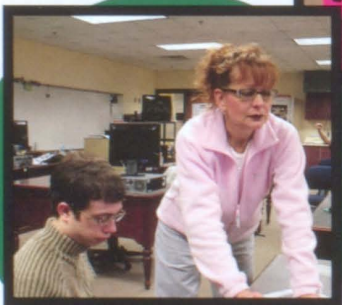

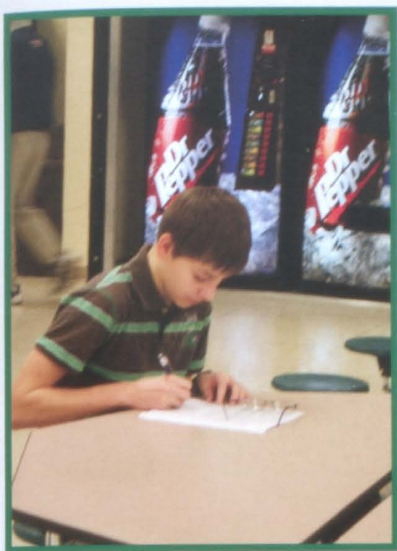
"No. They don't really pick on me," she said.

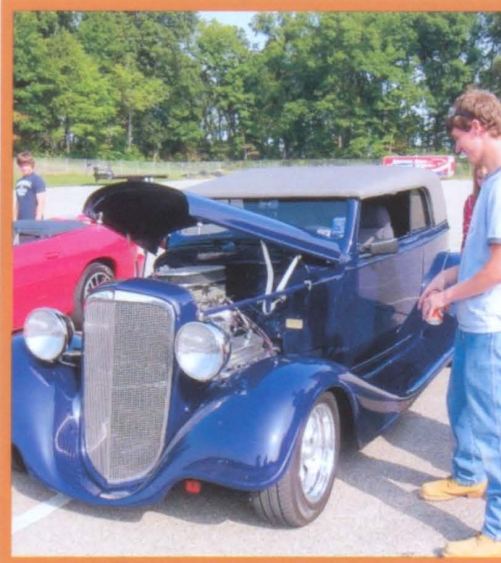

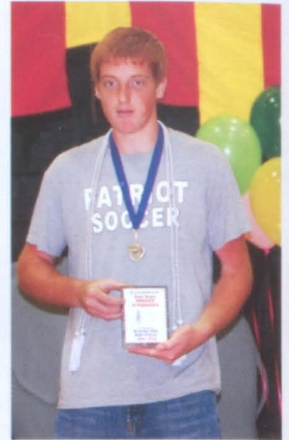

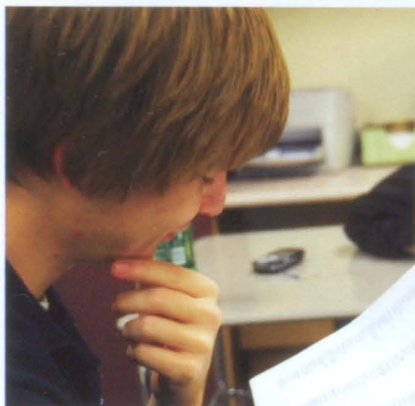

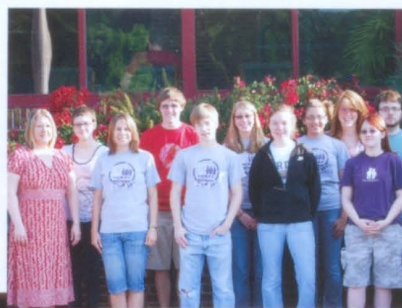

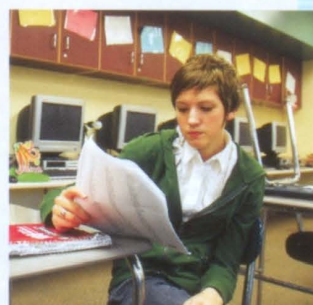

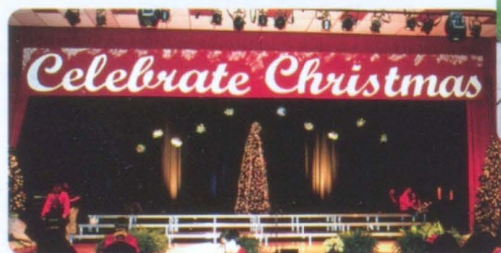

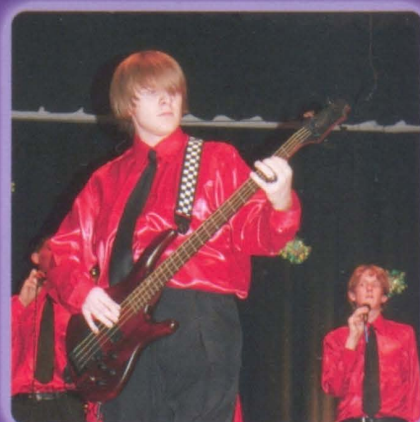

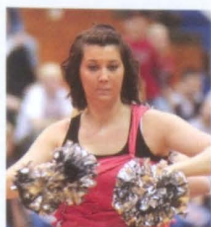

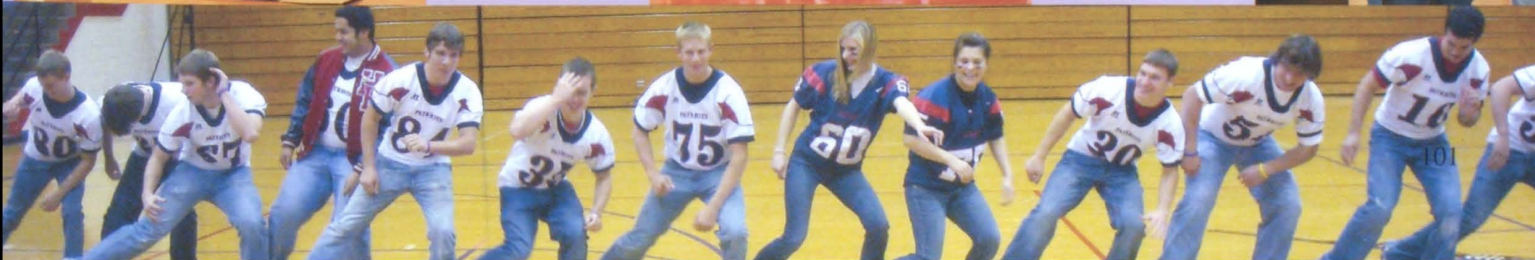

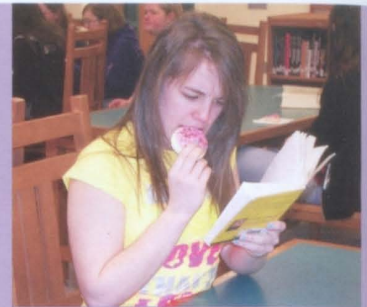

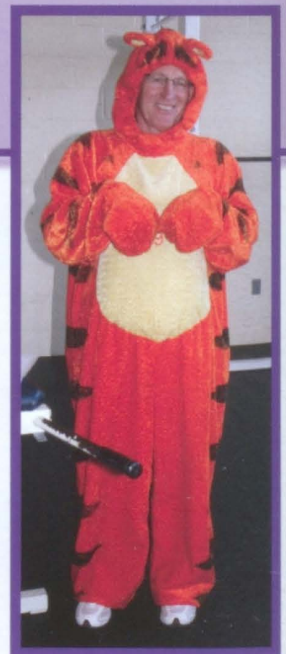

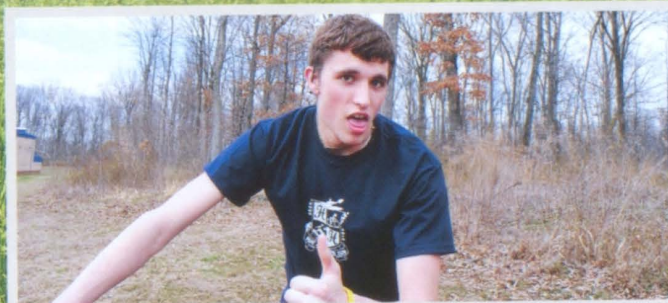

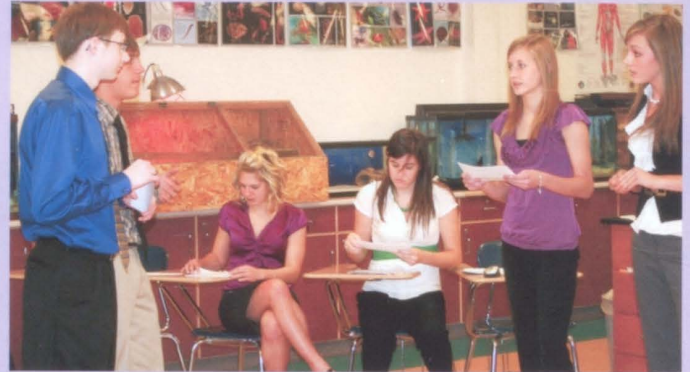

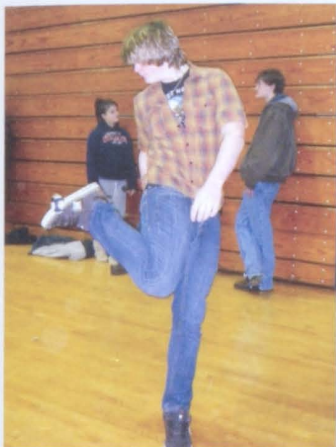

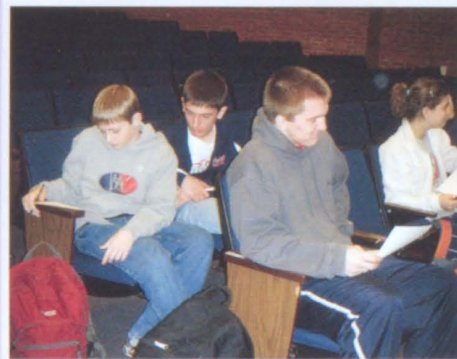

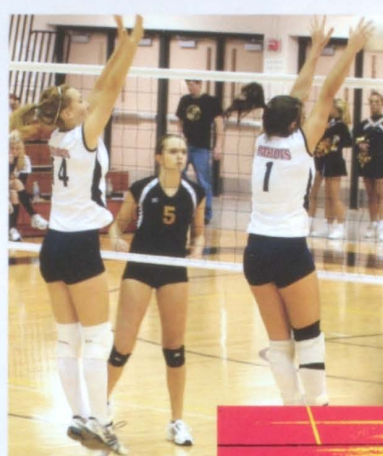

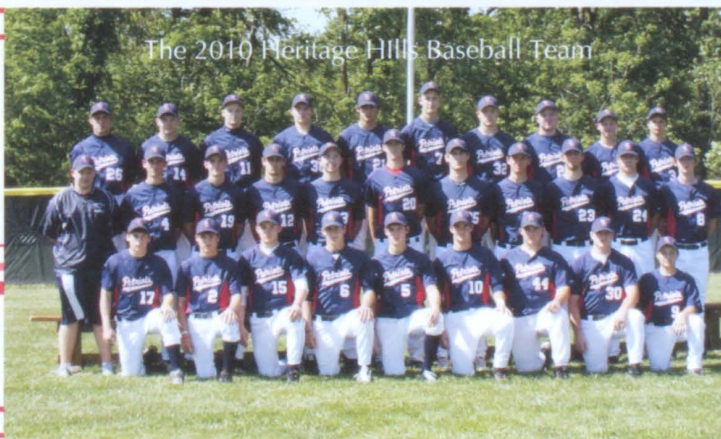

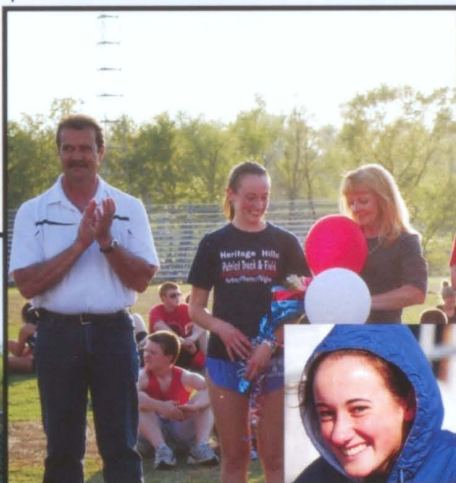

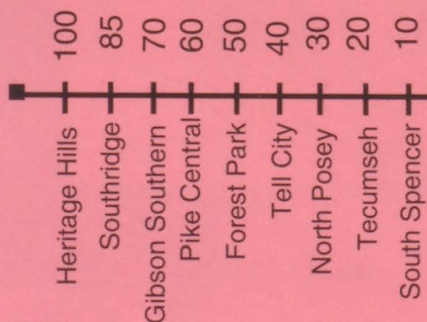

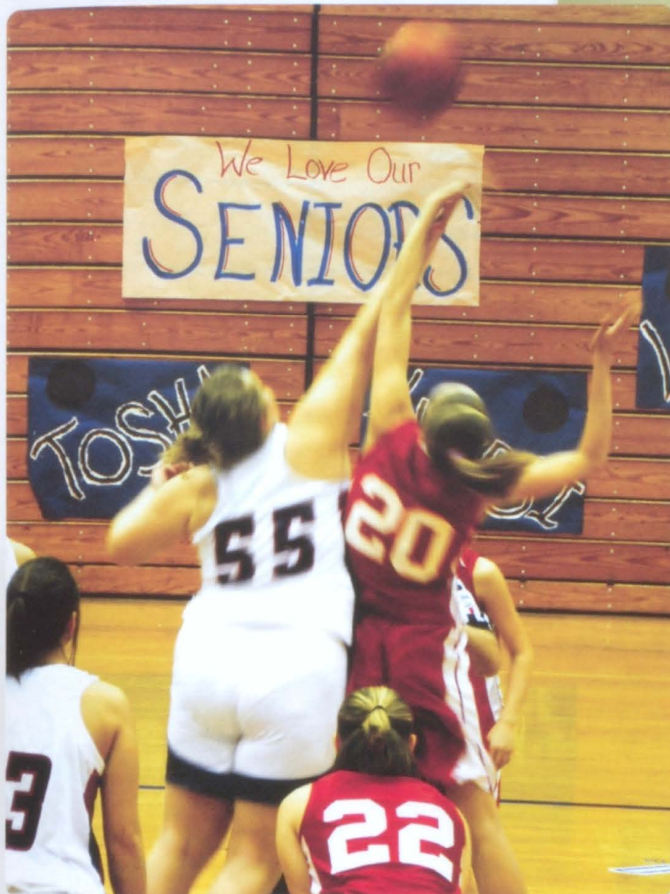

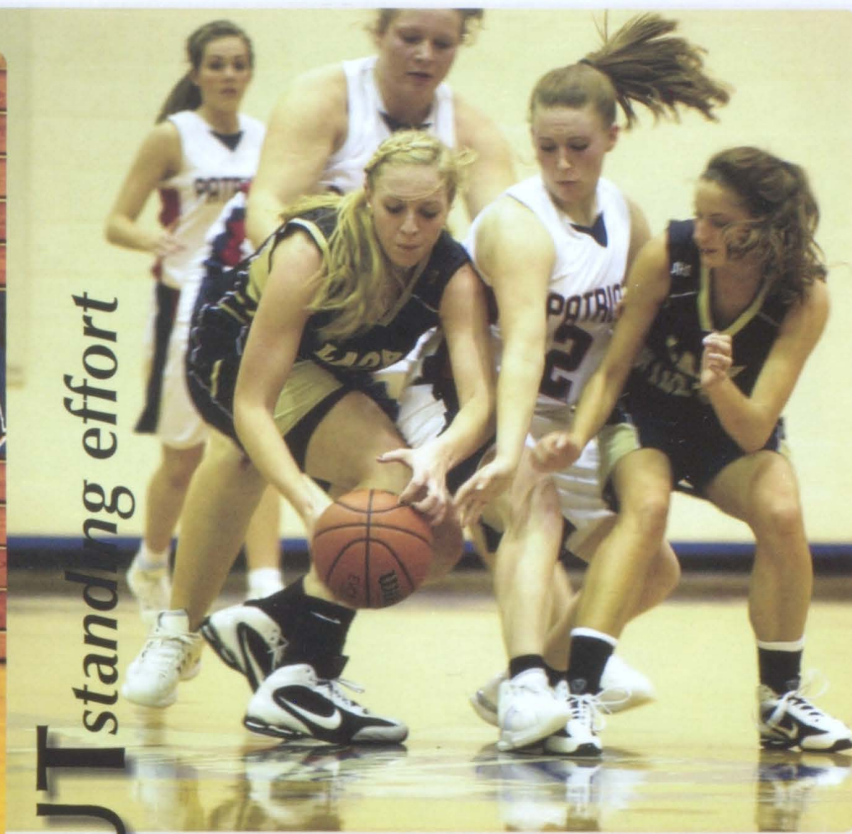

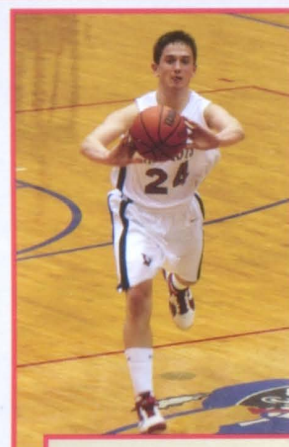

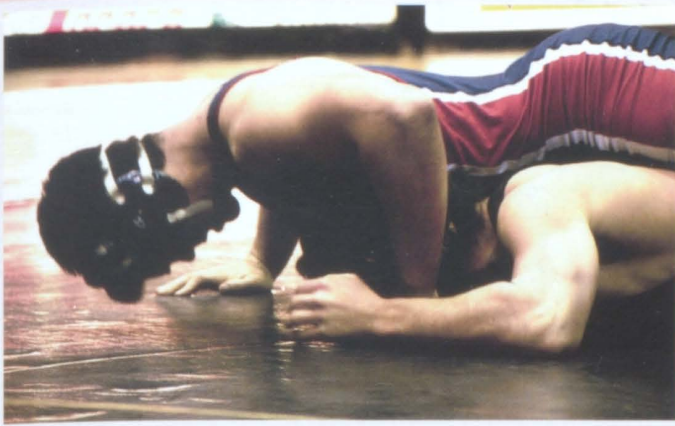

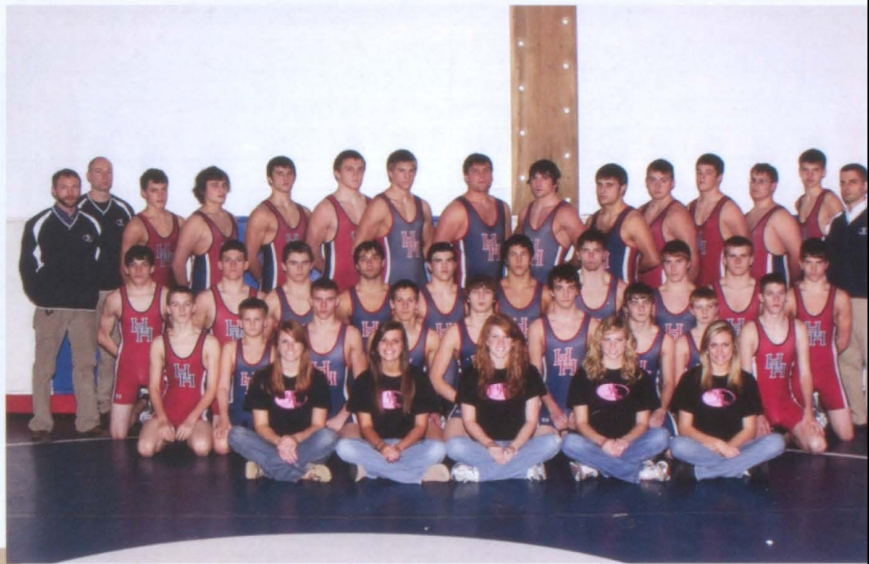

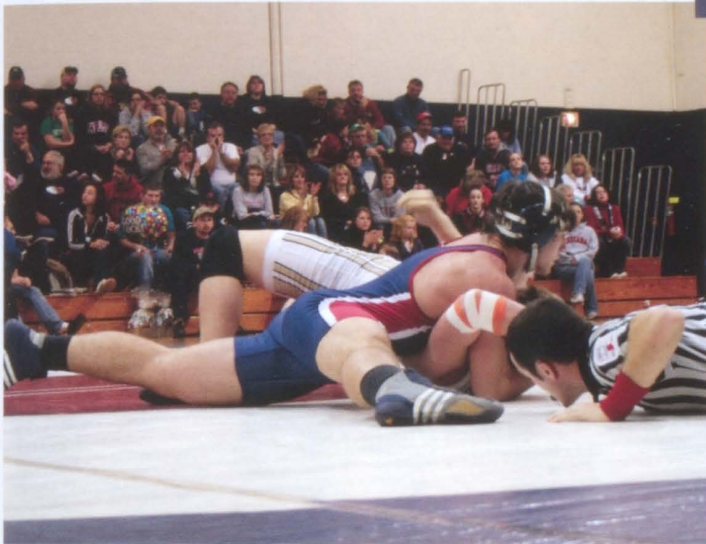

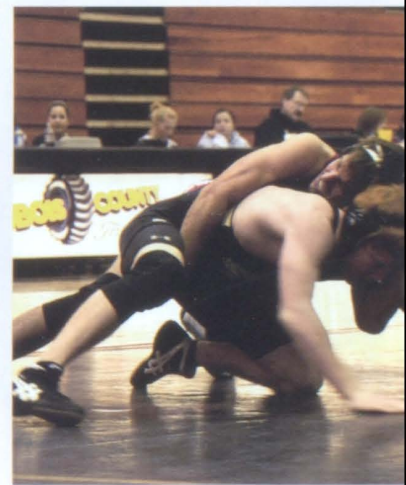

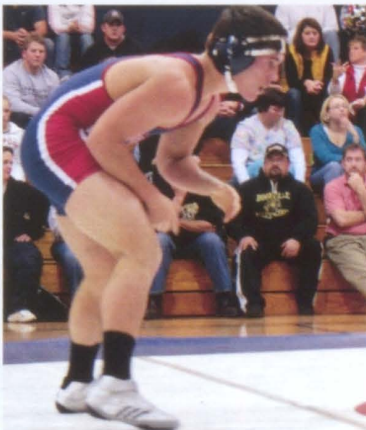

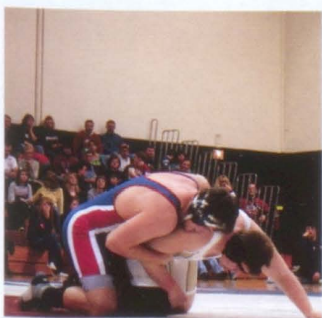

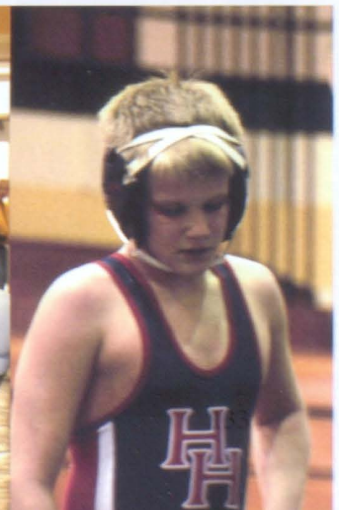
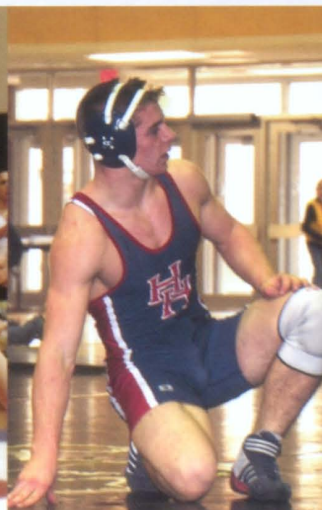

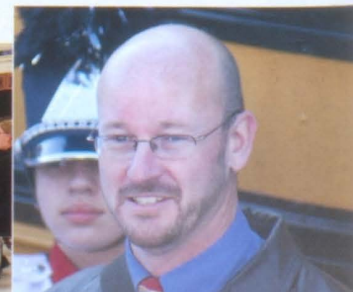

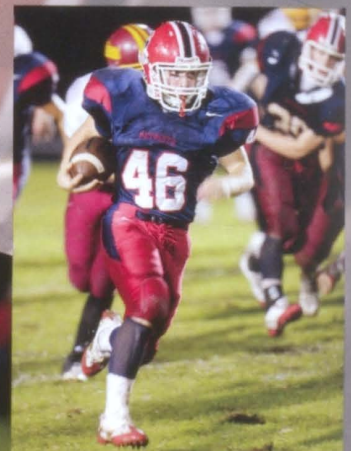

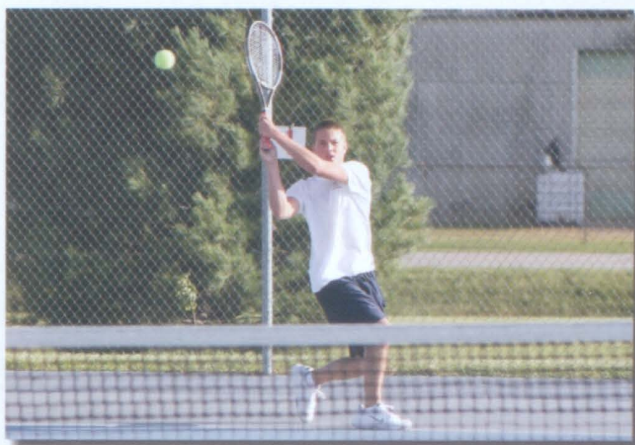
