












A four year high school course was included in the curriculum in 1907. The first four year high school class graduated in 1911. The first yearbook was published in 1949, and this 1972 Reflector will be the last CHS yearbook.

The old 92 year old building is being replaced by the new Heritage Hills High School.

The three county high schools cooperated with the DAR by selecting a senior girl on the basis of: Service-cooperation, courtesy, consideration of others.


Dependability-which includes truthfulness, loyalty, punctuality.




The Freshman class of CHS began the school year by electing class officers, cheerleaders, and queen attendants for the Town Fall Festival.
