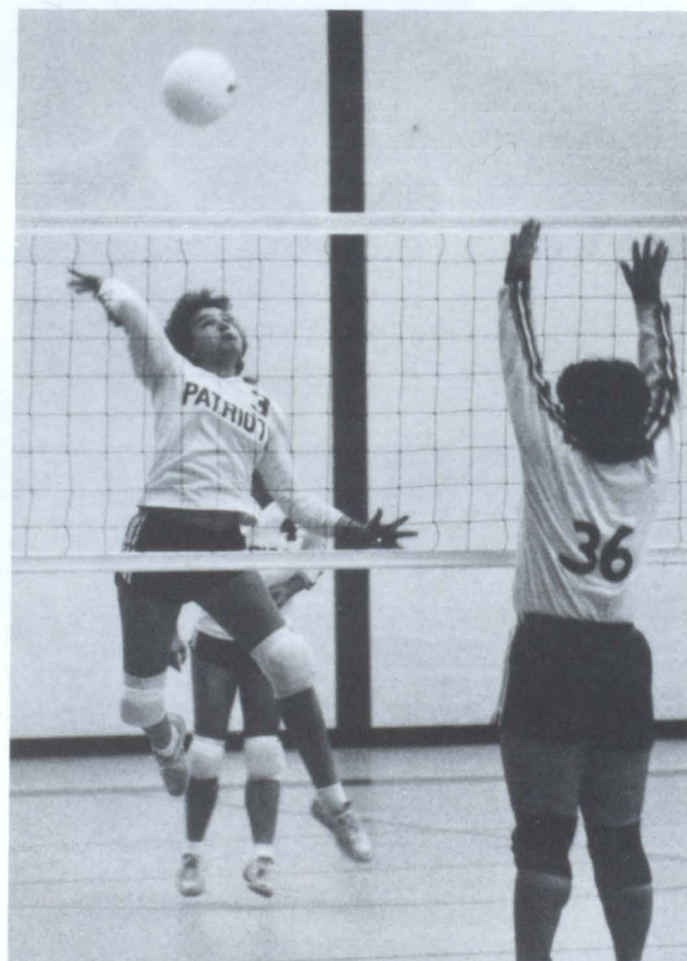

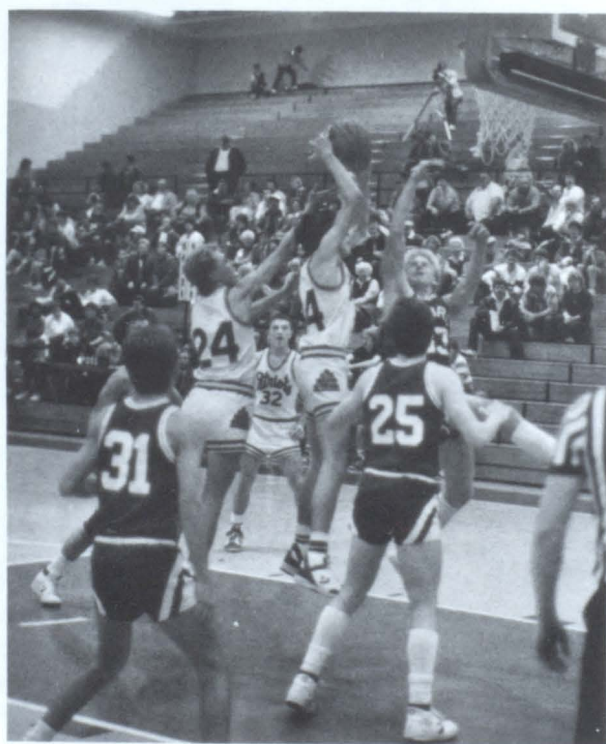

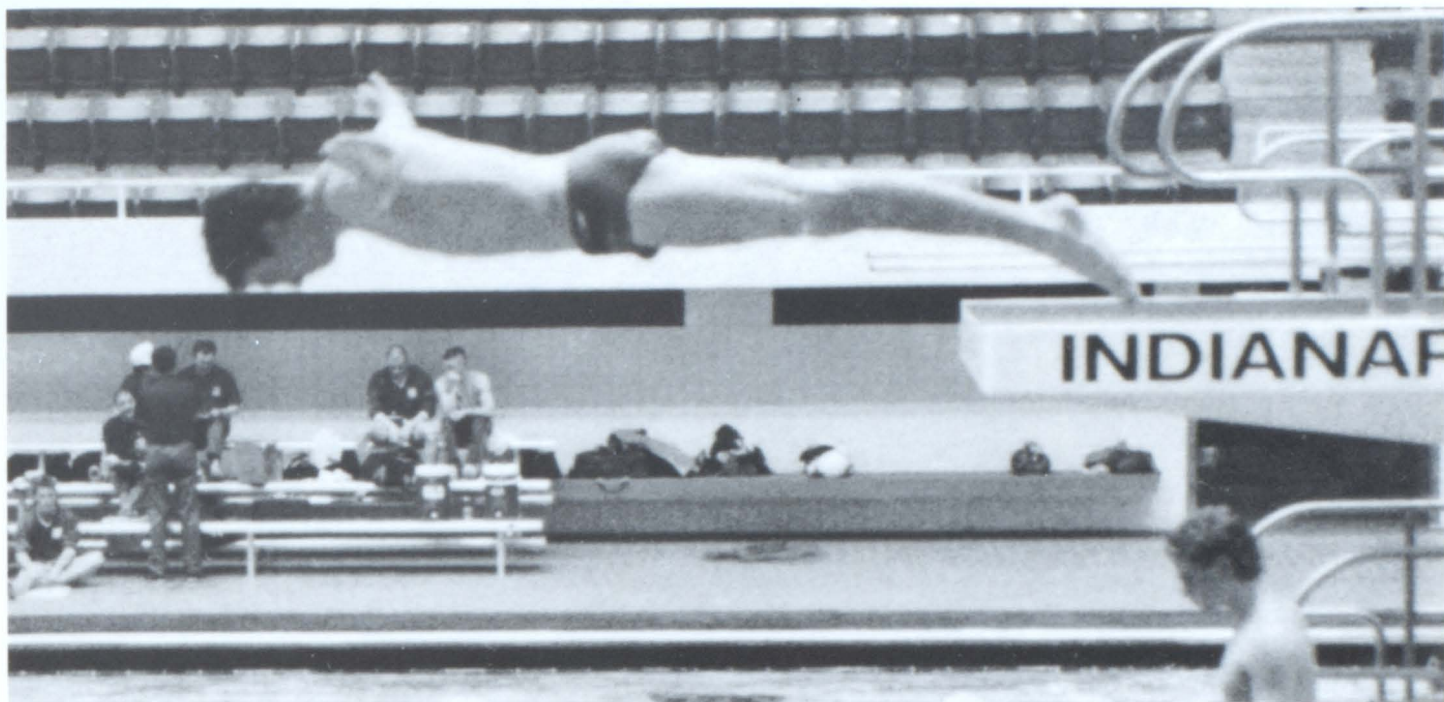

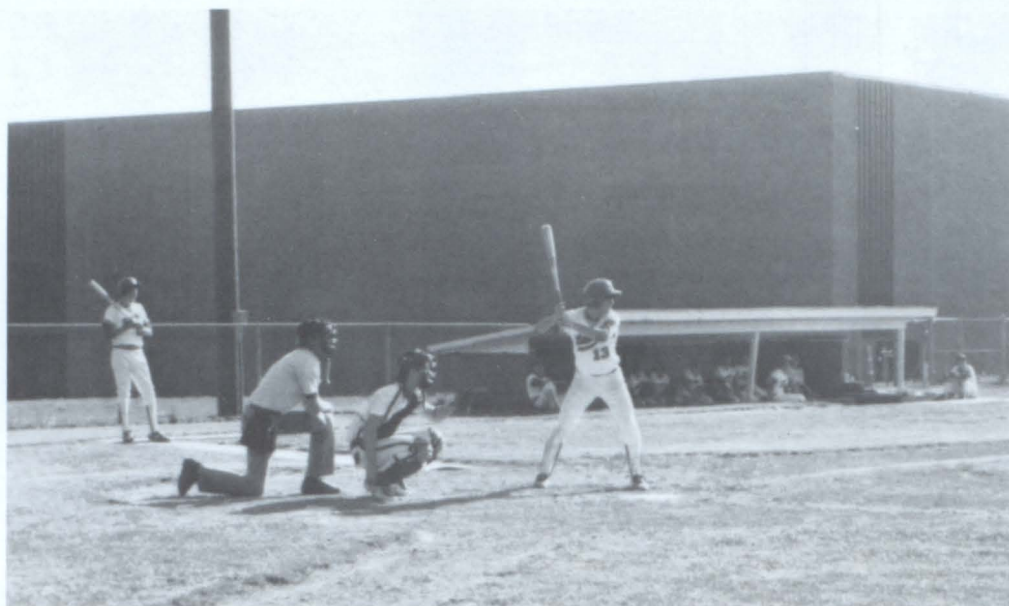

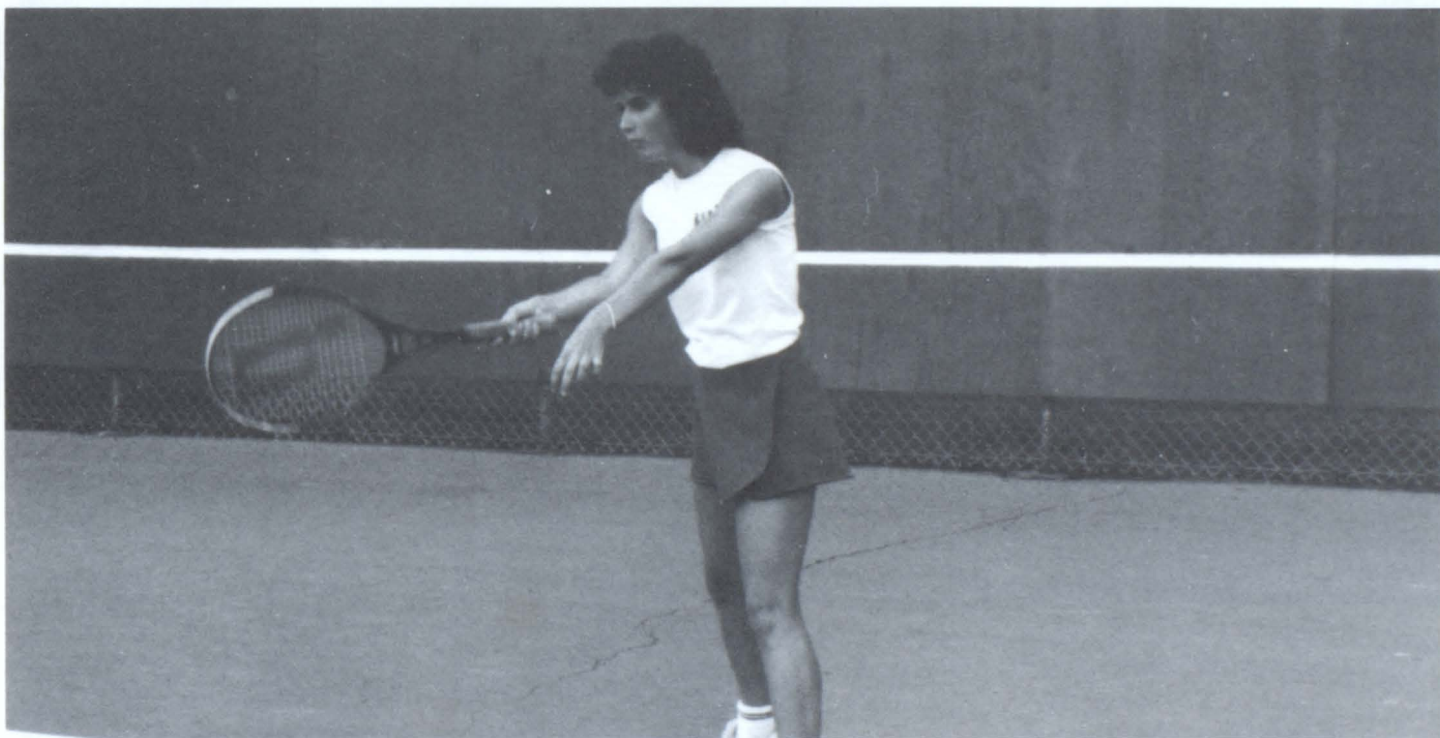

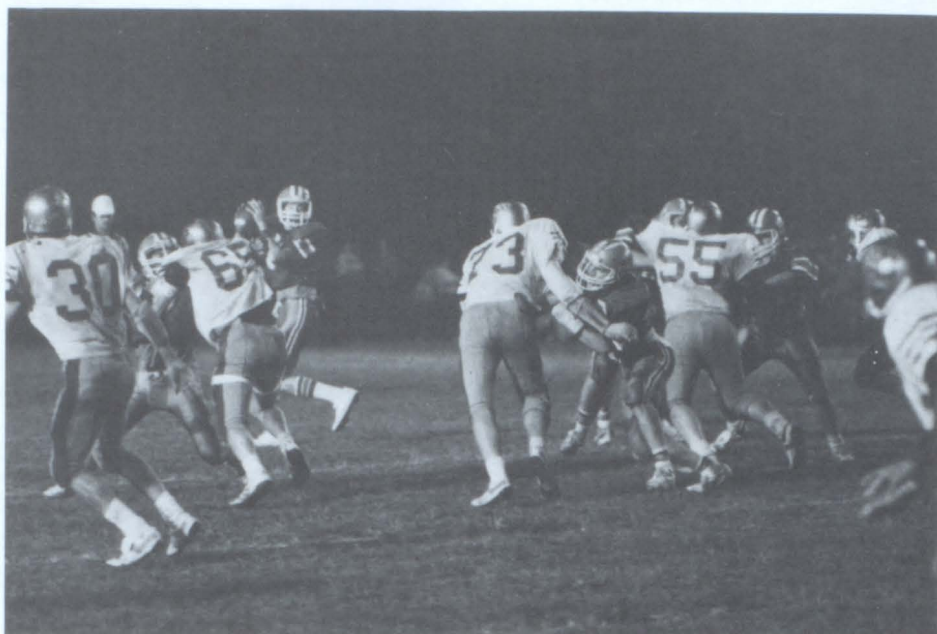

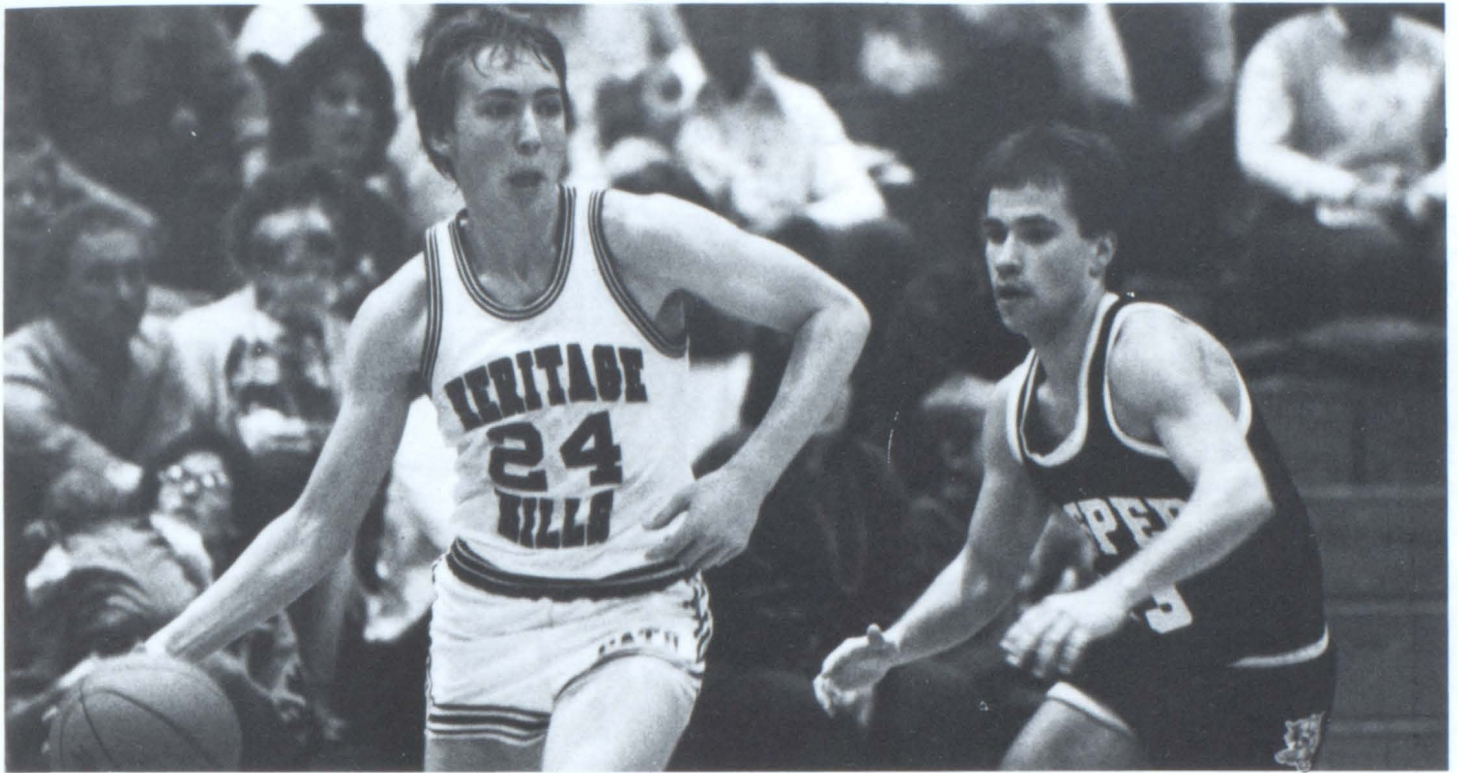

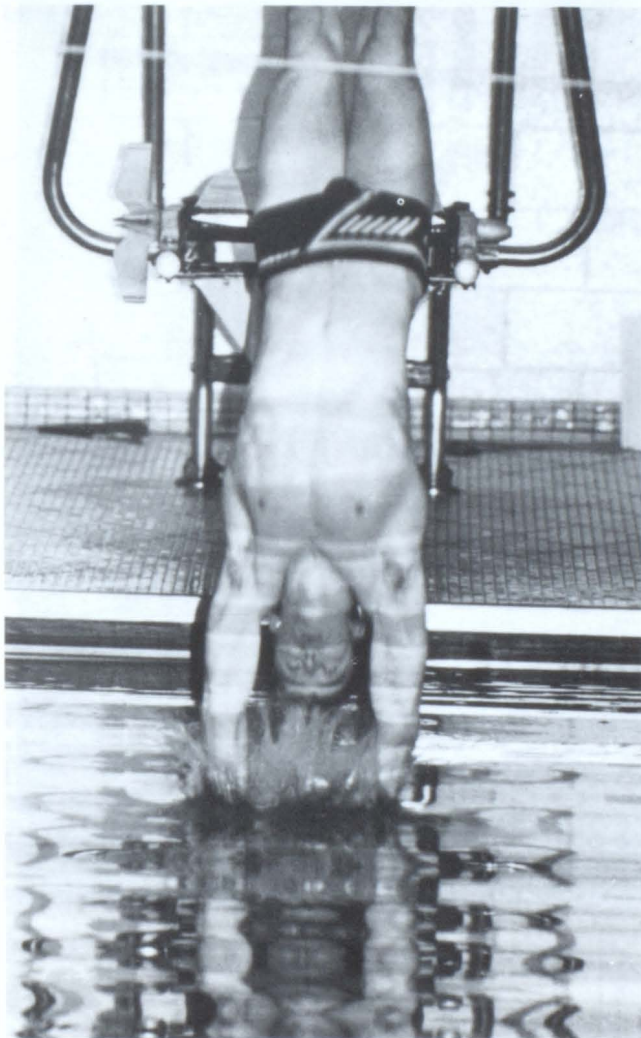

"We had one of our finest seasons, record wise, at 19-2," said Coach White. "We consistently lowered our team scoring average all year. All in all, we had a great season."

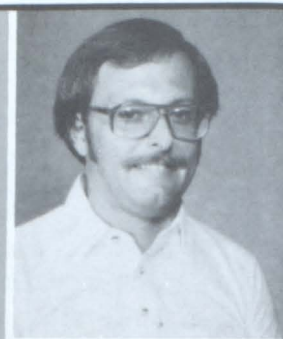

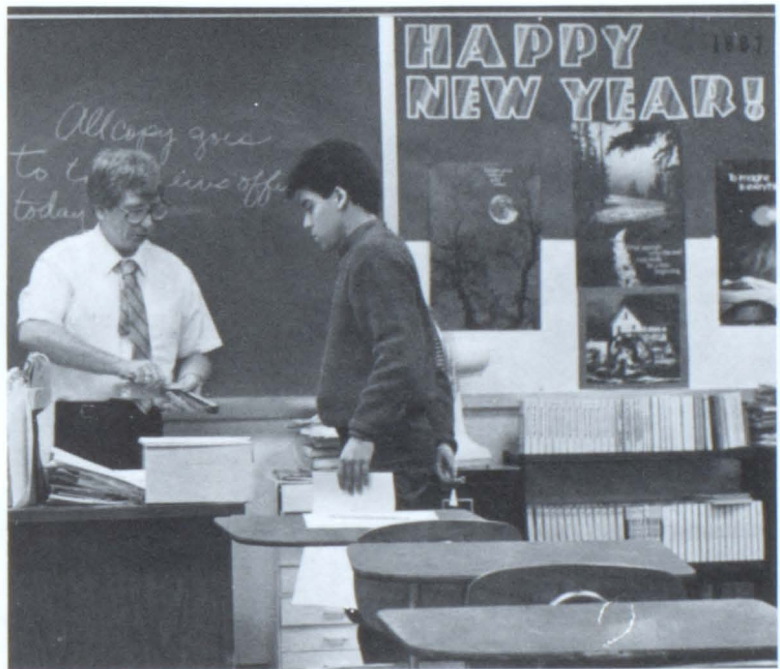

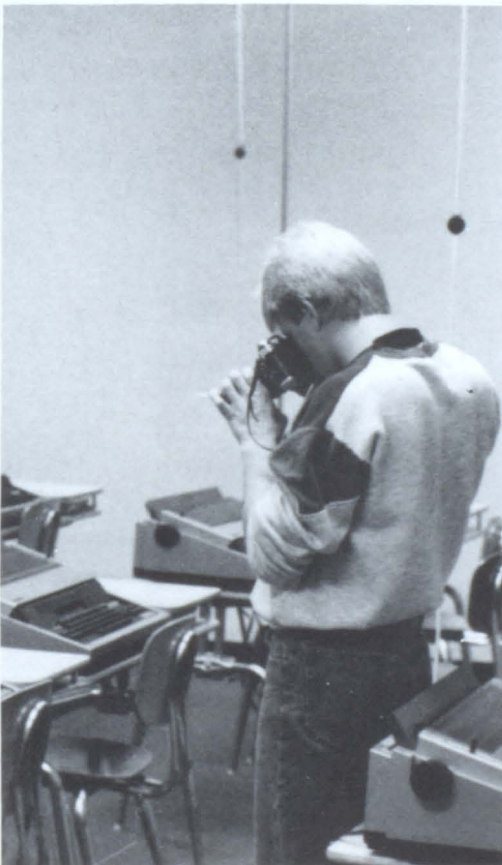

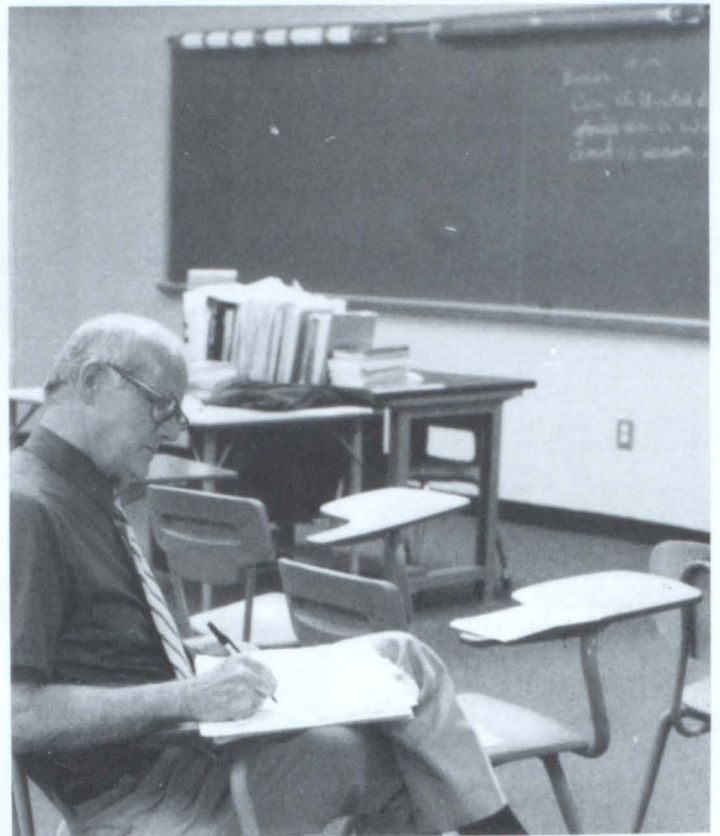

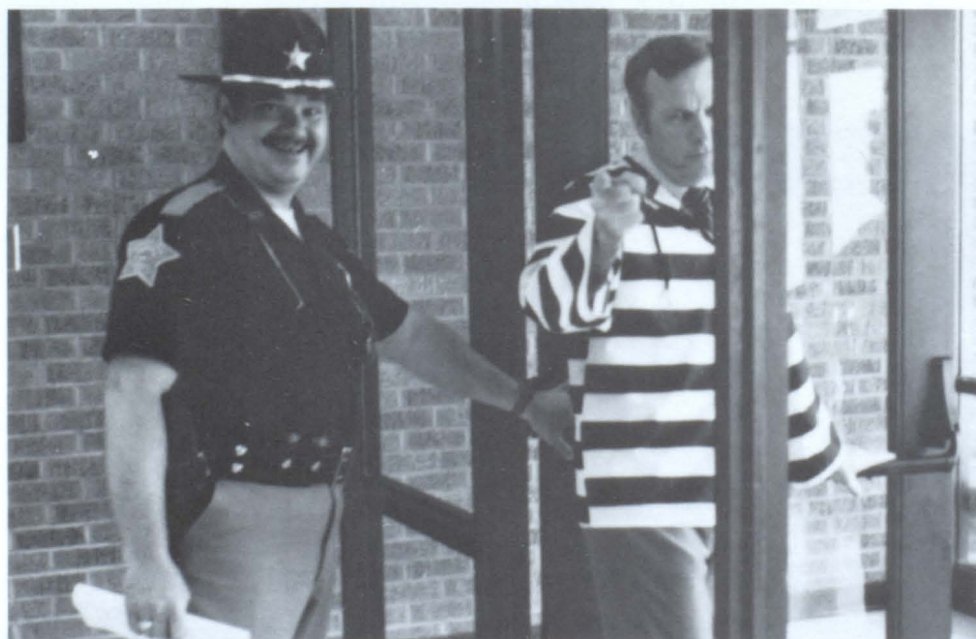

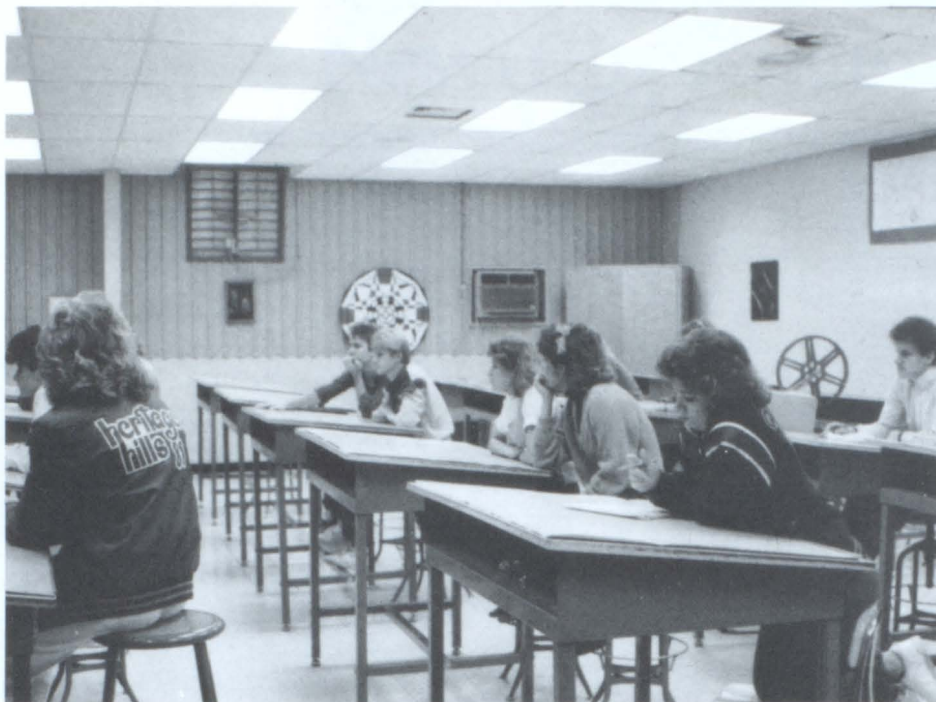

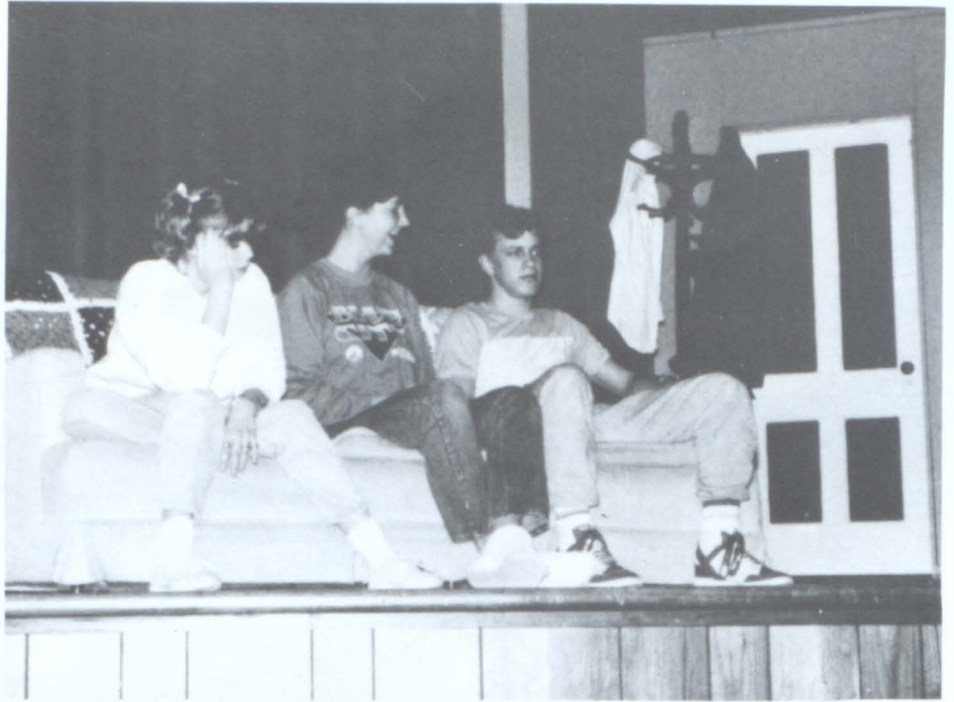

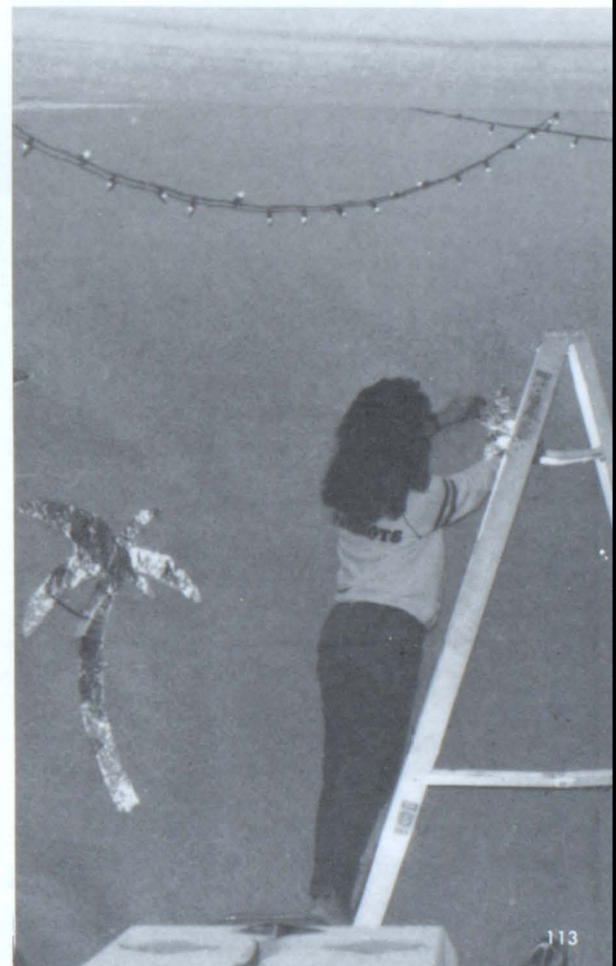

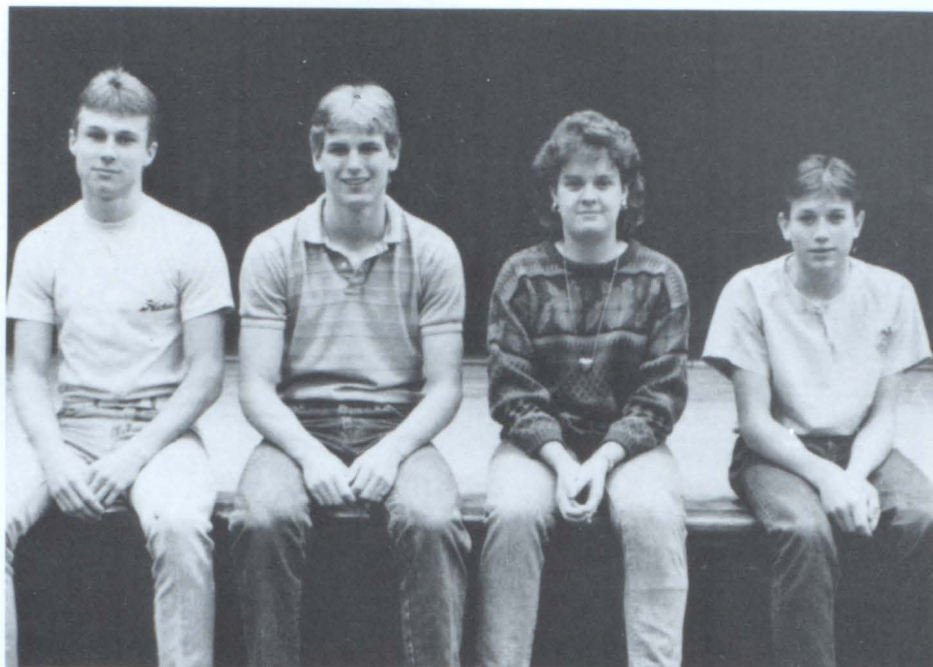
Class of '89
