The light, the dew, the broadening view, Were found the same as they were before; And it lost itself in beauties new, Breathing its fragrance more and more.


Shall claim of death cause us to grieve, And make our courage faint or fall? Nay, let us faith and hope receive-The rose still grows beyond the wall.

To the Freshmen we leave our ability to get along with the teachers and to go anywhere in the school building without getting lost.



In parting we wish to bring home one thing to our underclassmen, "They Can Who Think They Can".
















School Calendar


The Dale Grade Team comprised of 7th and 8th graders had a total of 12 scheduled games for the 1953-54 season.

With only two regulars returning from last years team, the Rockets quickly organized into a compact and fighting ball team.



The first call for football in August produced 23 candidates. This increased to 34 at mid-season and the Golden Aces would up with 29 boys (of which 15 were Freshmen).


Eight returning lettermen of which three were regulars in 1952 comprised the nucleous for the Aces football team.







For the first time in the history of Dale High School two girls were chosen for the honor of football queen.
