
This year, no doubt, seemed somewhat bewildering to the Freshmen, but we hope that they will remember it as an unforgettable part of their lives.



There also seemed to be several new faces among the class, Bill Shelby, Aubrey Bullington, and Lester Walters.







Just last week I was looking through all the things I kept from my senior year and I decided to take a much needed trip so I could look up my classmates of 54.


I decided to start in dear old Chrisney where I spent so many happy years.

In the gossip column I read that another old friend, Dorothy Fleishman, was announcing her engagement to a famous pilot and they


were going to fly to Paris and be married.



The Award is presented each year to the player displaying the best mental attitude, ability, sportsmanship, and value to his team.





Leon, a senior at Chrisney High School, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Leo Weber.




