


- Football Homecoming was held on September 17, 2004. The game was against the North Posey Vikings and they were defeated by the Patriots.

The year was not without its share of struggles. We all seemed to fight through the newness of the Problem-Solving four D's process. The cafeteria installed a new

computerized payment system. The Engineering and Advanced Manufacturing Career Academy was put into action. A new computer lab was created in the Language Arts side of the building. The swimming pool was updated and renovated. Everyone adjusted and welcomed the changes and improvements.




Mr. Morrison has been teaching for a total of thirty-












• The Heritage Hills girls' soccer team finished the season with a 9-7-1 record. This is the first year of a third year program that they finished over 500. This means that they had a winning record.




- The 2005 season got started late because the football team went to the state finals. The first game against Princeton was rescheduled from Dec. 4 to Feb. 1.

- The boys' sectional meet took place on February 17, 2005, at Jasper. The team ended the season with a seventh place finish out of sixteen teams.














