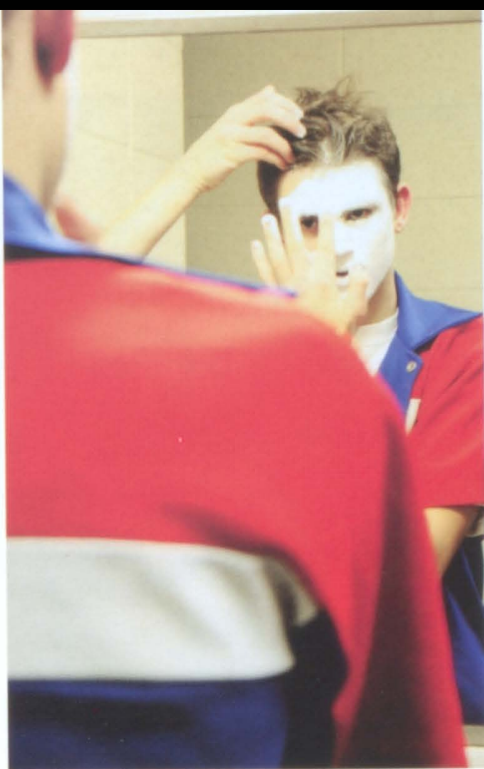

School Spirit: Loud, Proud Patriot Fans

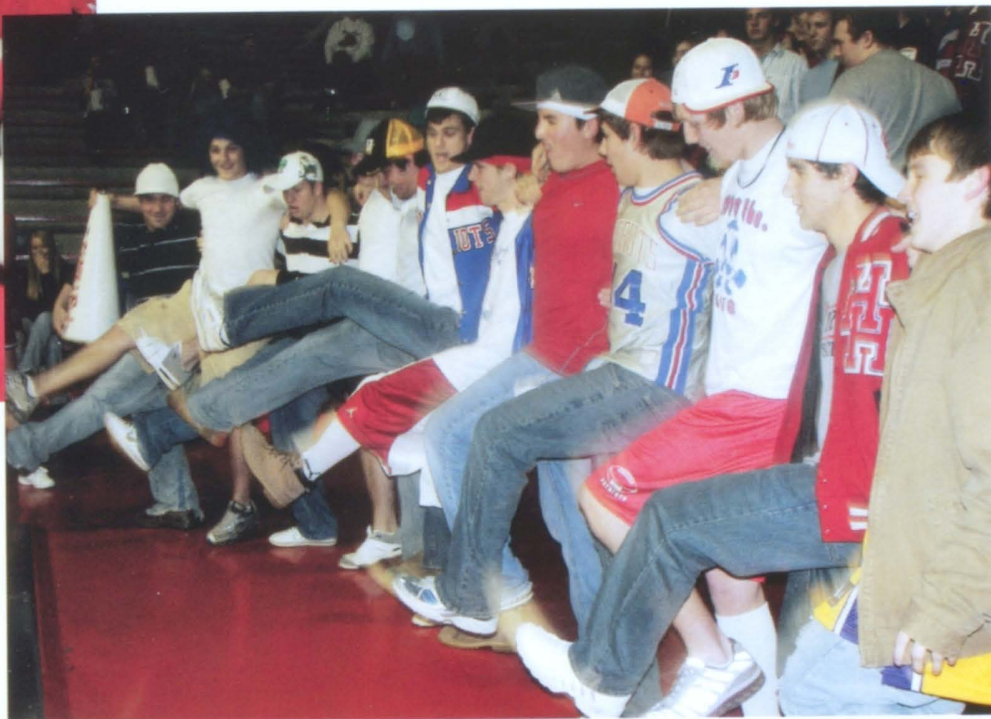

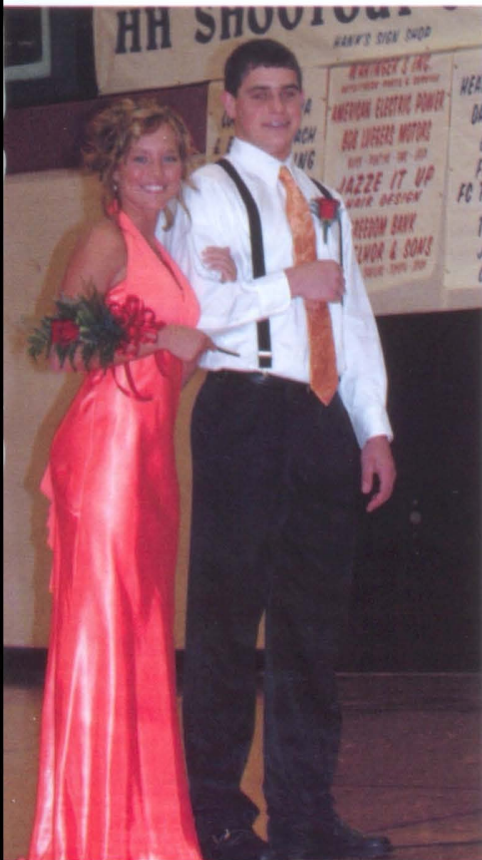

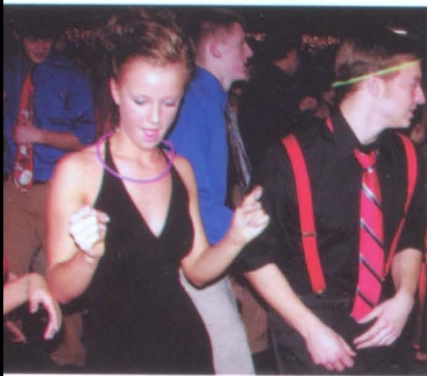
"Baby It's Cold Outside" Holiday Ball

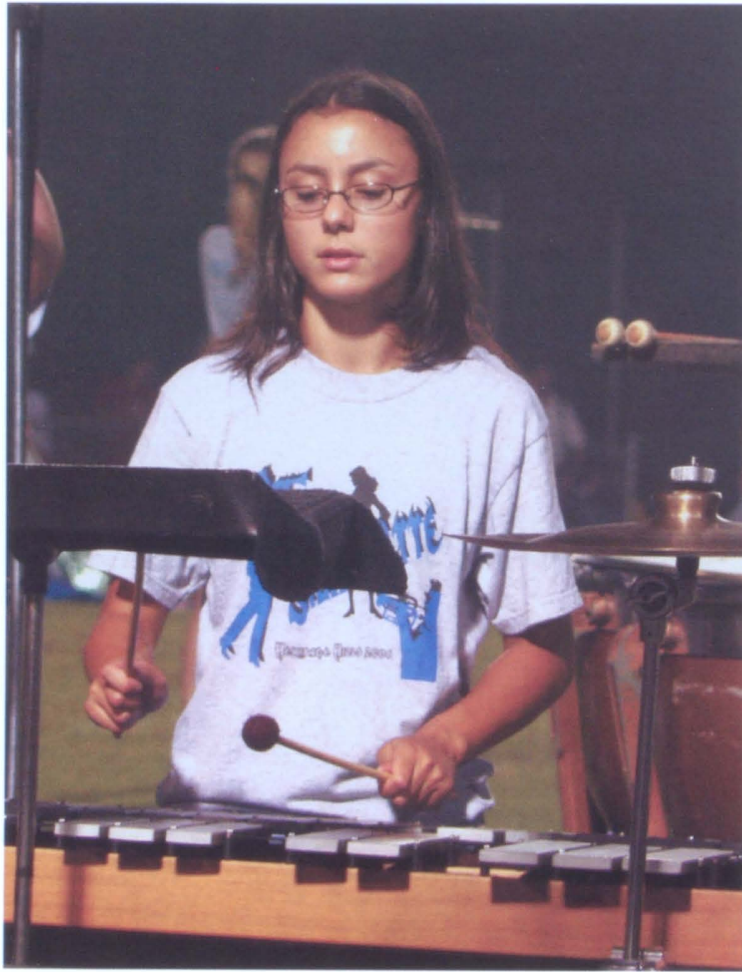

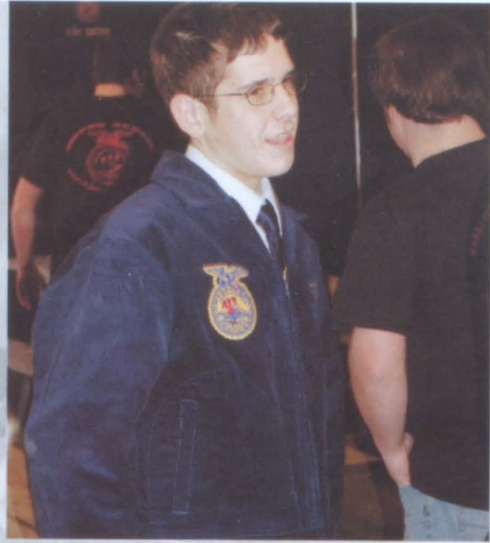

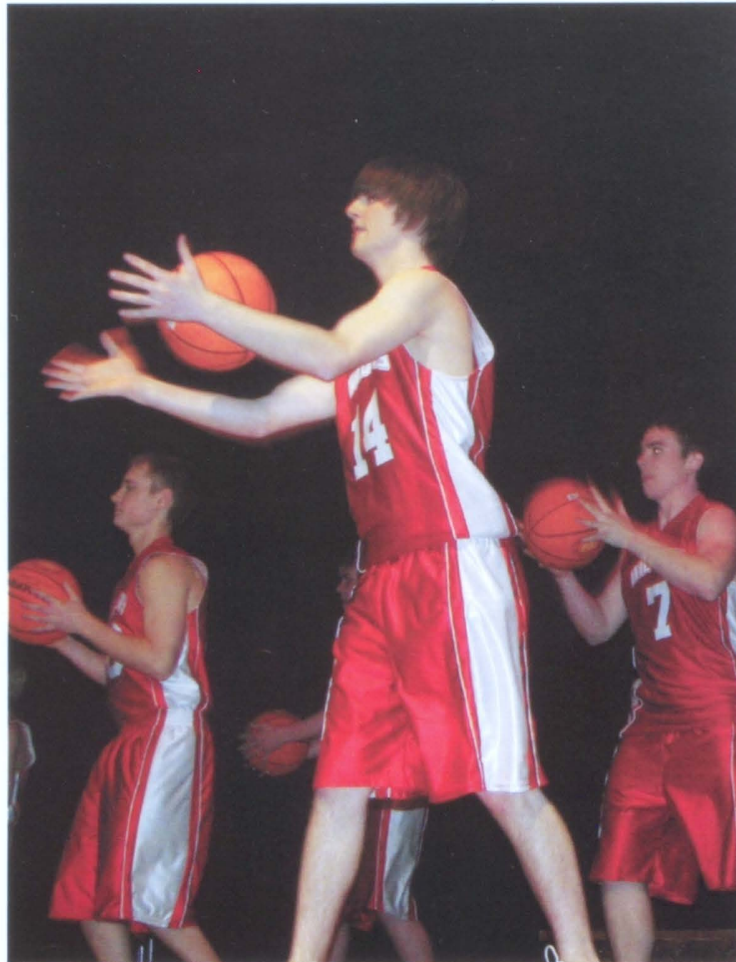

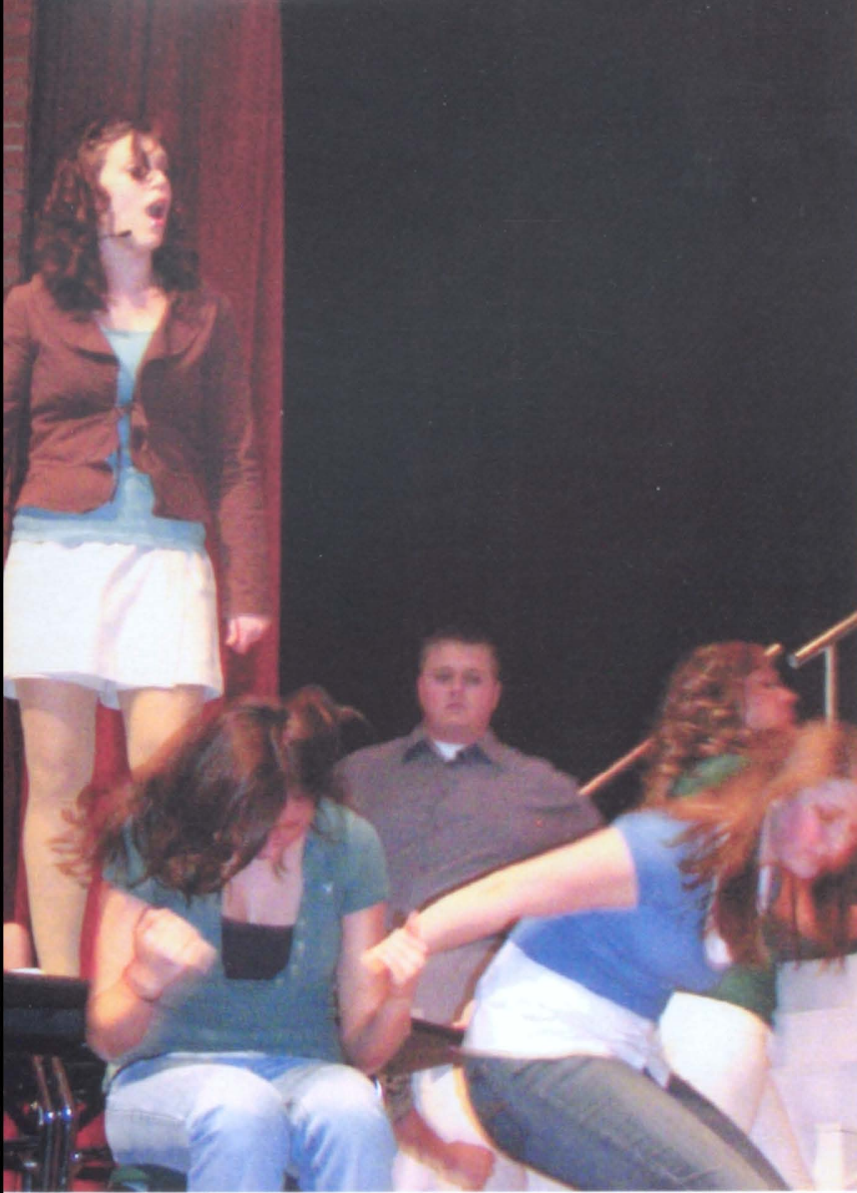

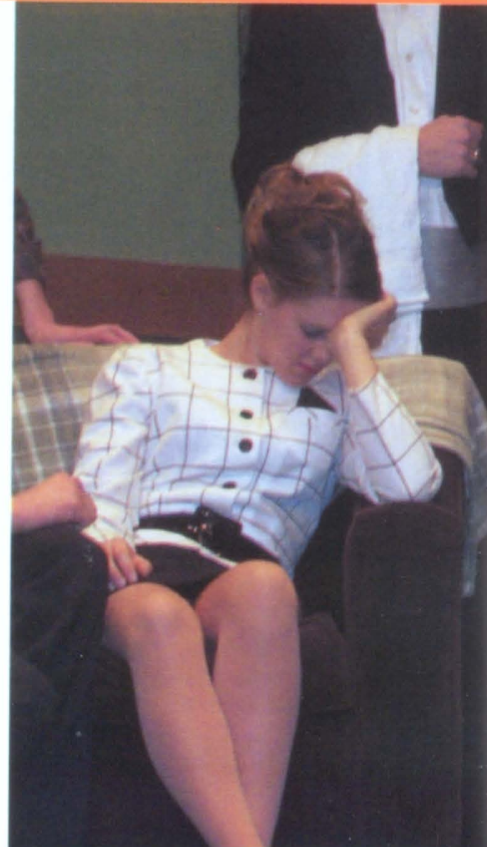

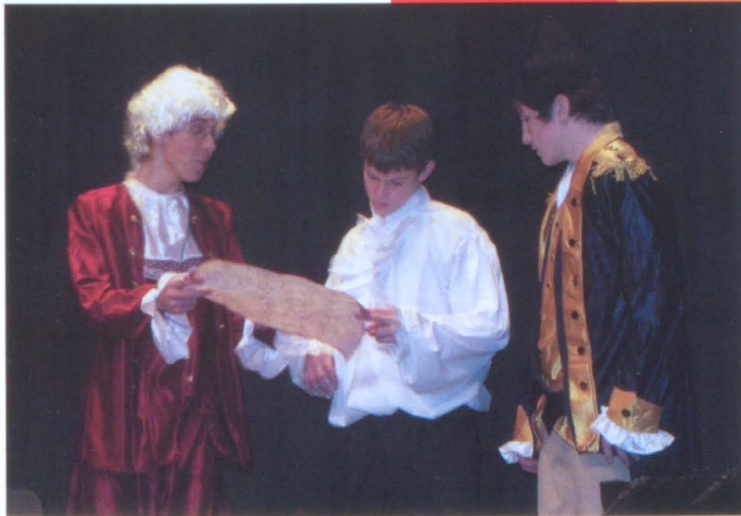

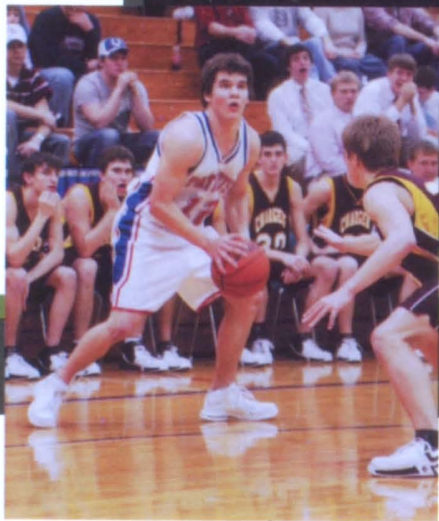

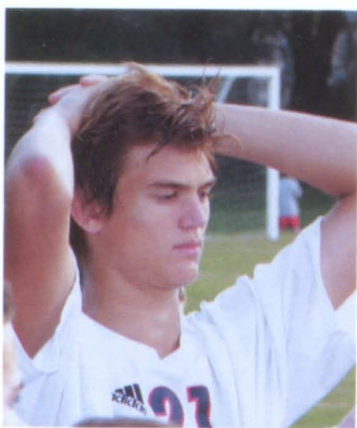

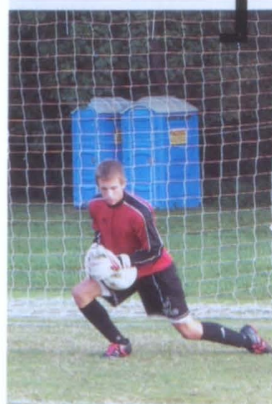

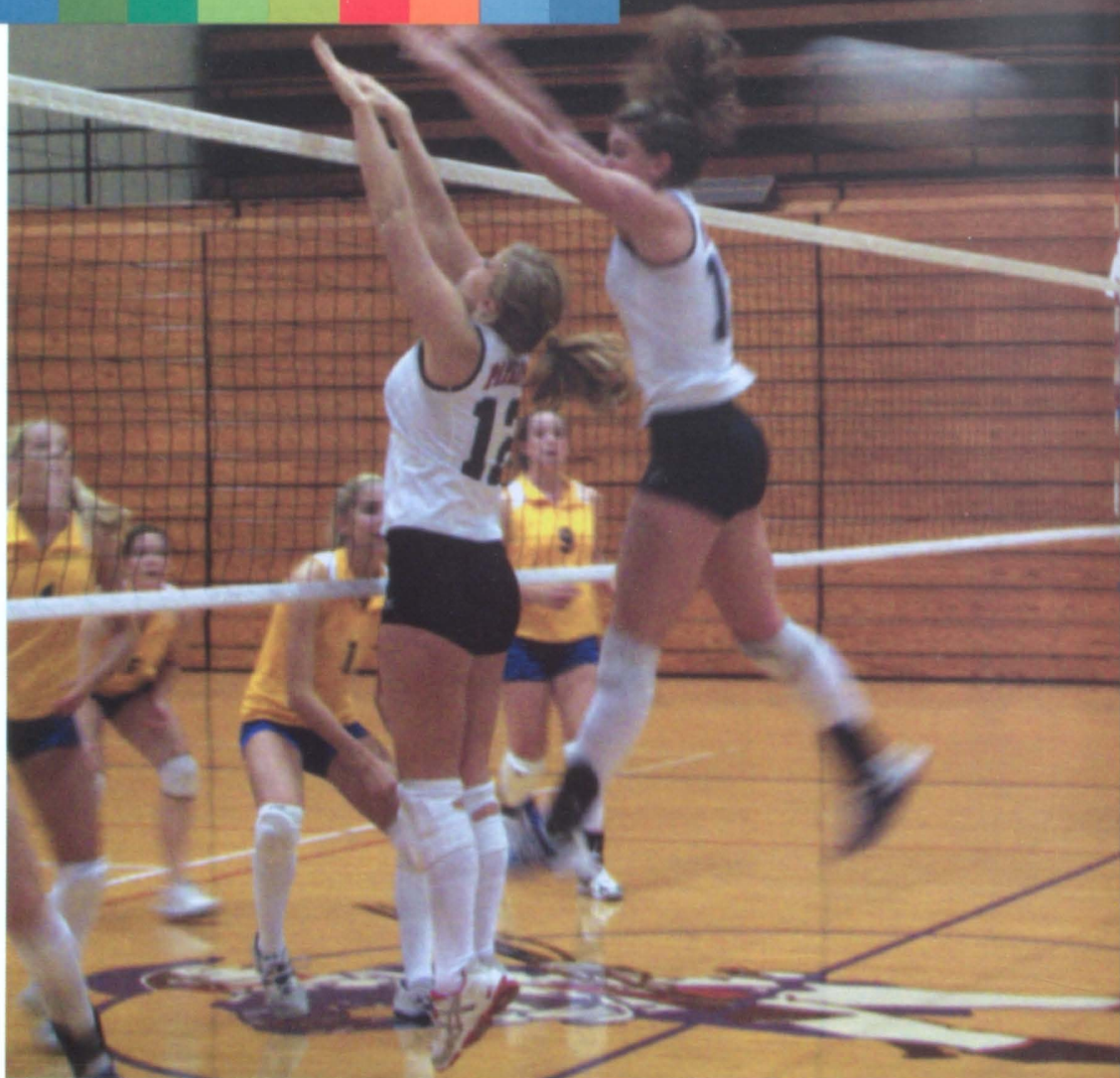

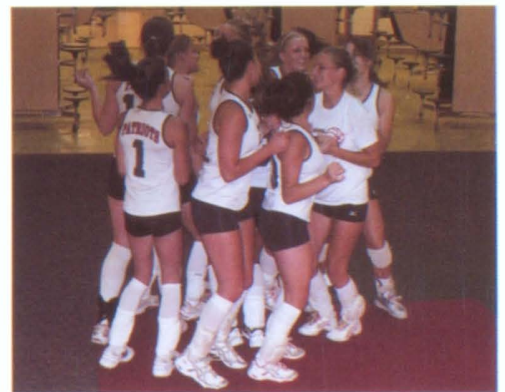

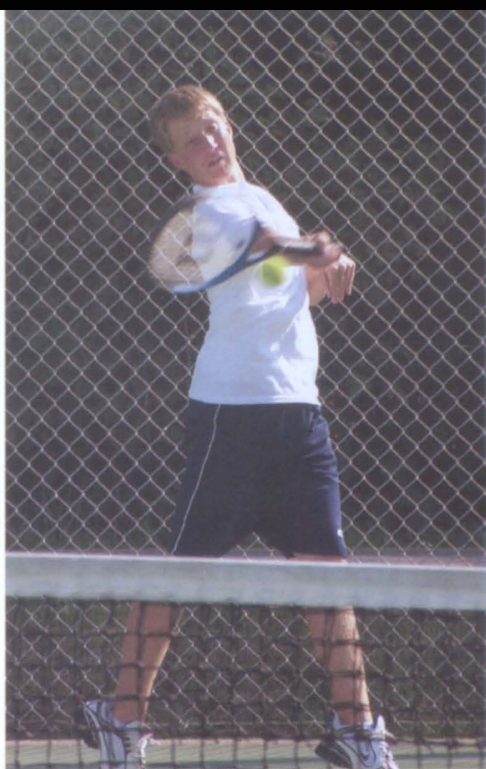

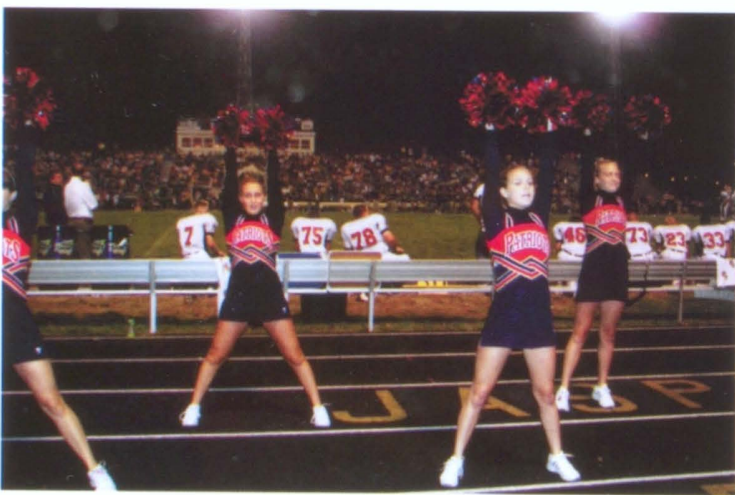

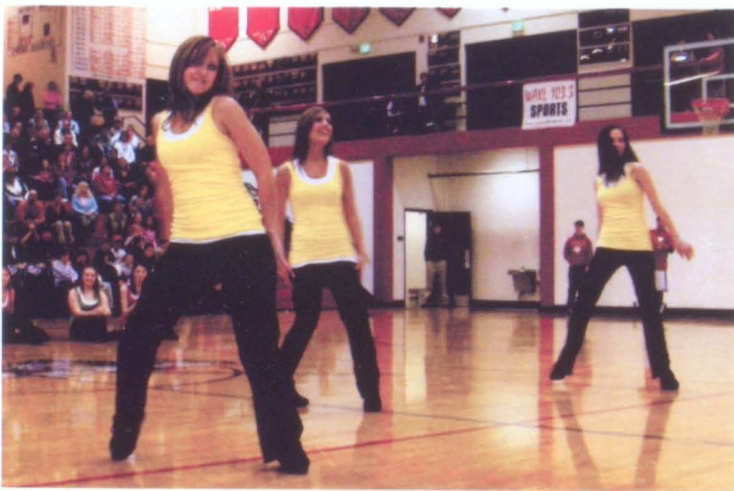

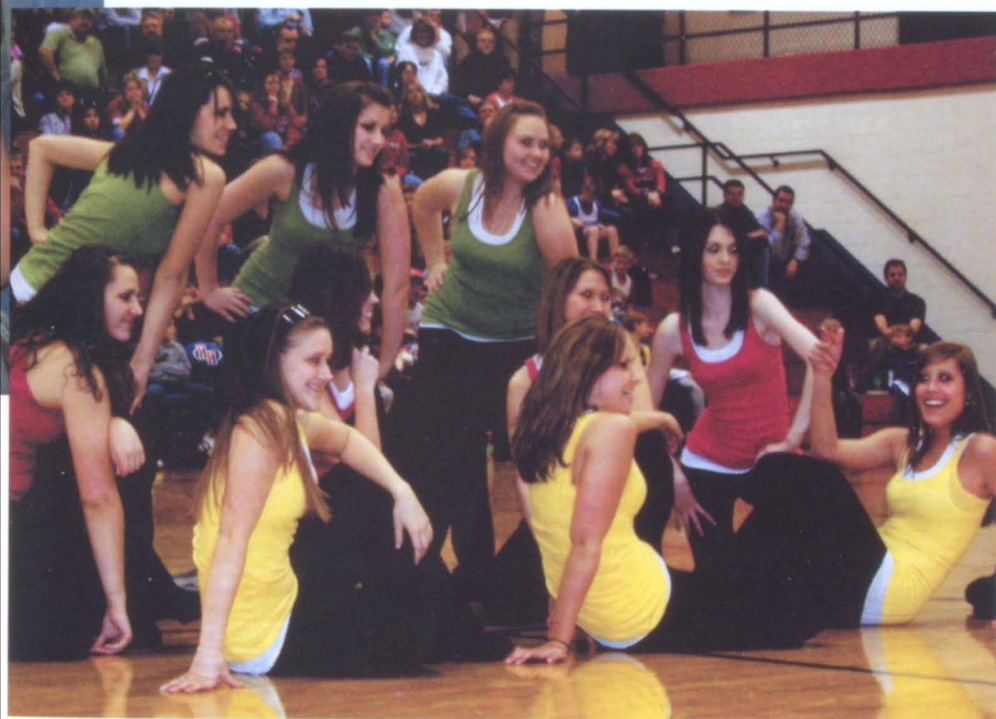

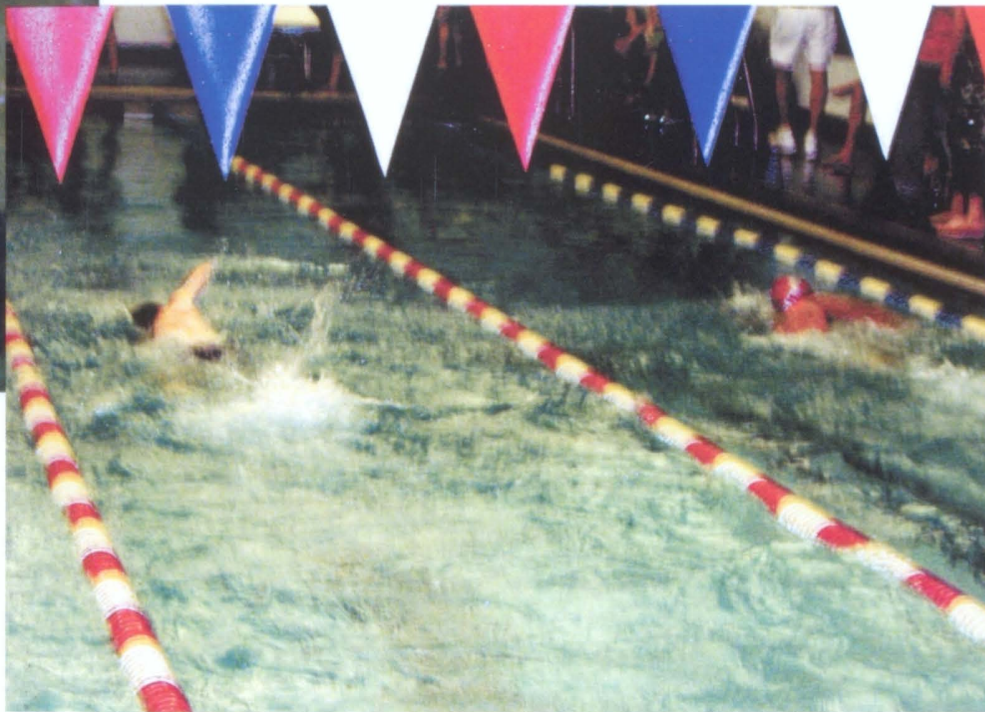

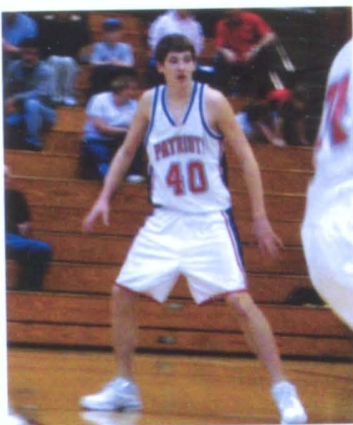

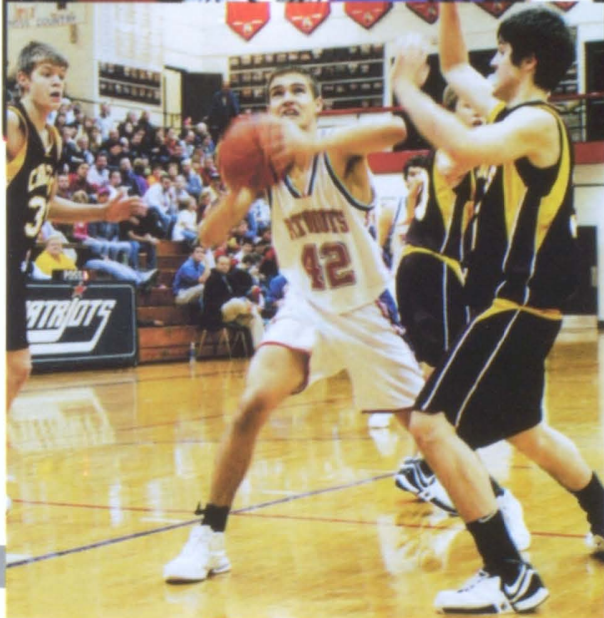

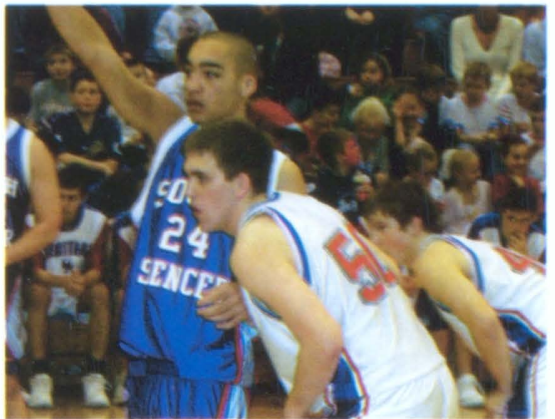

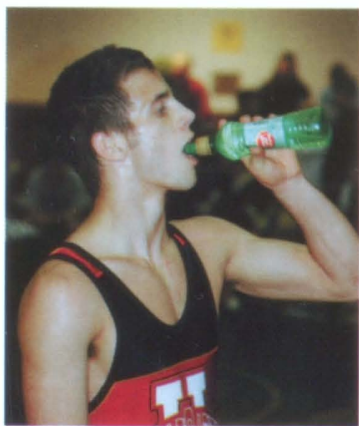

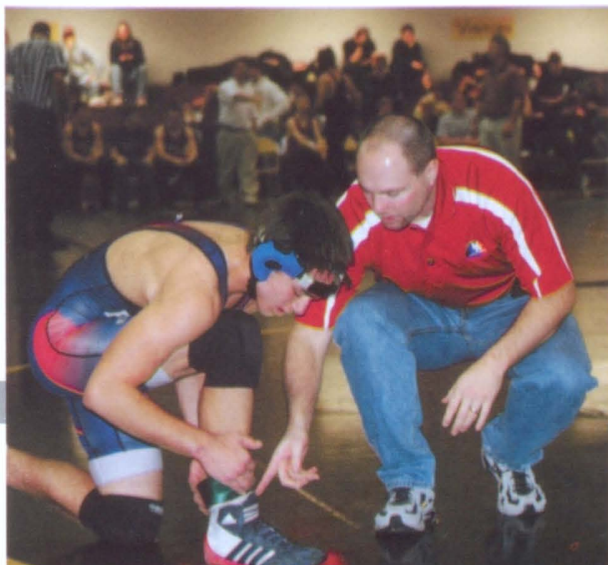

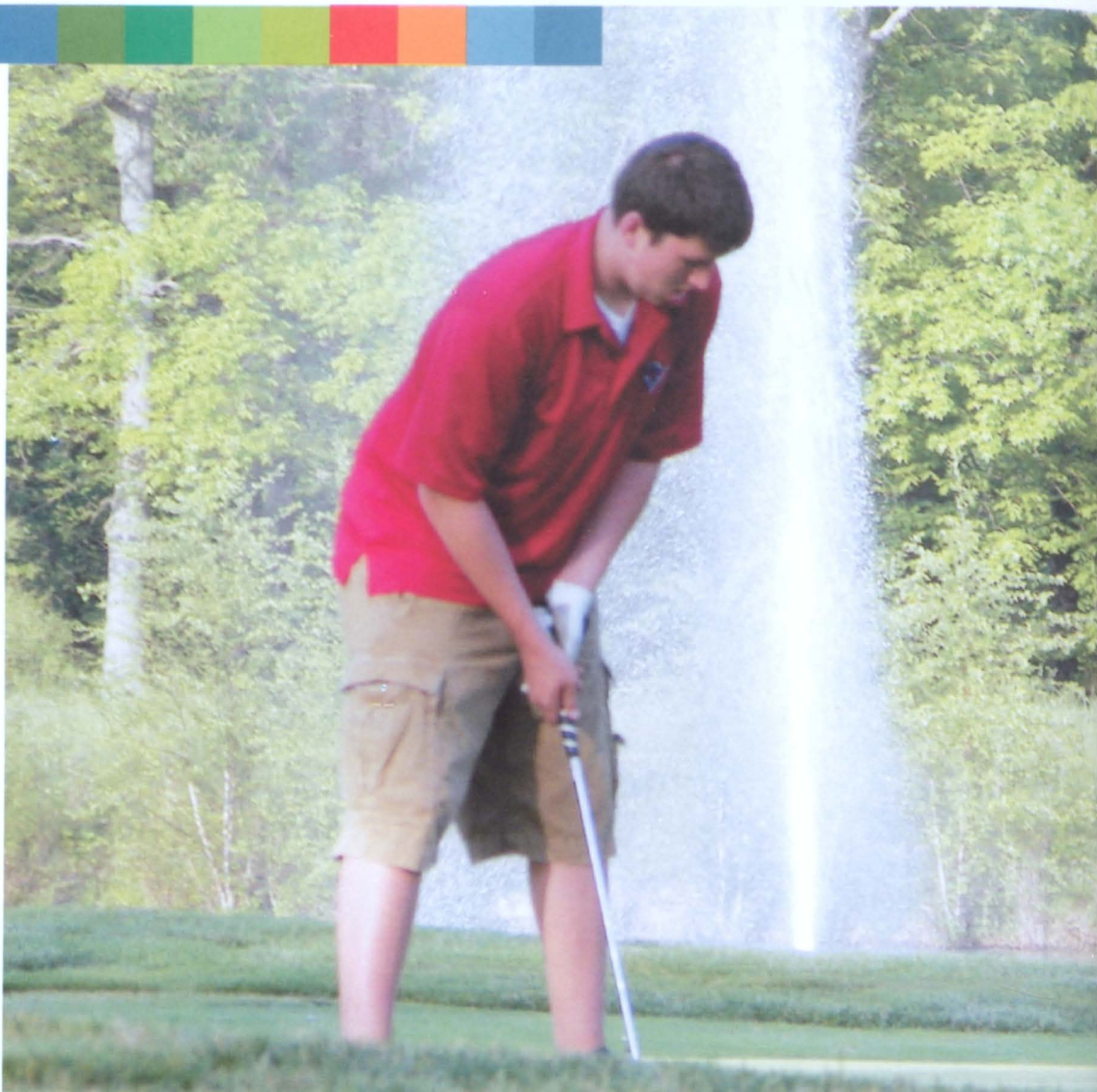

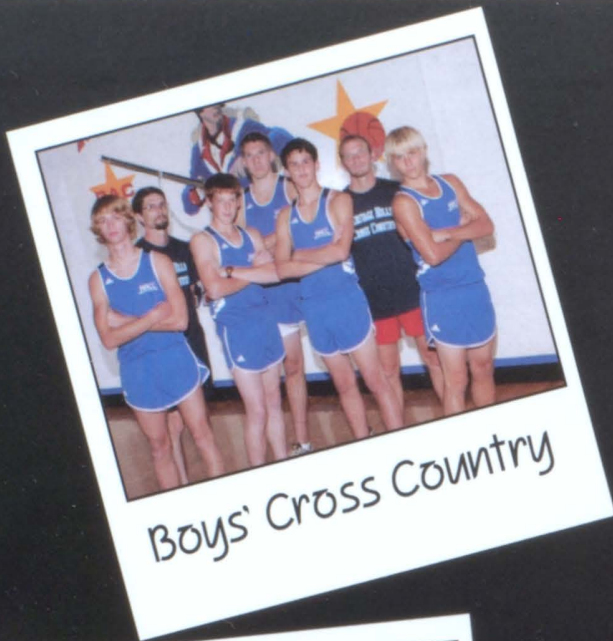




Mr. Schriefer Retires



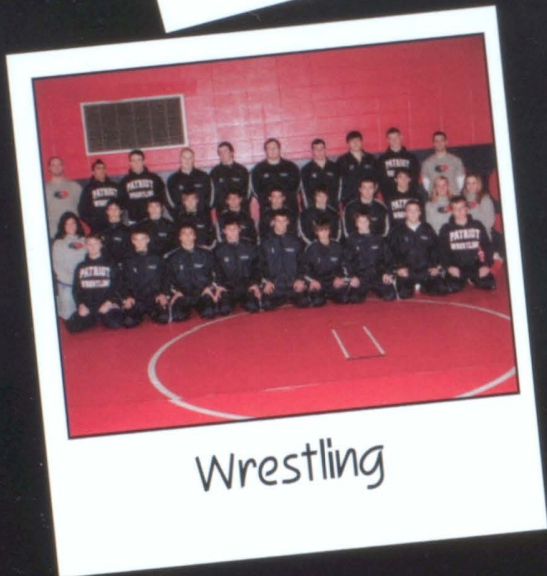

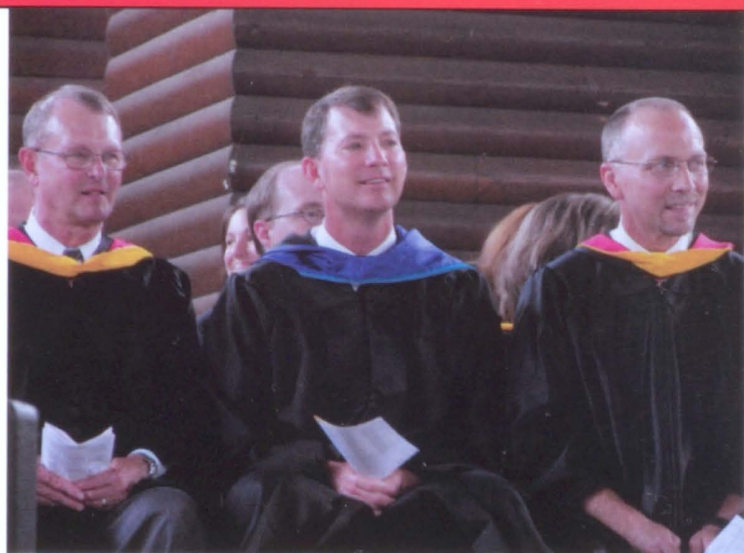
