We were glad to welcome two new members and one old member to our class. They were Edward Gengelbach, Paul Hagedorn, and Max Dawson.

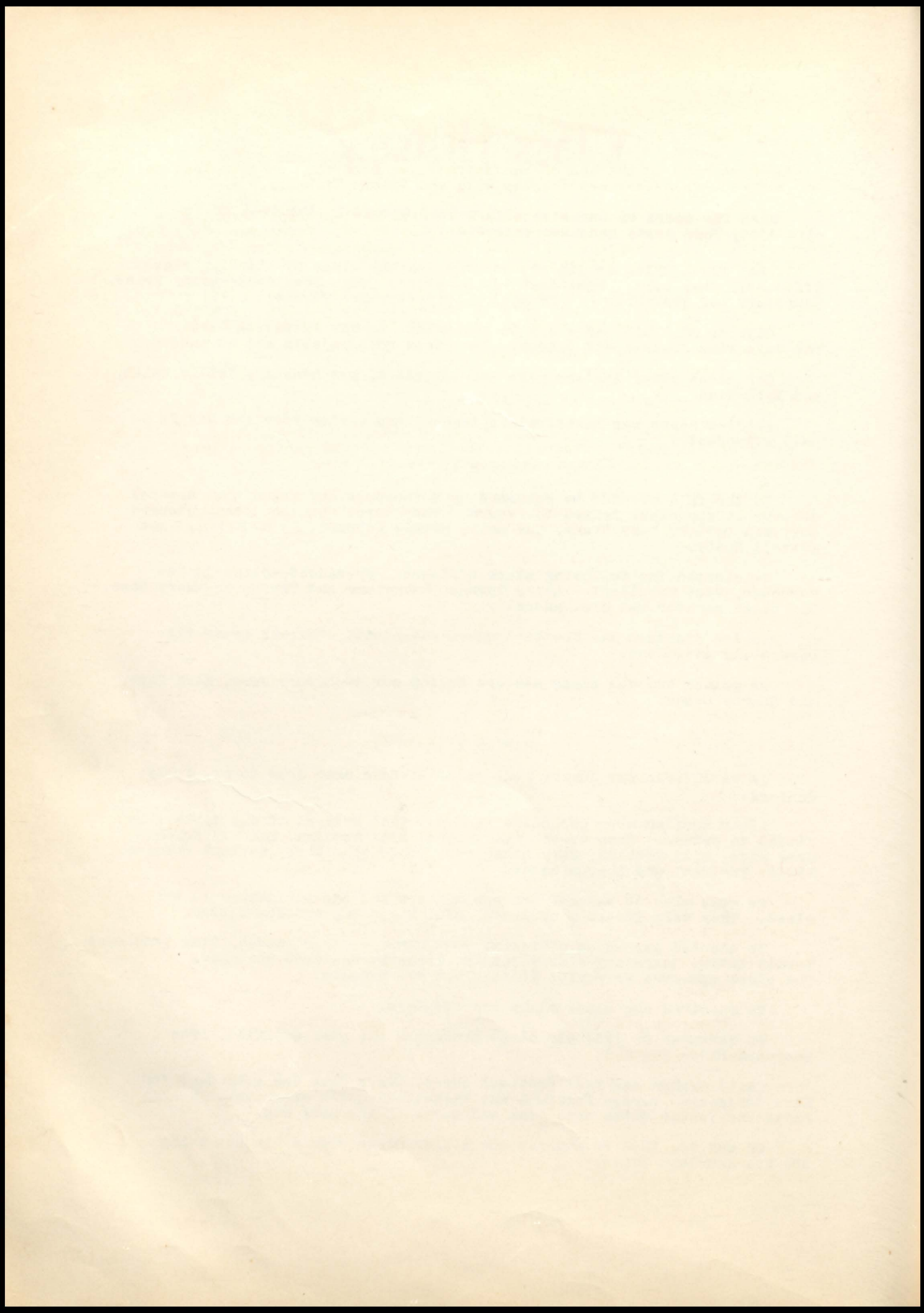

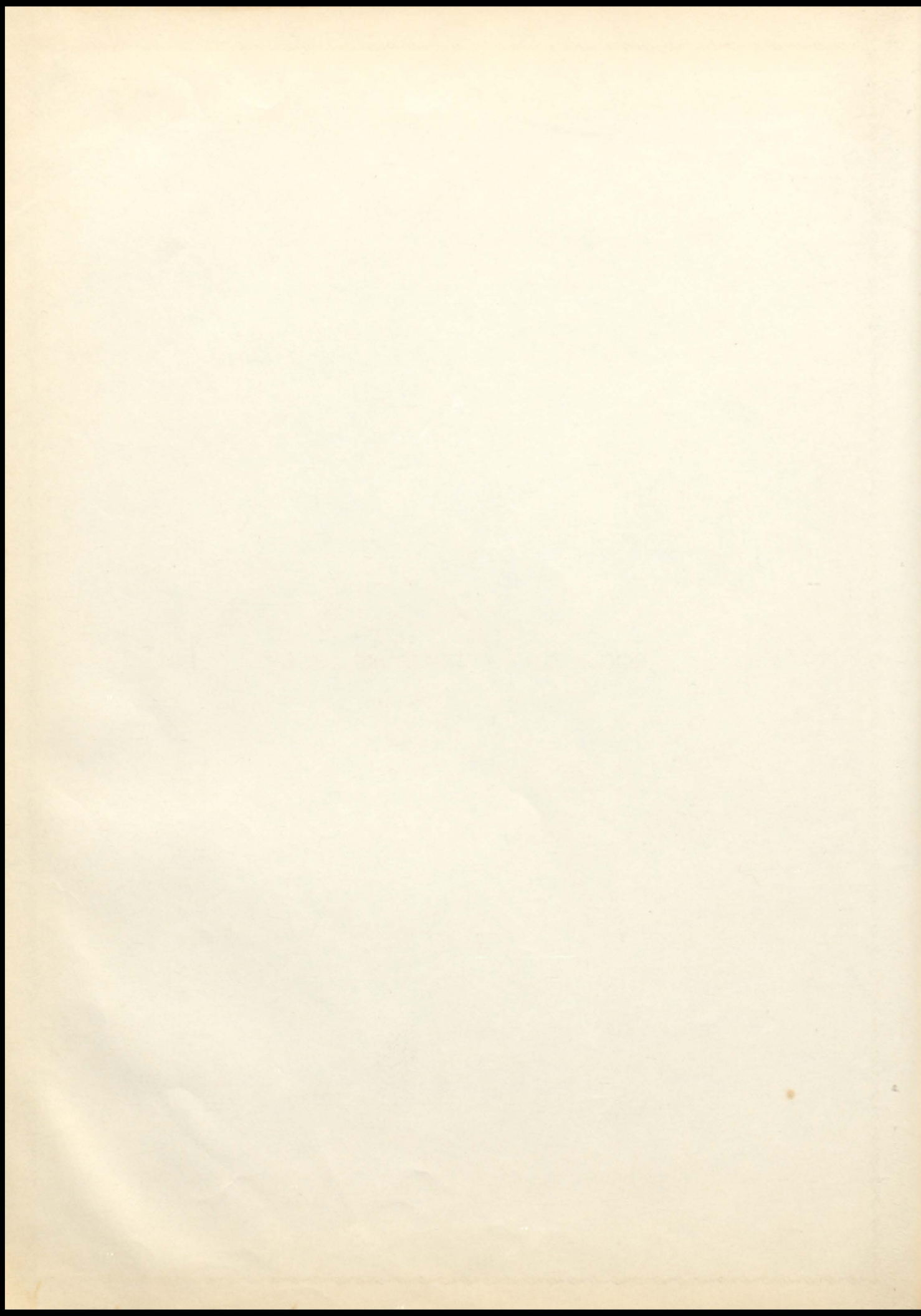

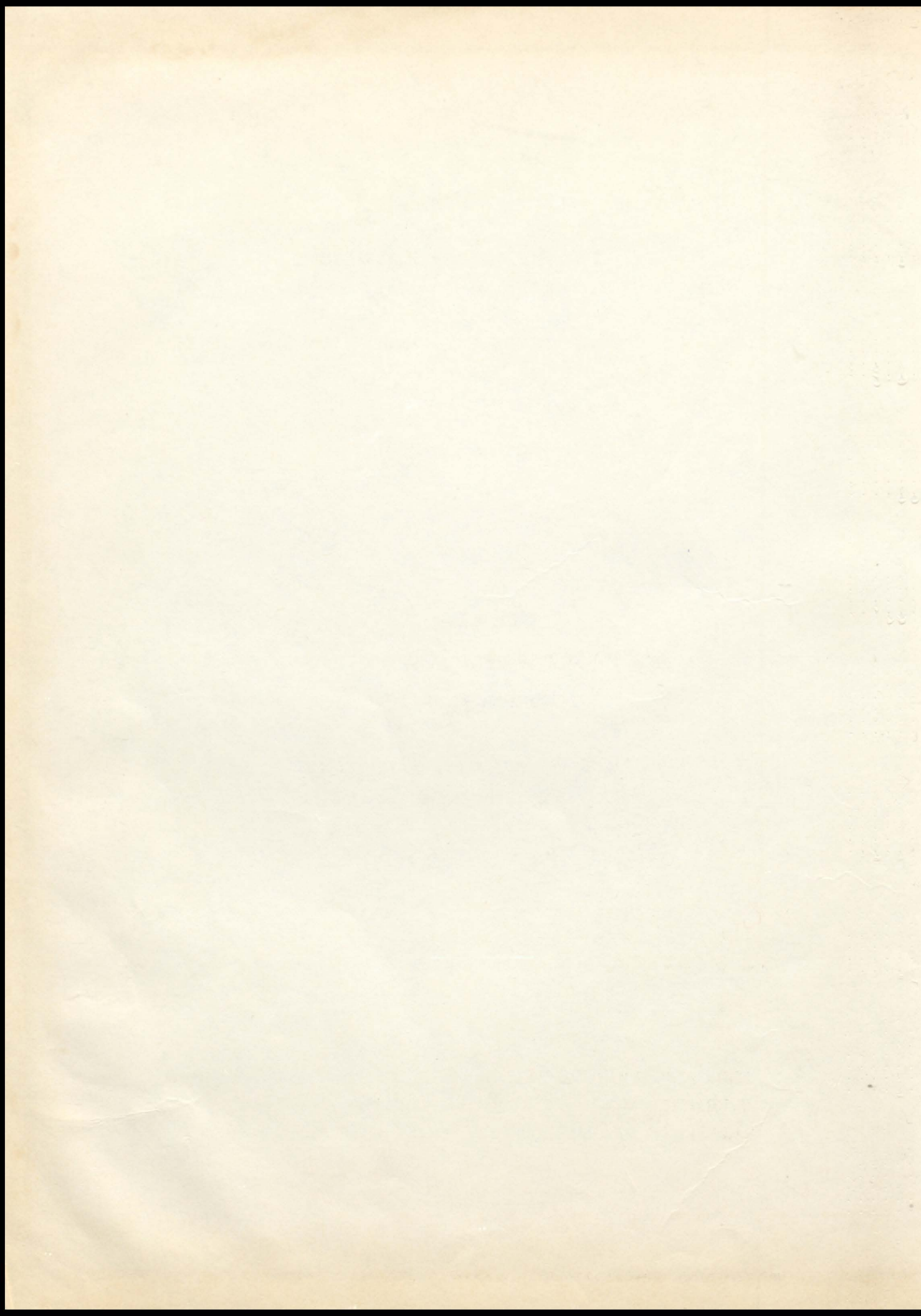
