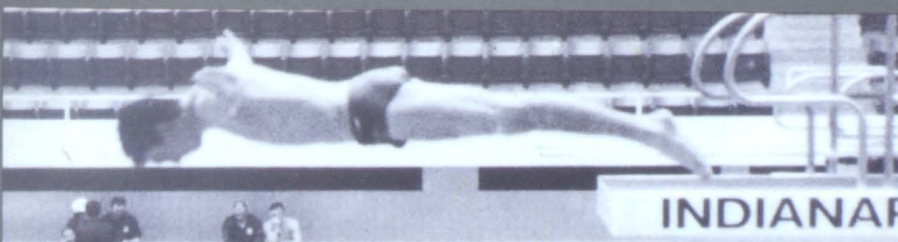




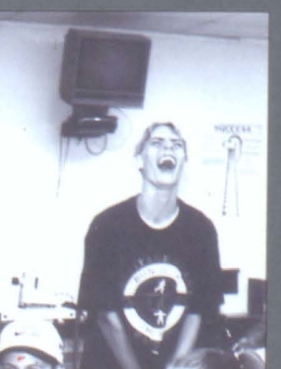
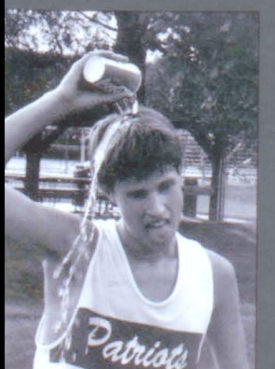
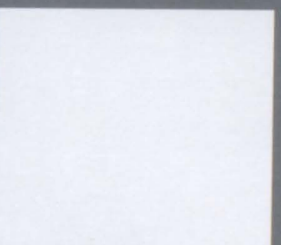
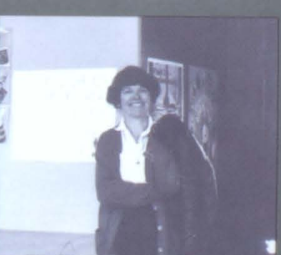








# (re)capture

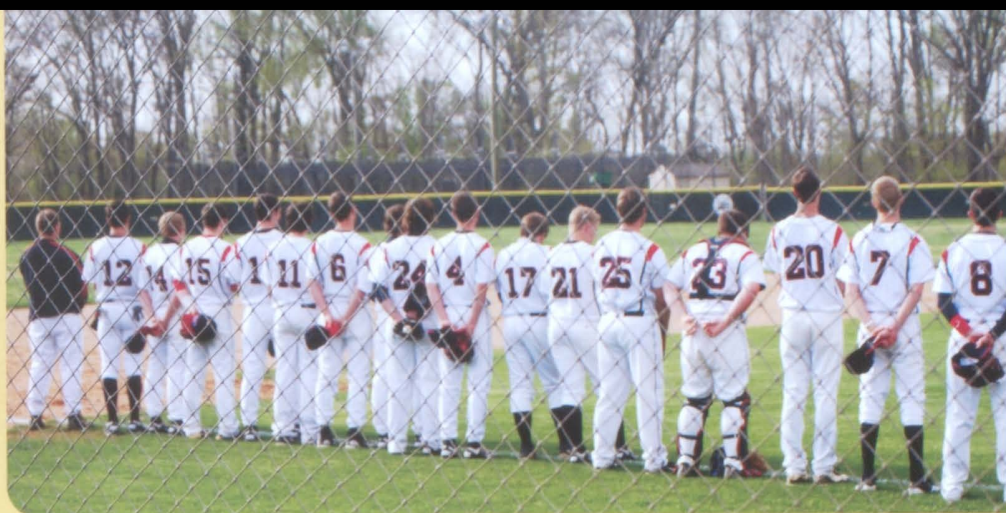

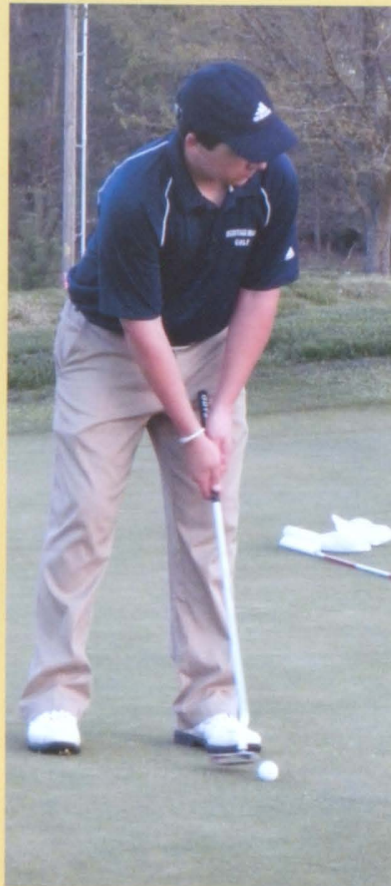

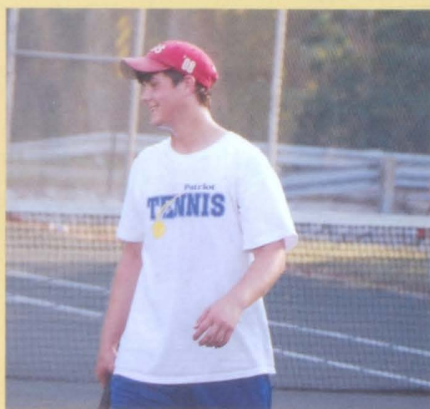

## volleyball

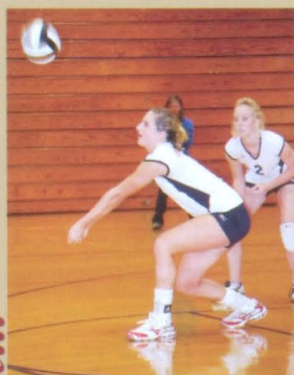

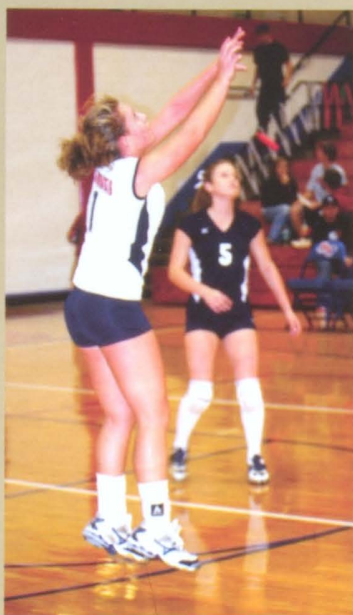

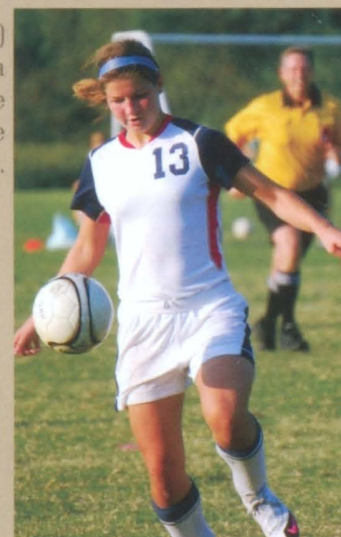

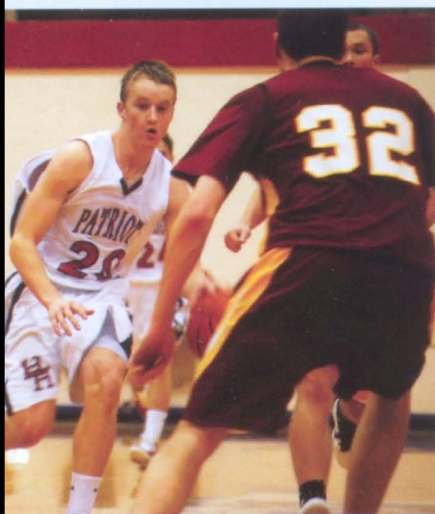

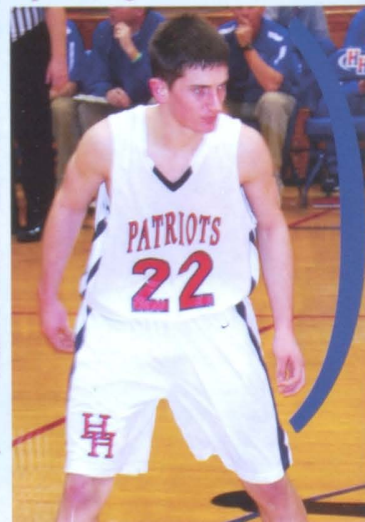

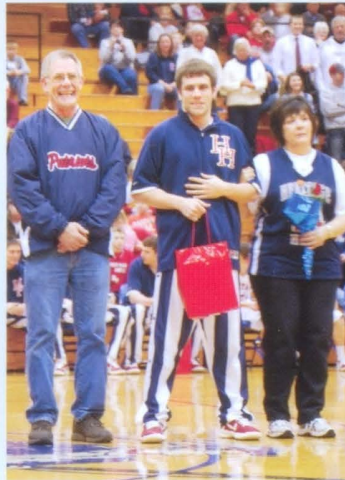

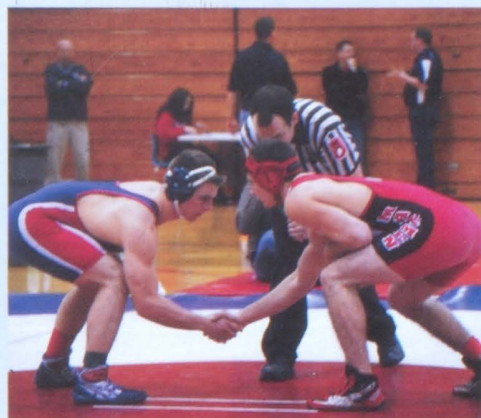
