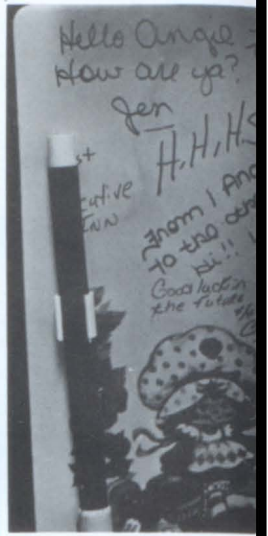


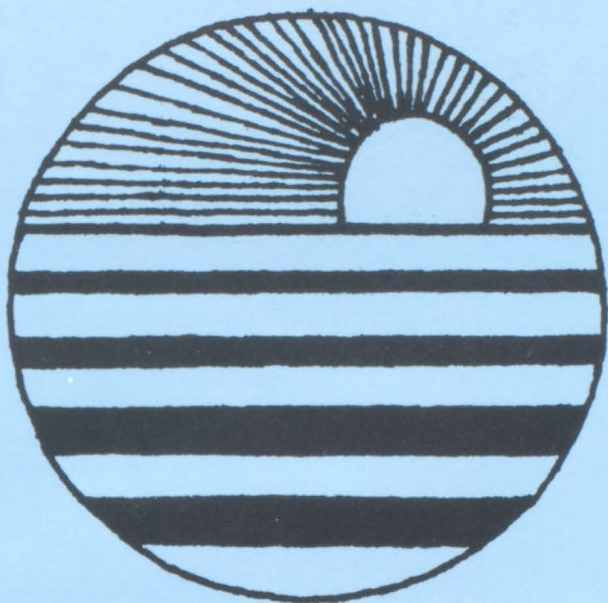
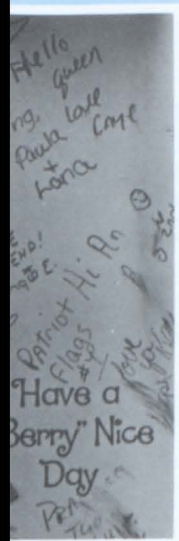
NEW HORIZONS





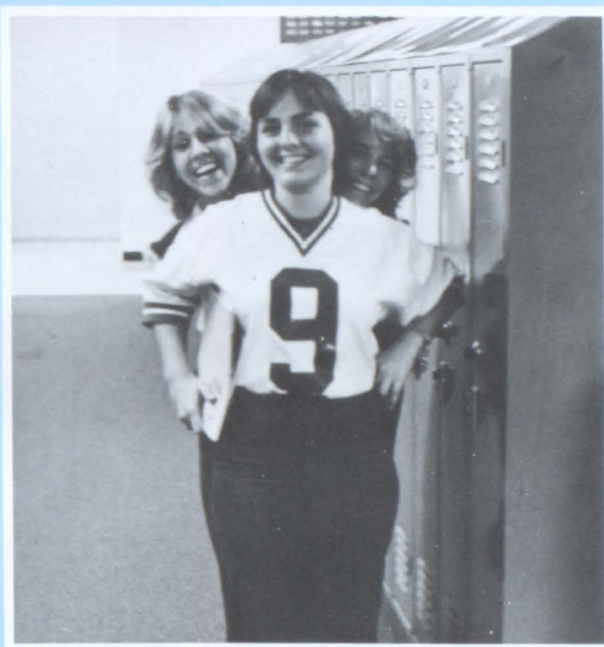

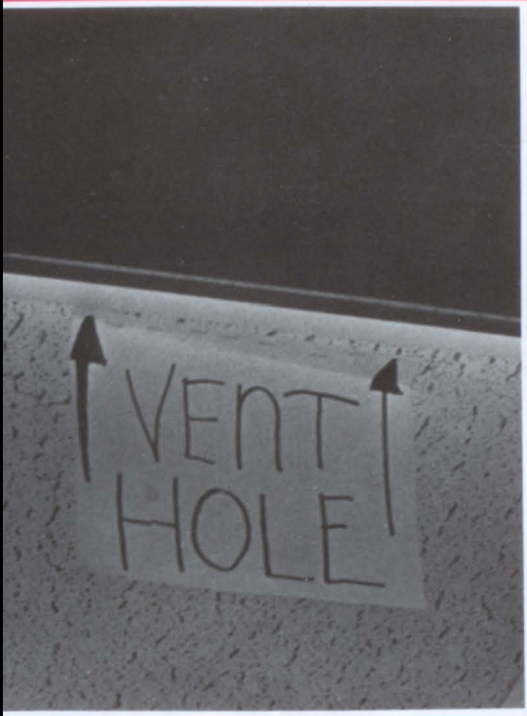
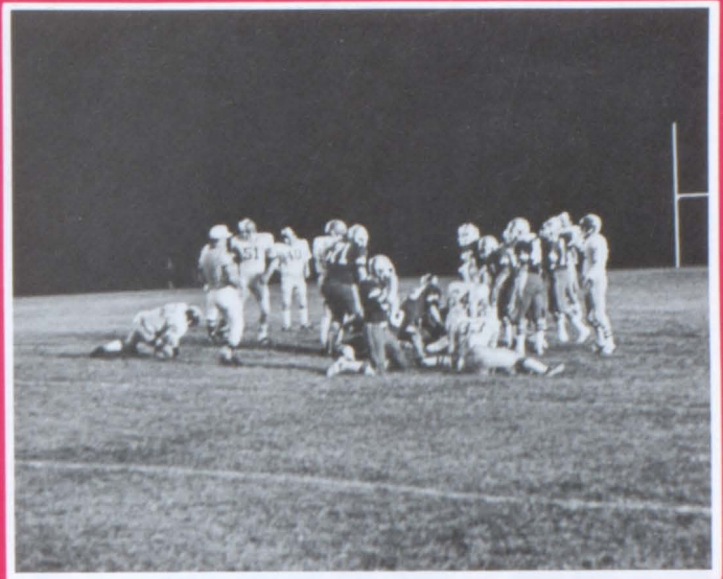
"1982"

MEETING HALF WAY



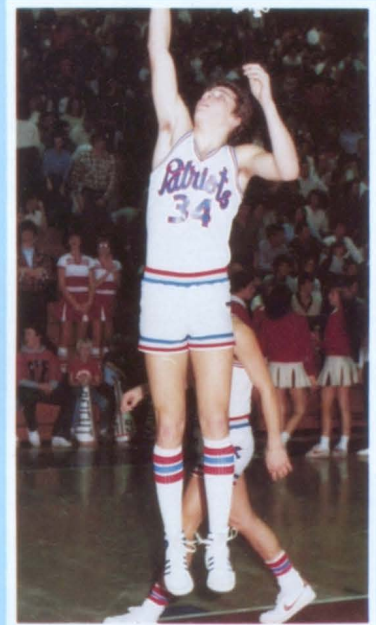

OVER THE HORIZON

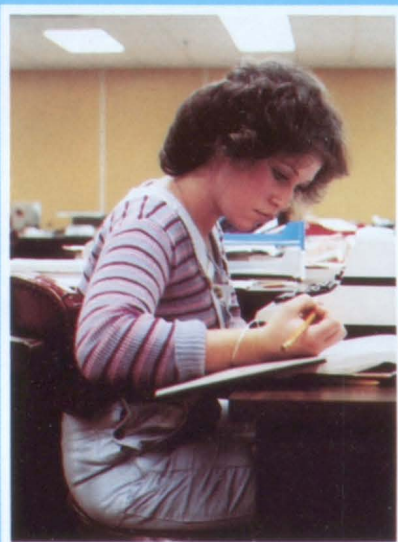

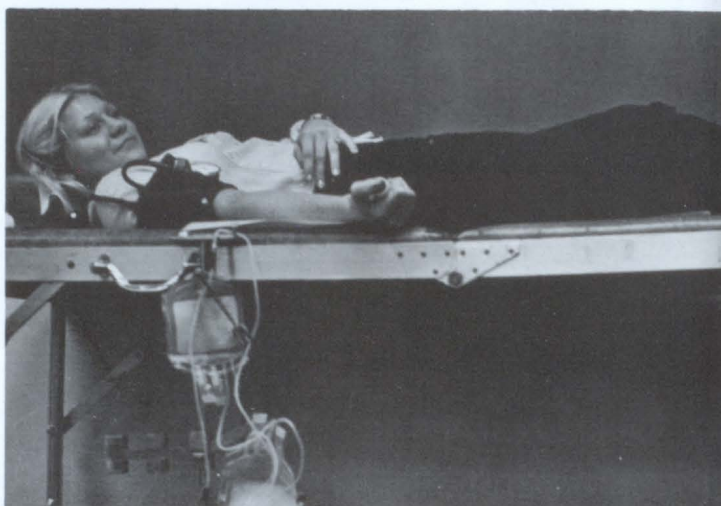


THROUGH THE EYES OF LOVE

The Patriots may have been small, but they were mighty. Some teams dream about winning, but the Patriots make their dreams come true.





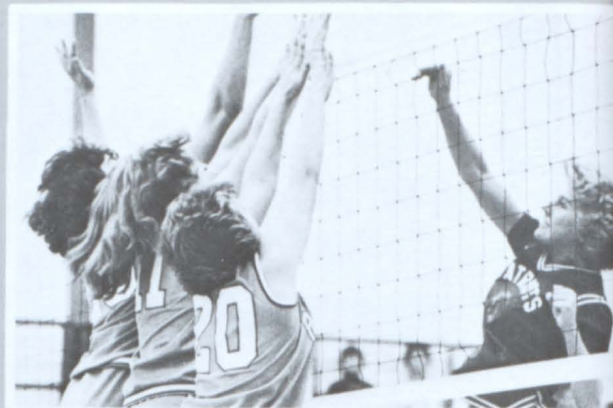
