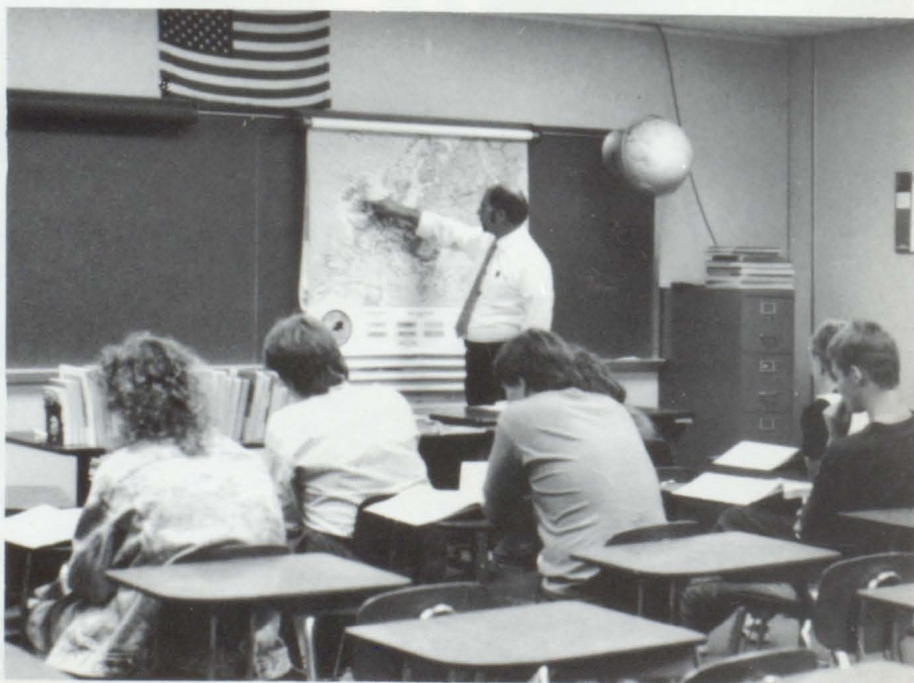

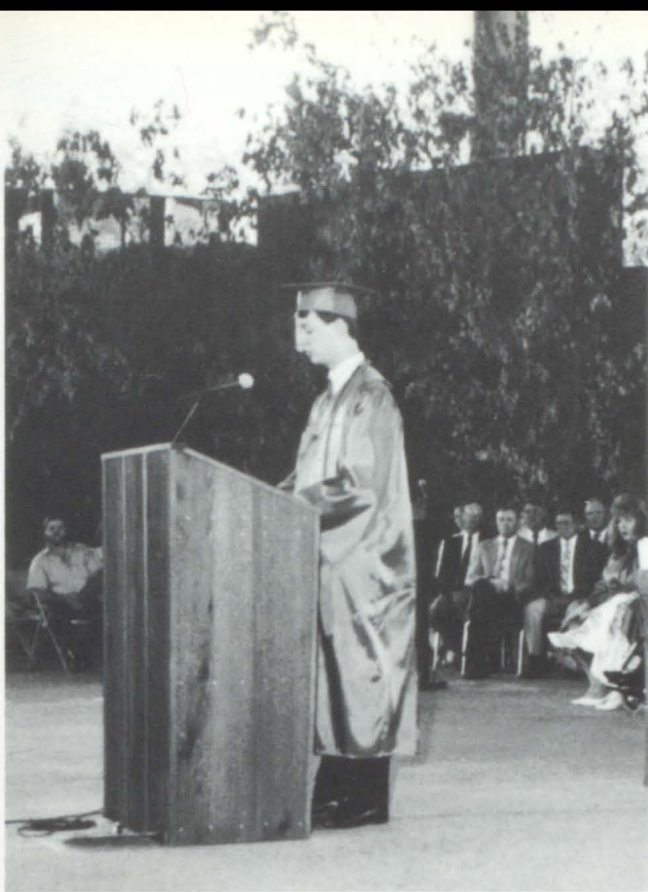
The senior class sponsors are Betty VanHoosier and Mike Nixon.

Mr. Bennett, assistant principal, continued his post-graduate education at the University of South Carolina.

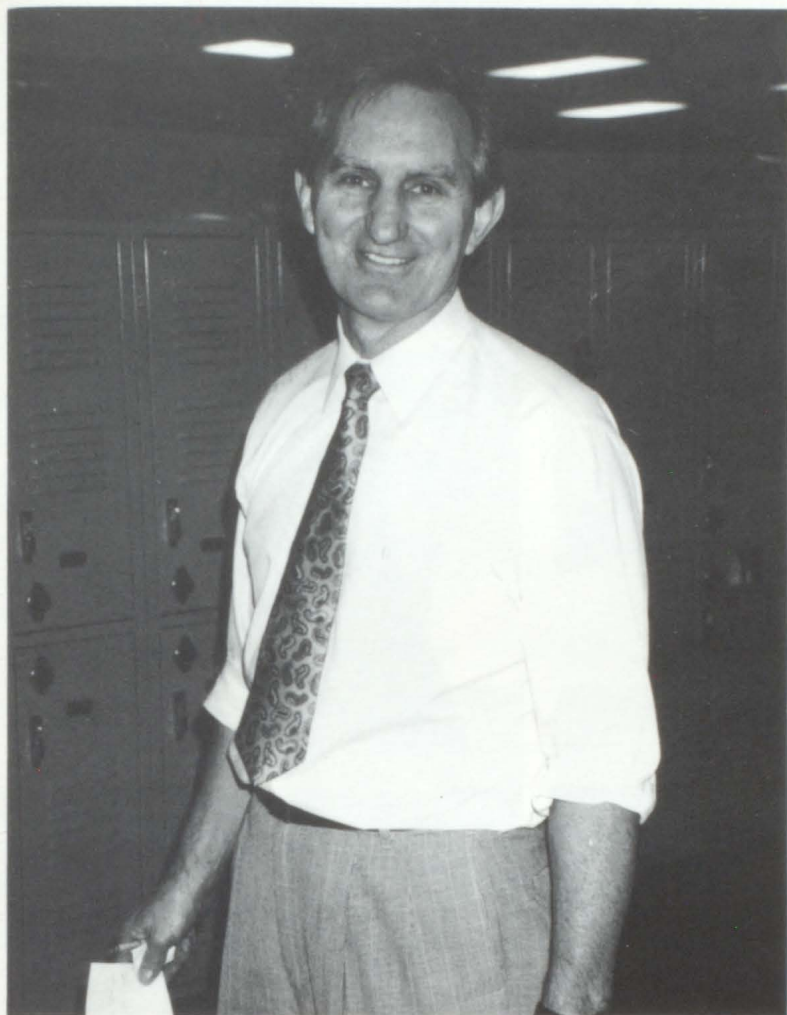

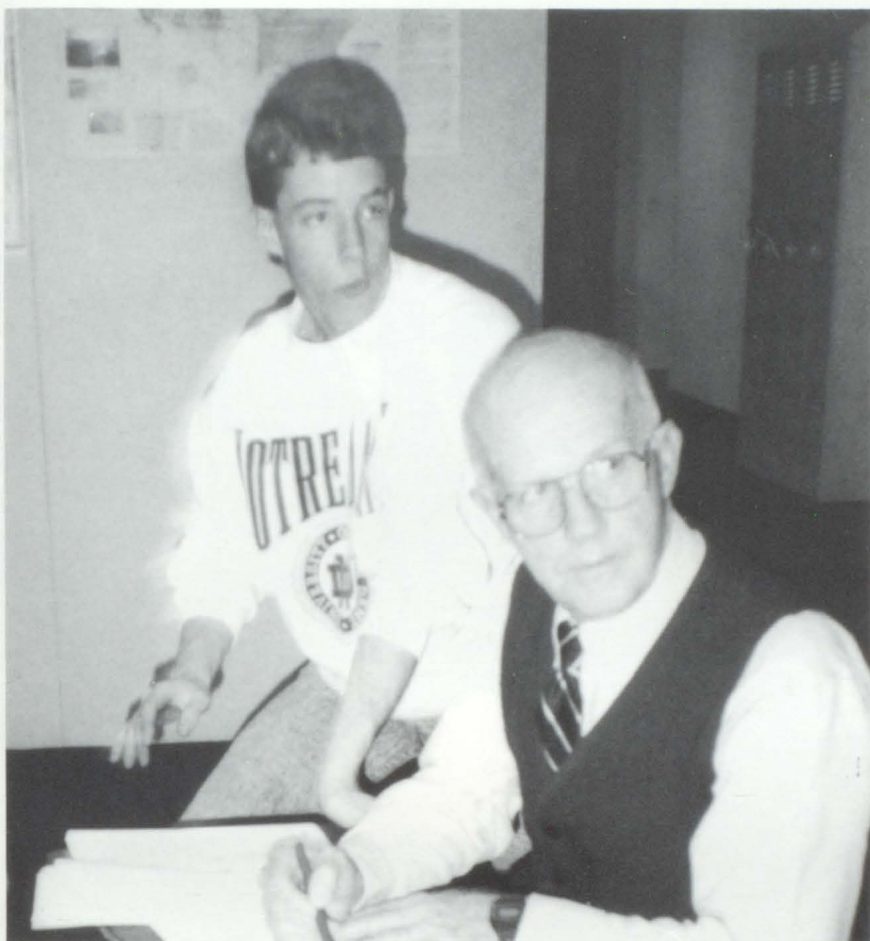

Mr. Brumett Retires as Superintendent

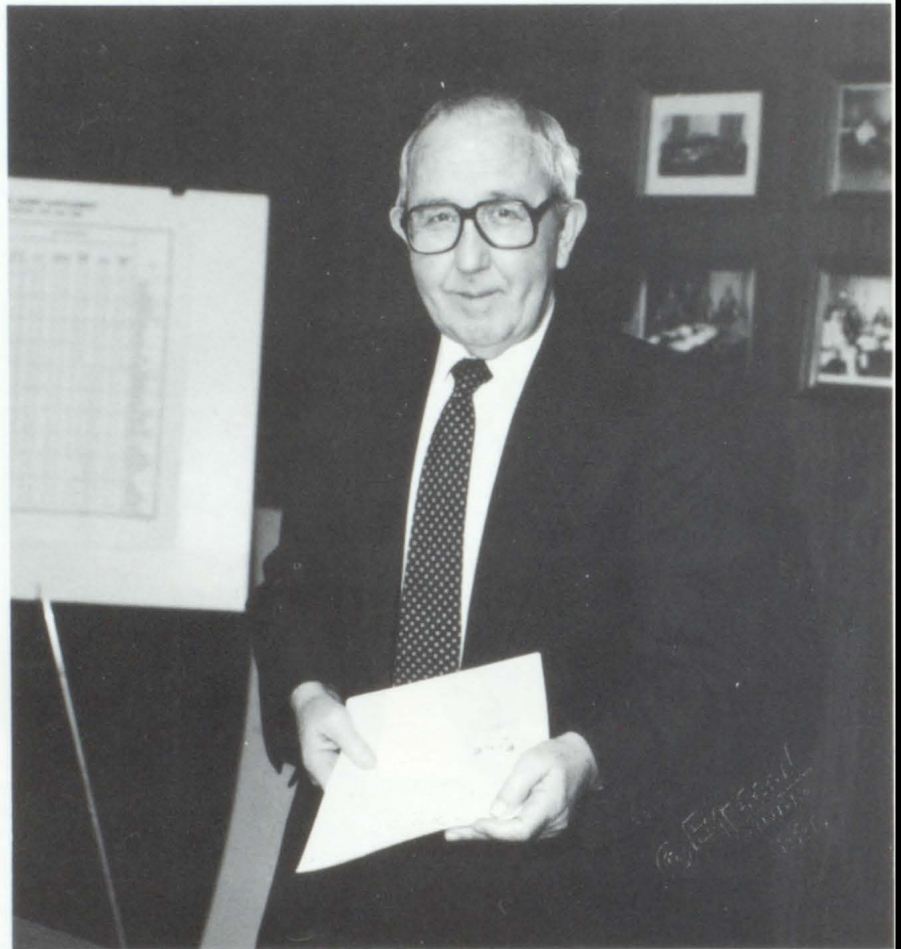
Ron Etienne is New Superintendent

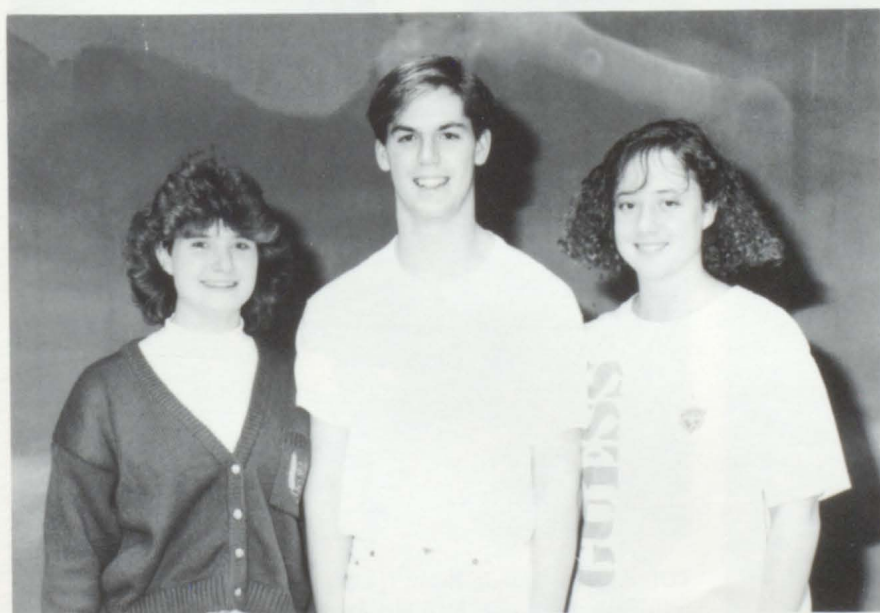

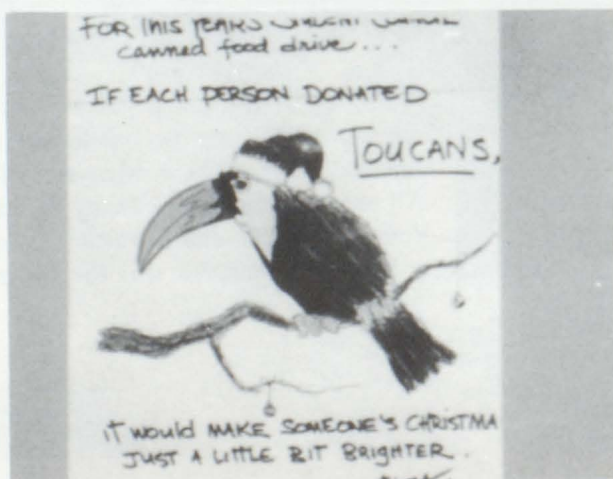

With their new band director, Mr. Gary Ahrens, and assistant, Mr. John Leffert, the band worked hard to do their best.

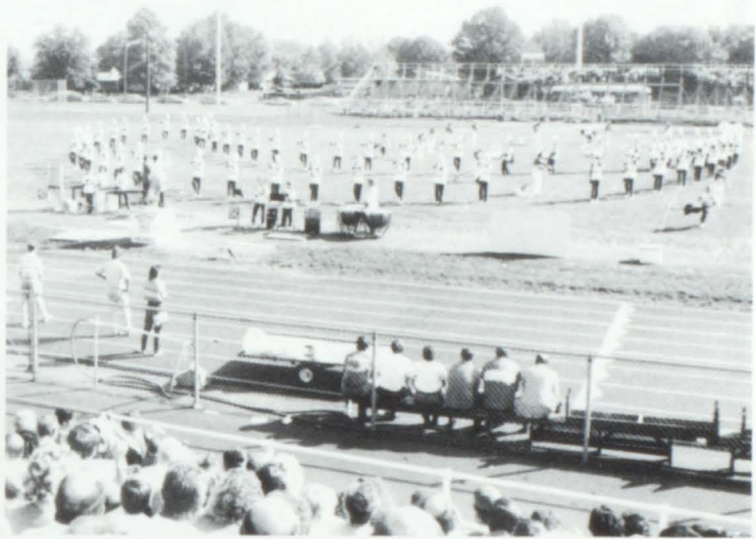

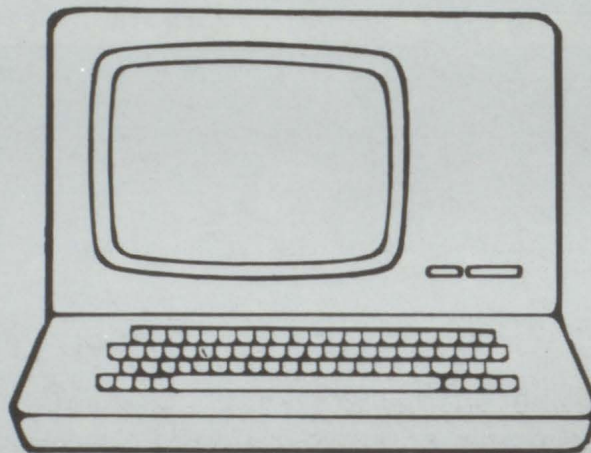

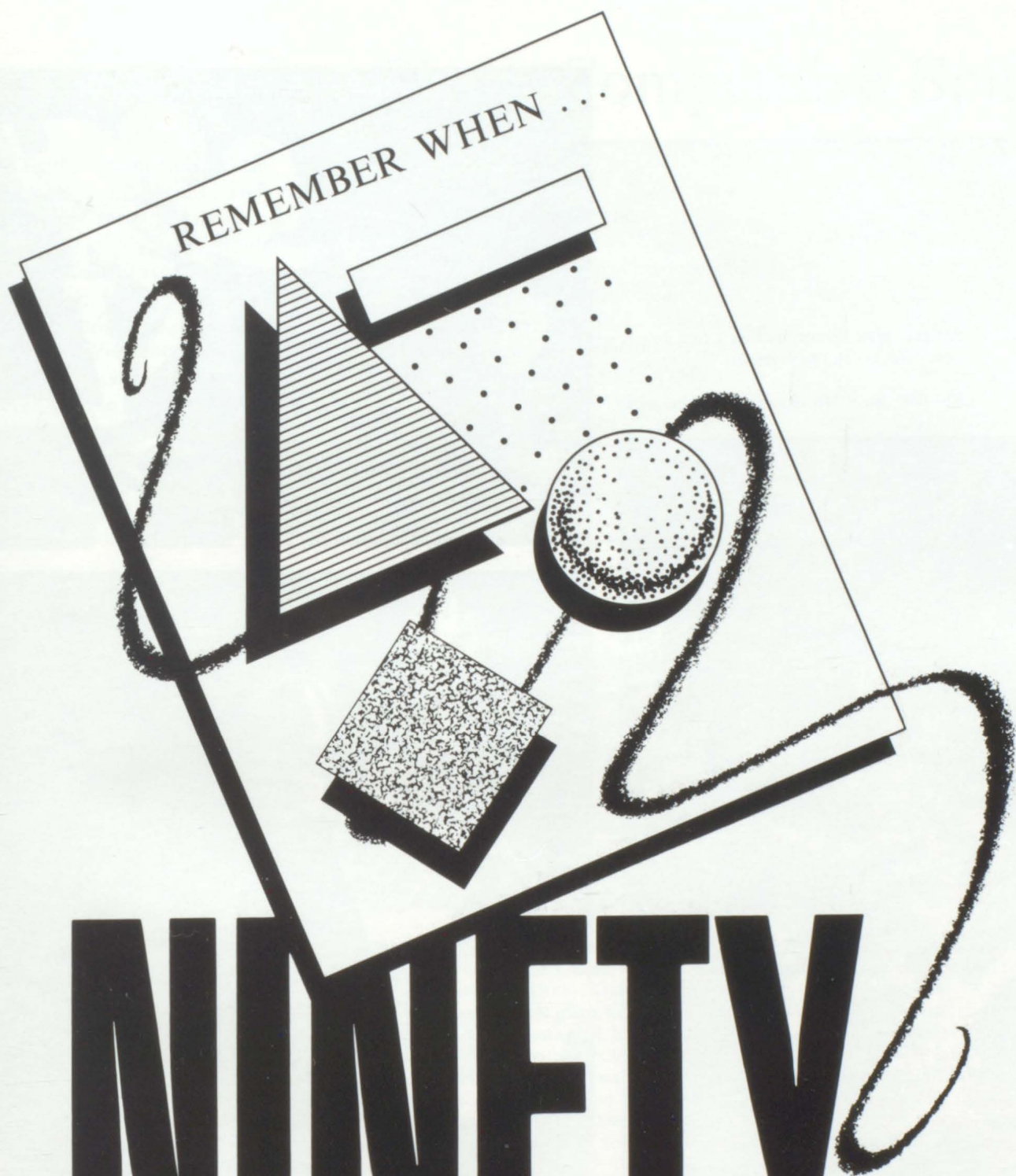

Coach Clayton said, "It was a very disappointing season for the Patriots. Although we were young, we were competitive."

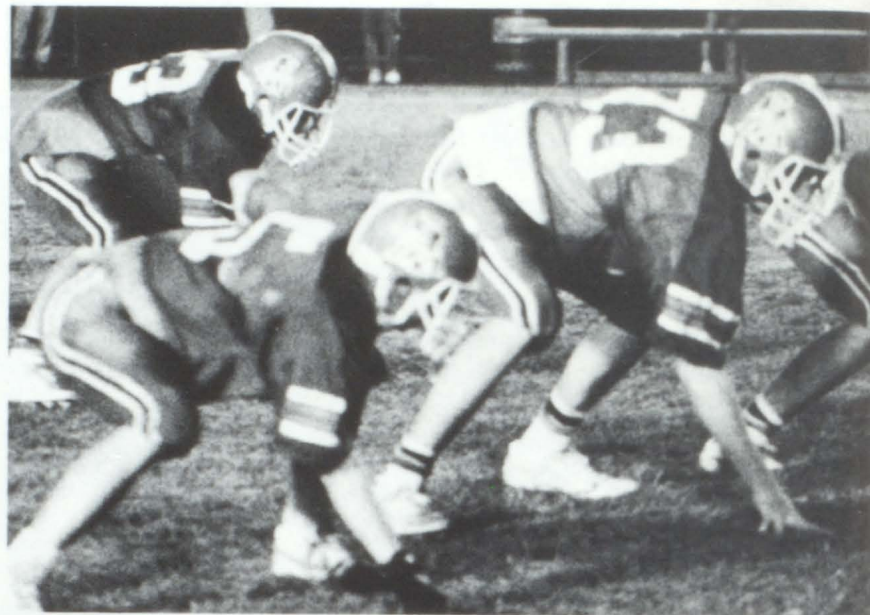

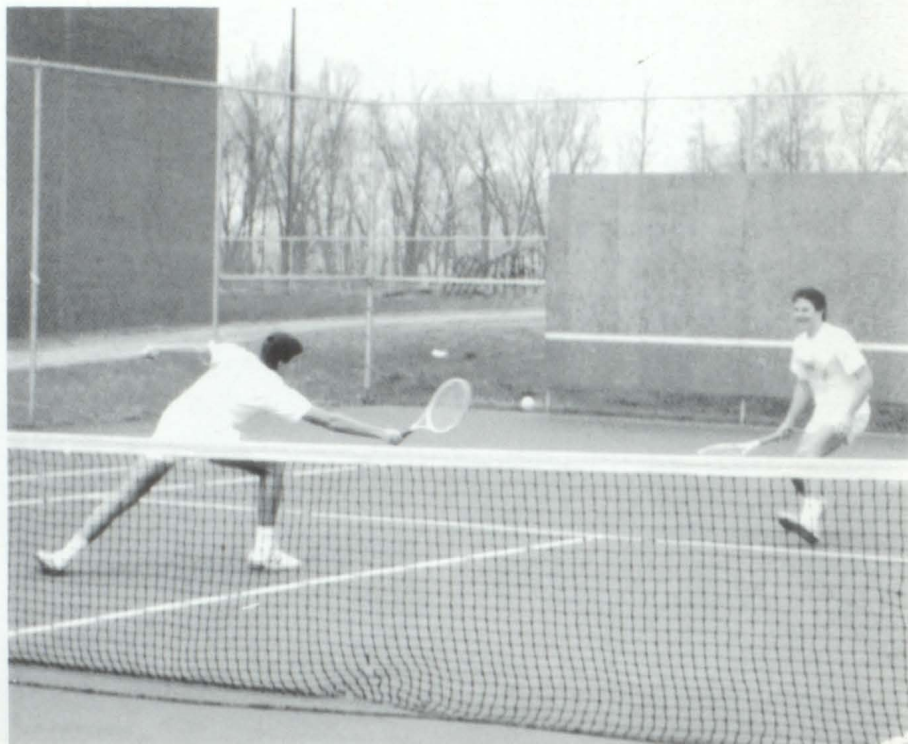

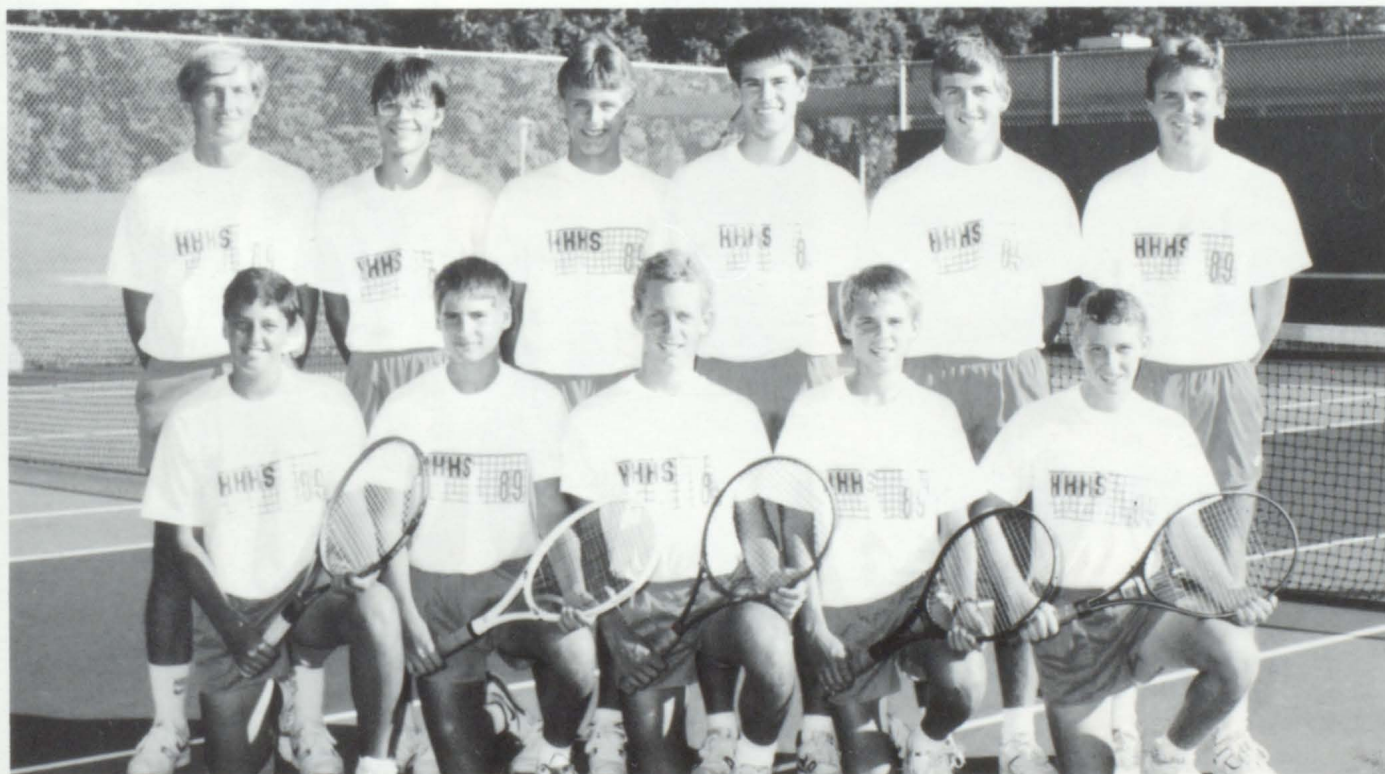
Seniors Lead Tennis Team To Success

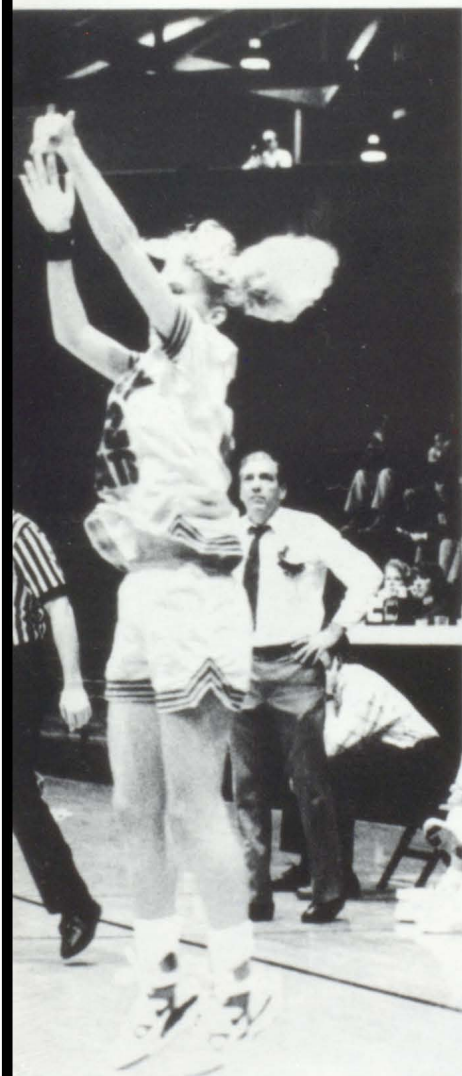

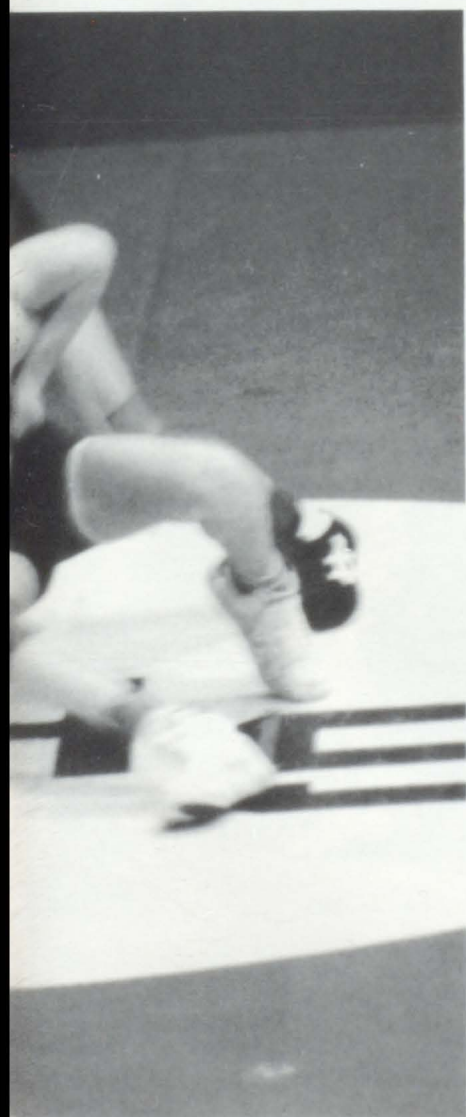

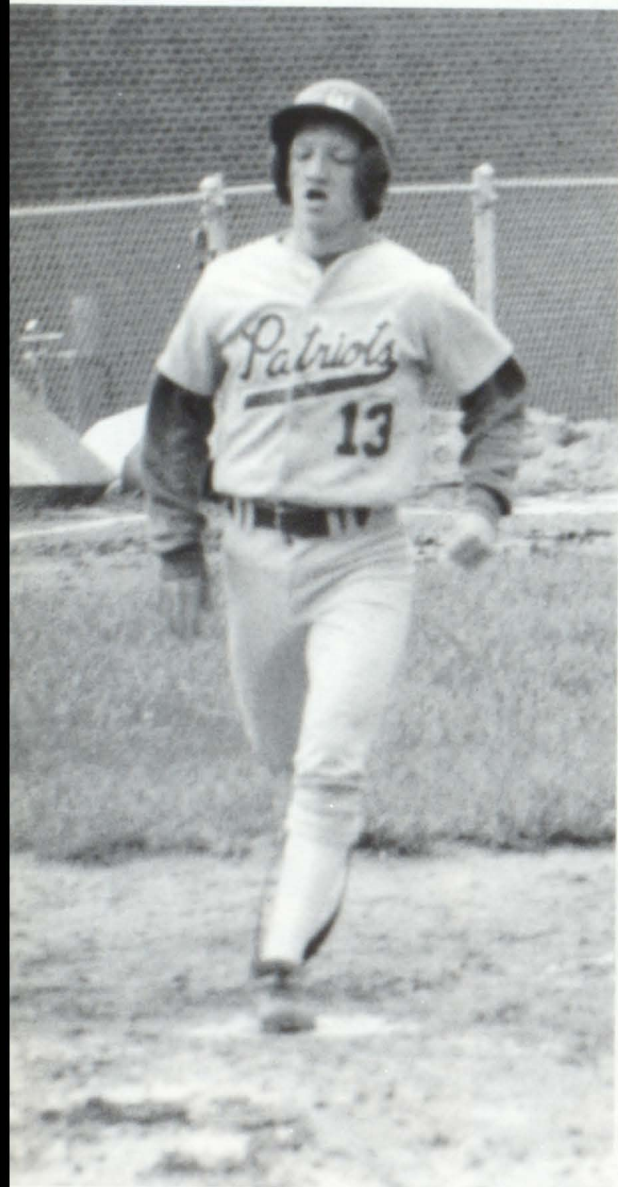

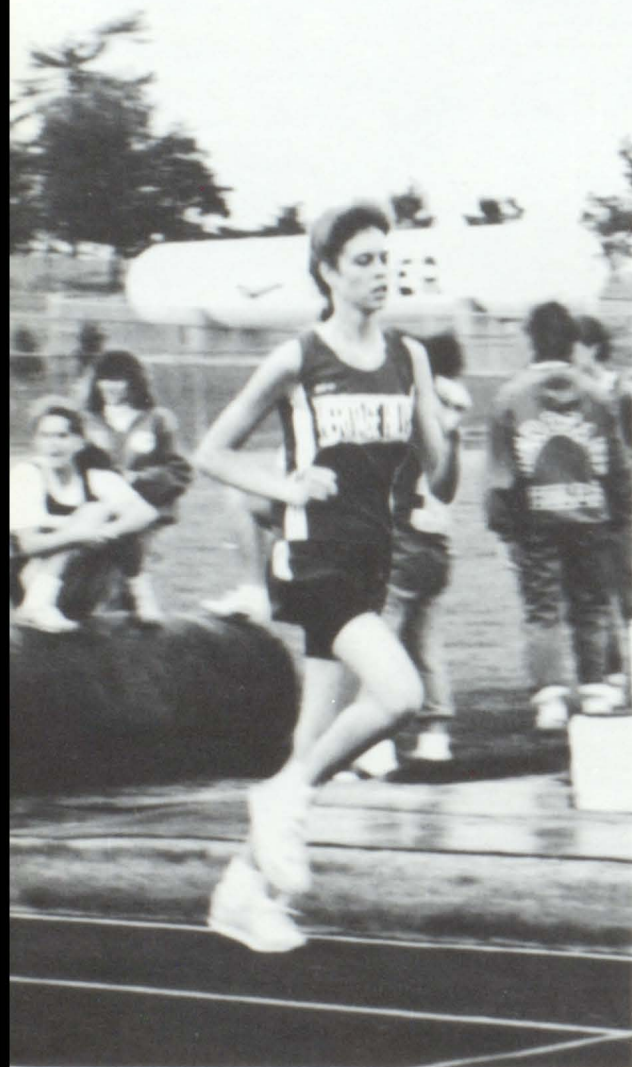

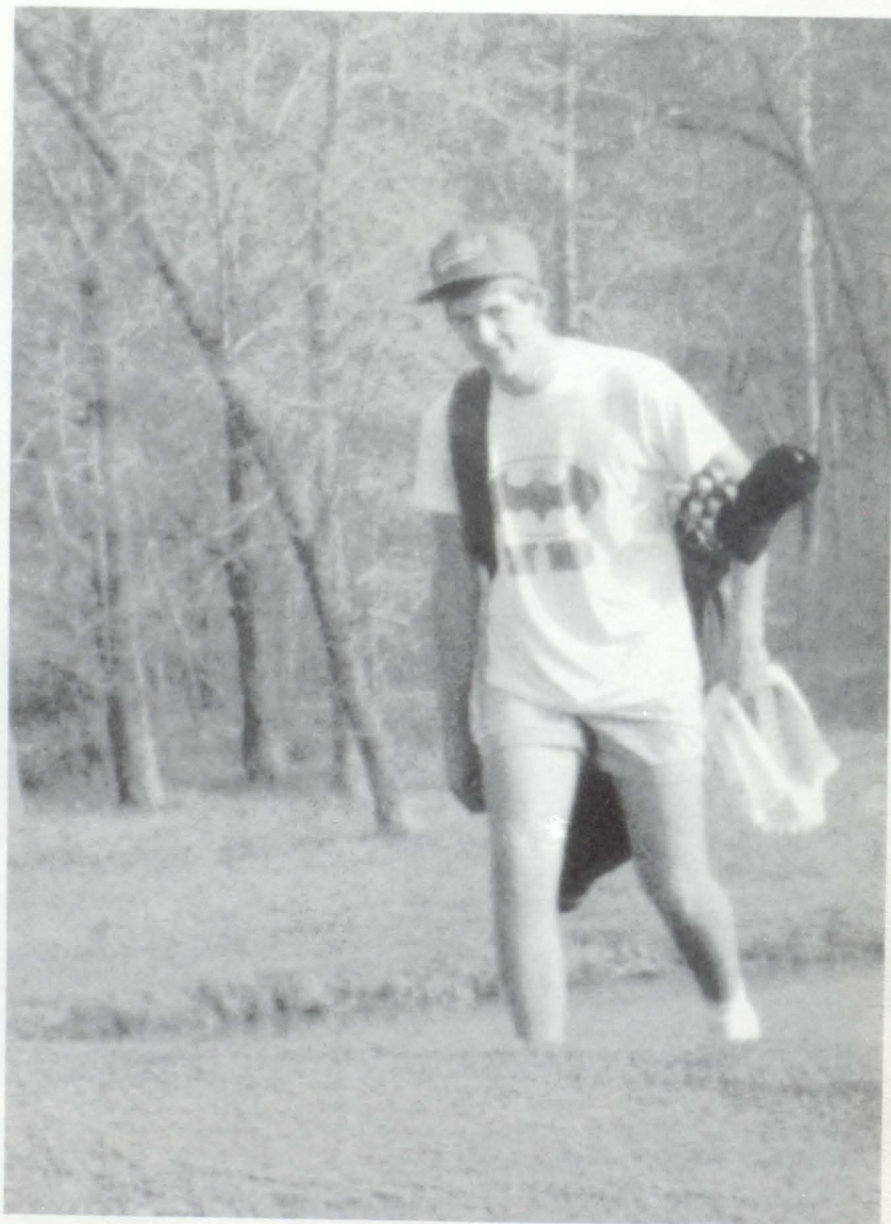

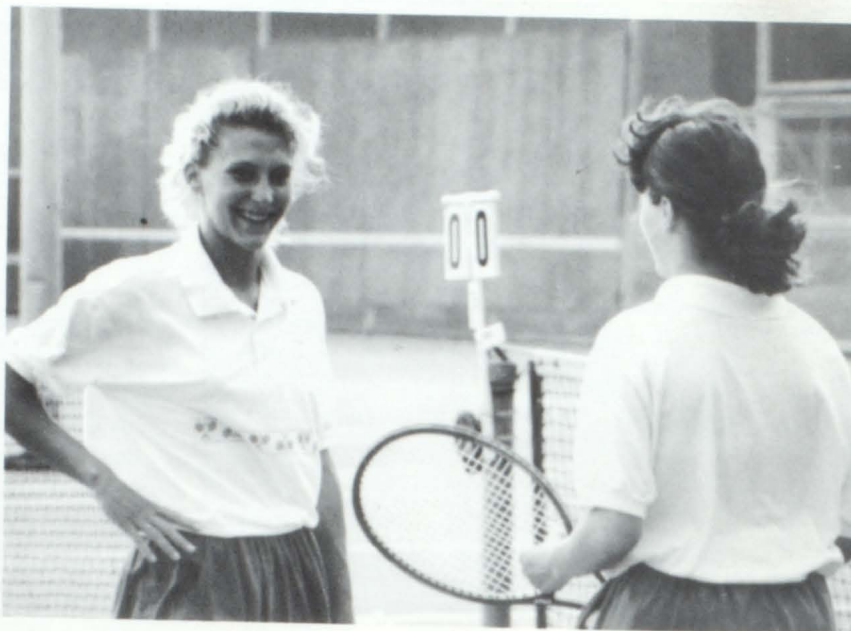

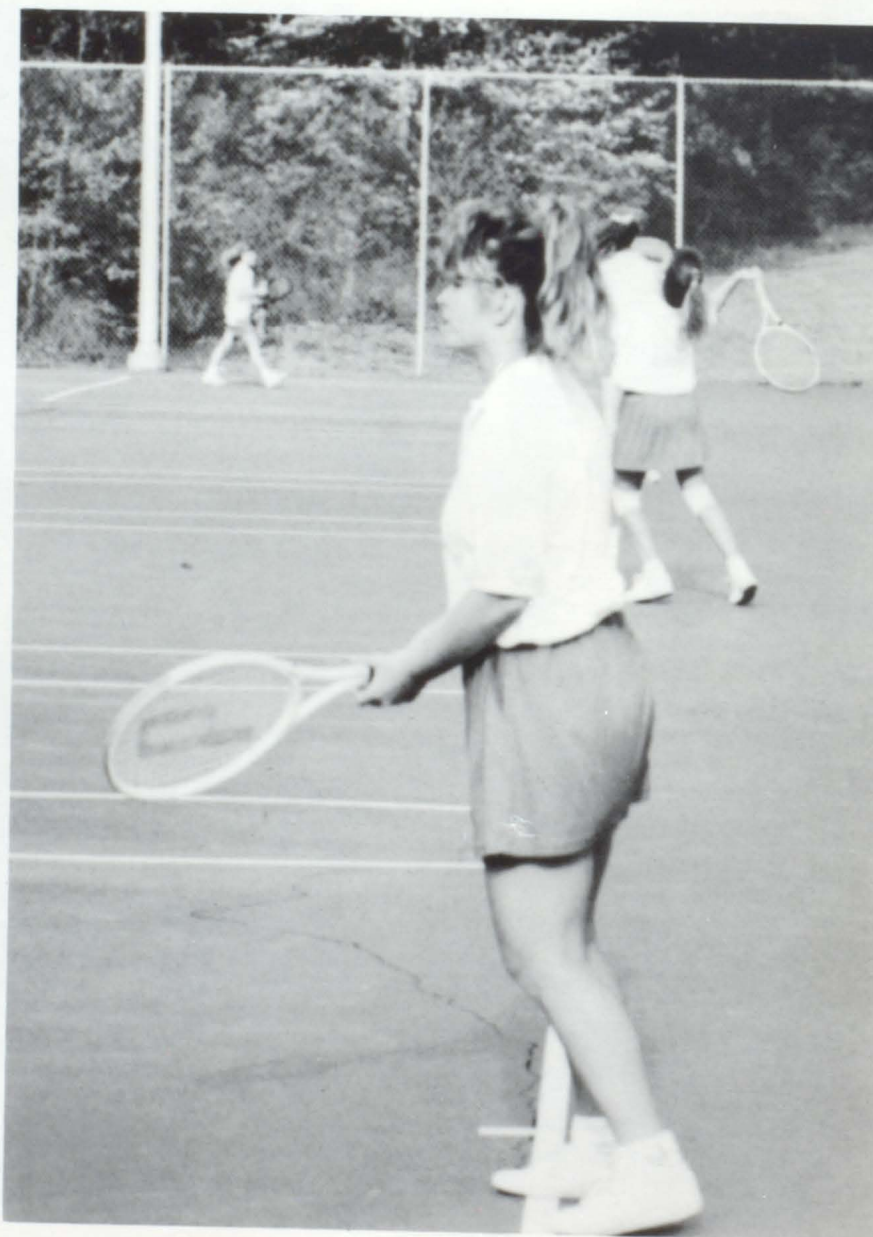

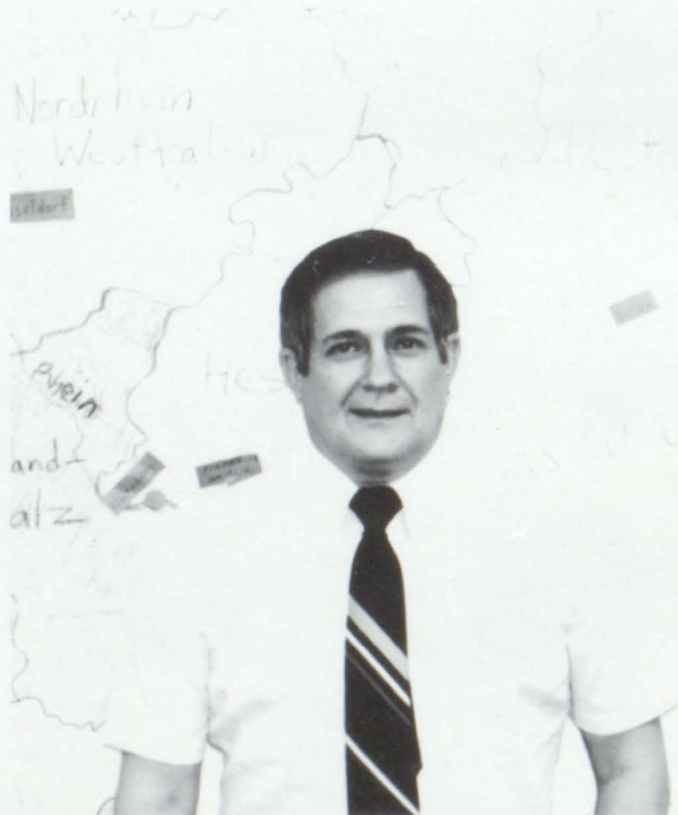

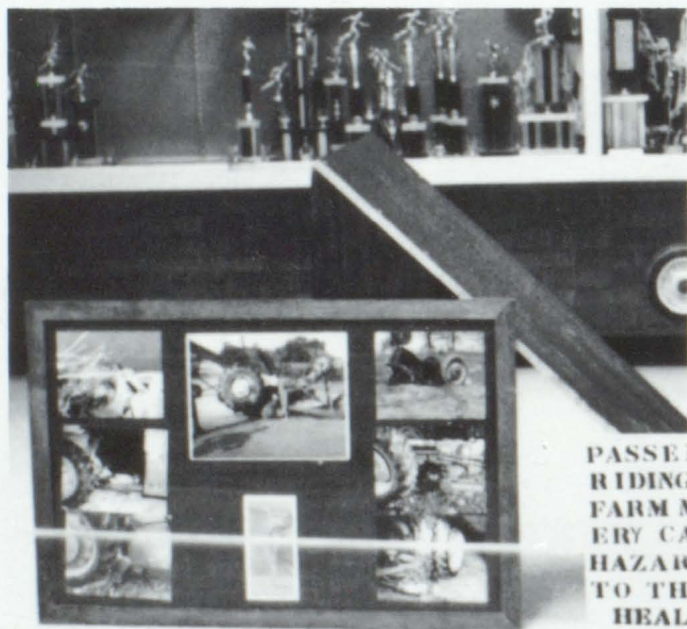

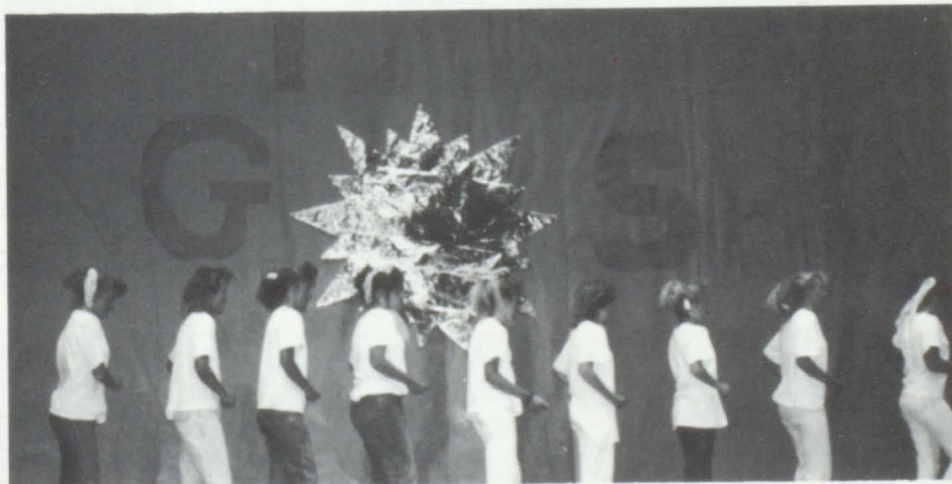

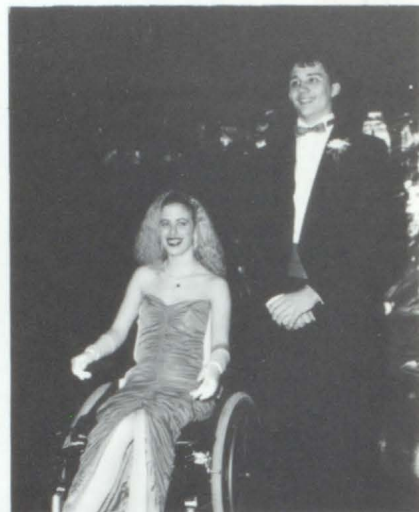
