




John Clark, son of Mrs. Catherine Clark of Dale, is the valedictorian of the '58 graduating class of Dale High School.


transferred from Ohio and gave a very good account of himself in his first year out for football. John's pride and joy was lowering the boom on any enemy back attempting to run around his end.
