After a very busy year the Juniors went eagerly into their summer vacation.

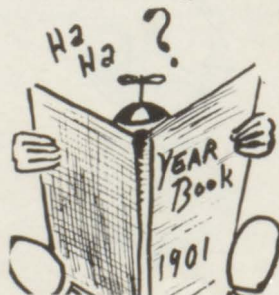
